#### Minister's Message



"Let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another."

Hebrews 10:24-25

We desire to share Jesus with all people. In many and various ways to go about fulfilling this mission of ours: together as a congregation, and individually as people who care deeply about this world of God's. I want to continue to encourage us all to continue in our purpose of sharing Jesus in our families, in this community and in the world.

I've been trying to think about how to go about encouraging us all to continue to meet together and to "provoke" people to love and good deeds. Certainly one of the ways is through the things I say. So, I hope that what I say does encourage and occasionally provoke people to more closely reflect the God who has created us. Love one another. Do good rather than evil. Commit to regularly meeting together in worship, planning, fellowship and learning. (There, I've attempted to encourage and provoke again!)

as many meetings as I can. I try to be lovingly present for people as they share what's going on in their lives with me. I try to do good things as I go about each day. Sometimes these things are easier to do than others...(ok most of the time it is not too difficult to be lovingly present and to do good things).

Can more be done? Probably.

One thing that is being considered is an extra worship service on Sunday evenings. The intention with this is to try to find some points of connection with younger people. This may include more recently composed music and more "modern" instruments. It may include more opportunity for dialog around the Word and the work of worship. We're not sure yet what it will exactly look like. If you have any interest in this, call or email or text us.

Another possibility that's been rattling around in my brain is a weeknight gathering time. Our Adult Study Time on Sunday mornings

made use of 6 short vignettes by Rob Bell from the Nooma series. There are 24 such video clips that we could use for discussion – a time to meet together. If you have any interest, check Rob Bell and Nooma out on YouTube. Then call me and maybe a few others will have had the same interest.

And, still another possibility is to gather some weekday morning (Thursdays for example) for an hour or hour and a half for coffee and fellowship time. We could begin with a time of reading from the bible and prayer and then lead into sharing some of what's up in our lives (visiting) over a cup of coffee or tea (or juice). If this is of any interest to you, please call or email or text me or simply stop by the office to voice your interest.

Do you have another idea? Have a suggestion that could work better than what I've suggested above? If you do, I'd love to hear from you!

Let us take this goal seriously as we enter into fall and make it our life's intention to live with deeper and deeper connection with our God and God's people.


#### Colossians 2:6-7 says,

#### Bishop's Message For Congregations and Lay and Rostered Leaders

Dear Beloved of God

We have just concluded the season of Area Gatherings: Northern (Sept. 28-29 at Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd, Stony Plain in collaboration with St. John Lutheran of Golden Spike, Spruce Grove and St. Matthew, Spruce Grove), Southwestern (Oct. 13 at First Lutheran, Calgary), Southern (Oct. 13 at Spirit of Grace Lutheran, Brooks via video report and telephone Q&A) and East and West Central (Oct 20 at Zion Lutheran, Bashaw).

Thank you to the Area Leadership Teams for your preparation for and planning of the Area Gatherings. I value these times when we have the opportunity to gather together as God's people for worship, learning, conversation and feasting.

This year we gathered under the theme: "Faith, Hope and Love" which was an extension of our Synod Convention theme and conversation from I Cor. 13. For our Dwelling in the Word we spent time together considering the text of I Thess. 1:2-3: We always give thanks to God for all of you and mention you in our prayers, constantly remembering before our God and Father your work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ.

Participants shared in part of the need to see ourselves as "we", as community together; conversation centered around how a spirit of gratefulness might impact our faith community and neighborhood; and of the work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of hope which they see.

Then most gatherings viewed a brief video (The Synod Convention Interview - All Questions) prepared during the Synod Convention around faith, hope and love. #### Church Council Highlights from October 16, 2018

- Donny Loewen read from a devotion in 'My Journey with Christ' 'Overturning Their Tables' based on John 2:15. The Temple was intended as a place where all could worship, but the outer courts had been corrupted and turned into a marketplace no wonder Jesus brought a cleansing to the space. Sometimes, we also need a disruption an 'overturning' in our lives in order to remove the distractions that keep us from 'holy living and holy loving'. Every so often, it is good to examine ourselves and ask why we are doing the things that we do.
- Council reviewed the notes from the September 30 Planning Meeting. Council liaisons will communicate this to the Committees to keep ideas and priorities in mind over the coming year. There was some consideration of having a follow-up meeting after Christmas or in Spring to revisit and review the discussions.
- Council agreed to move the starting time of Council meetings to 5:15 to better accommodate Council members.
- Tova has been provided with a Senior Youth Ministry Leader position description, modelled after and as a supplement to the inactive Youth Coordinator position currently in the Governance Manual, with some small modifications, particularly encouraging music instruction and creative musical and/or drama opportunities. She will report to the pastoral staff and relate to Learning. Council approved that Tova be contracted for this position until the end of June 2019, on the basis of the materials presented to Council, and that the Senior Youth Ministry Leader position description be added to the Governance Manual.
- Calvin has been building the topic of Stewardship into worship where possible. Darlene will provide a monthly
  submission for the Messenger in respect to Stewardship. Bev, Darlene and Donny will work to plan a celebration of
  the paying off of Messiah's mortgage, and bring in others to assist as desired.
- Council approved that the fee per plate figure in Section D page 7 'Reception Luncheon' in the Governance Manual be increased from \$4 to \$5.
- Pastor Bev informed Council that our Confirmation classes now involved three churches with the addition of Scandia to Bethel and Messiah. This has provided a valuable extra resource for the Confirmation team.
- Dave, on behalf of Support, drew attention to the facility 'lock up' crew, some of whom have been doing this for a long time. Support is hoping to find others to help with this so roles can be limited to 2 years.
- The elevator is currently on probation we have until late December to deal with outstanding issues. Support is in contact with the servicing company, who are supposed to be dealing with these items and had not flagged or mentioned them.
- A number of opportunities for learning and engagement were noted, including the October 18 public Chester
  Ronning Centre lecture on Donald Trump and Evangelicals; the October 20 Area Gathering in Bashaw; an ongoing
  podcast entitled 'The Liturgists' aimed at millennials around topics of faith; and the 'Lay Academy' opportunities
  being put forward by the Lutheran Theological Seminary Support and Learning are looking into hosting one of
  these events, which are also available on-line for a small fee.
- The meeting adjourned with the Lord's Prayer. The next regular Council Meeting is on November 20, 2018.



#### Brian Rude Reports on the "Sainting" of a Martyr in El Salvador

15 October, 2018.

**San Romero** 

Not so long ago El Salvador celebrated our first Roman Catholic Cardinal, Auxiliary Bishop Rosa Chavez.

El Salvador now boasts its first Roman Catholic Saint, Monseñor Oscar Arnulfo Romero.

I felt so privileged to spend this festive day and night surrounded by San Romero's people--"peregrinación" and program, march and mass, fireworks and festivities.

I am grateful to Pope Francis and the Vatican for the formal recognition of San Romero (and his people, who first declared him saint upon his martyrdom in 1980), his prophetic voice of truth, and his calls for justice leading to peace.

I have greeted the dawn at the closing of every 24 March Romero vigil for three decades, together with a few dozen of the faithful, the remnant, a much-reduced gathering, still present whether out of conviction or because there was no transportation available to return home.

This dawn was different. This canonization dawn was special. There were still thousands of Salvadorans filling the central Plaza Barrios in front of the cathedral and many surrounding streets. Some were sleeping on the new concrete of the newly-renovated plaza and pedestrian malls, but thousands were still standing, as if they had just arrived.

Joining in the Vatican ceremony via livestream (2-4 a.m.), there was wild applause and enthusiastic vocal affirmation every time San Romero's name was mentioned by Pope Francis or some officiant. I wonder if the Vatican crowd was as animated, or as disposed to celebrate around the clock, even without seating. As the outdoor celebration wrapped up well after 4 a.m. (without rain, amazingly, during the rainy season, after a very wet week of flooding, due to Hurricane Michael in the Caribbean), we were all invited into the crypt, below the cathedral, to continue this celebration of San Romero. This crypt is an expansive space, but I couldn't imagine such a crowd fitting inside, even considering how intimate Salvadorans are prepared to be in crowded conditions. One of the major dailies claimed that "hundreds" of us were gathered--one can't be too cautious when it comes to over-statement!

Now comes the challenging part--following San Romero's example of Jesus-following.

On behalf of the four Western Synod Bishops, the following announcement from the President of Lutheran Theological Seminary is shared for your information:

Lutheran Theological Seminary is the official leadership preparation school for the four Western synods of the ELCIC. We are pleased to say that we are in a very exciting time. Our Challenge program (generous scholarships and a new way of thinking about theological education), flexible course delivery model, and strengthened recruiting efforts are inviting people to consider studies that had previously seemed impossible. We are developing new educational options, including diaconal programs, the Master of Theological Studies in Health Care and Parish Nursing, and Authorized Lay Ministry training through the Lay Academy.

We have a strong and enthusiastic faculty, staff, and student body. We are currently able to meet our financial commitments and sustain our operations.

We are now in the right position to make significant and much-needed changes. Our buildings are too large for our needs; rental income from our tenants, while helpful, does not fully compensate for our maintenance costs, anticipated renovation costs, and human resources costs. Our residence is no longer necessary for LTS purposes and is expensive to operate. The buildings were constructed 50 years ago; despite ongoing care and upgrading, they are due for renewal. Even with the generous support of donors (Thank you!), our finances are likely not sustainable over the longer term; funds from our capital campaign are reaching their end and synods are unable to maintain their support at historical levels.

Moreover, theological education has changed significantly since we moved into this property in 1968. Now we do more online training and work with smaller class sizes. Laypeople interested in learning about Christianity study alongside those preparing for rostered ministry.

In order to sustain our mission of preparing leaders for the ELCIC in Western Canada, to take up the challenge of today and tomorrow, we are looking for ways to enrich educational possibilities and strengthen recruiting efforts. We also hope to situate ourselves in a location more suited to contemporary educational needs.

Consequently, we are assessing new options for the Seminary. We considered some form of co-operation with our sister ELCIC seminary in Waterloo. However, recognizing the significant difficulties of inter-provincial partnership, we are currently examining other options, with Saskatoon still a possibility. At this time, we are exploring the option of moving to the campus of Luther College at the University of Regina. Moving there might offer us improved educational and recruiting capacities, along with financial efficiencies. Our conversations at this time are investigative; we do not know what the outcome will be.

Because members of the ELCIC in Western Canada have a stake in the future of LTS, and because you have been clear with us that you care about our work, we commit to sharing our decision-making process with you. We thank God for all of you and appreciate your prayers and support as we engage in this time of discernment.



The 80th Anniversary of Kristallnacht:

The Night of Broken Glass

On November 9, 1938: Hitler initiated two days of organized violence against the Jews of Germany, the first openly sanctioned act of genocide in the Nazi "final solution." The riots left the streets of Jewish communities strewn with broken glass.




Eighty years later: Hate related incidents are on the rise, neo-nazi and white supremacist movements are emboldened, and many fear a repetition of the hateful tragedies of the past.


We invite you to gather for a candlelight service on the eve of the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Kristallnacht to remember both the victims of hatred and the courageous men and women who stood, in the most dangerous of times, on the side of love.


