

Minister's Message



Summer is here! Warm weather, long days, growing plants (crops, gardens & flowers), and holiday journeys. Enjoy the gifts of God's creation surrounding and enveloping you.

Something struck me as interesting in the last few days: here we are in the midst of the steady, almost frantic, growth of the created world around us and we take time "off". We very much need time to rest and become rejuvenated for the work we have been gifted to serve God with, but this just seems to me to be a little out of sync with the rest of the created order. I know that farmers and gardeners are busy with many tasks related to good stewardship of the earth, but even they do only a small portion of the work that actually

takes place. The kingdom of God seems to *simply* cause the earth to produce "of itself" (Mark 4:26-28). We hardly have any understanding of "how".

Isn't this a wonderful gift? We have been set as stewards of what is God's. And so we do what we are able and trust in God's action in creation and in our own lives. Sometimes that entails that we be busy. Sometimes we will have time to rest. In all of this we are encouraged to trust in God. Trust God that the plants will grow and mature. TAKING A JOURNEY WITHIN...

We are into the warm days of summer and the warm rains that shower the earth. The birds are singing and they are music to my ears. The warm sun is a welcome embrace of God's love after our long winter. The rains remind me of our precious baptism... which continually washes our souls and fills our lives. I have been trying to slow down a bit and just enjoy the moments of God's creation in my yard and on the walking trails.

the year where there seems to be more permission to take a journey to BE present to creation and to the relaxation of our souls.

Psalm 46:10 says... "Be still and know that I am God." Take a journey this summer... into your stillness and hear God's voice.

I will make a conscious intention to do the same.

Maybe we can compare notes when we meet in the fall.

Church Council Highlights from June 18, 2019

Your new Council met primarily to start looking ahead to the new year and make arrangements for anything that may arise over the summer.

Jeff Pym from Evangelical Lutheran Foundation of Eastern Canada will be at Messiah to discuss the possibility of pooling our funds with the Foundation. This will be valuable input for the decision we will make at the next AGM. Everyone is invited. Save the Date – September 12 at 7 p.m. in the basement auditorium.

There will be a Fall planning session October 20.

About 25 people attended the Service Committee initiative currently known as Eating Together. The idea is for hosts to invite a few "well recognized but barely known" people in the congregation for coffee or a meal. We are optimistic that over the next months there will be many Eating Together groups sharing food and conversation and building our community.

Council voted to extend the Senior Youth Leader contract to Tova for a year. We will be looking into the Alpha school based program that we understand is active in at least one school.

The treasurer reported a shortfall of about \$9000 in revenue against expenses in May. The next regular Council meeting will be on Sept. 17 at 7 p.m.



It's vacation time in Canada and our children are involved in many fun activities, but around world, the needs of displaced people is as great as ever.



CLWR's We Care Program invites churches and individuals to help give children the chance to play. The We Care Program is looking for a minimum of 500 new or gently used soccer balls to be included in future shipments (Angola and Cameroon planned for 2019). A pump should be included for approximately every 10 balls. The soccer balls should be deflated due to limited space in containers.

Some other highly requested items that are low in stock are (1) new and wrapped crayons and pencil crayons (2) diaper pins and (3) duo-tangs (to turn bulk lined-paper into notebooks).

If you see some good bargains, we can stock up for our fall shipment.

News About Messiah's Ministry in El Salvador through our Minister there: Rev. Dr. Brian Rude

1. An extract from Rev. Rude's Annual Report for 2018:



As is to be expected, in this 31st year of ministry in El Salvador, 2018 was another full, intense, and rich year of ministry, on behalf of the ABT Synod's program, "In Mission with El Salvador" / "En Misión con El Salvador."

I continued on as board member of CRISPAZ for my 10th year, beyond the normal limit of 9 years, at the request of the CRISPAZ board. I served as executive secretary for this, my second year, at the request of the board. My "retirement" from CRISPAZ came at the time of our annual meeting in November. It has been a valuable experience of solidarity and service, especially to Salvadorans and to supporters in the USA. We did enjoy yet another visit from a Canadian delegation hosted by CRISPAZ: Luther College in Regina sent a high school delegation of 18 youth and 4 adults for 10 days in February 2018. It was an enriching and worthwhile experience for all involved.

2018 was an election year in El Salvador. These elections were municipal and legislative. Again, I served as election observer and assistant through the CIS, along with a diverse team of 70 persons from 12 countries. Again, this was a rewarding way of immersing myself in the Salvadoran population in a variety of election-related settings, along with a small team, and the full team, of CIS volunteers, some here just for the election week, others for several months of planning, coordination, reporting, and evaluation.

IPAZ--Pastoral Initiative for Peace--continued to meet for three hours weekly throughout the year in Bishop Gomez's office. IPAZ planned numerous events, especially press conferences, and responded to numerous requests for assistance in cases requiring dialogue. It suffered some attrition, through the death of two founding members, the imprisonment of a couple regular members, and the loss of interest and distancing of numerous other members. Bishop Gómez attributes such distancing to fear, since the government was becoming more and more threatening in its opposition to dialogue as a way of promoting peace in Salvadoran society, which is the conviction and dedication of IPAZ. Others may see it as a failure of IPAZ to maintain a consistent strategy or to follow through on the numerous ambitious and promising ideas and proposals presented by diverse members of IPAZ.

As prison ministry continued to be an impossibility, especially due to the government's "extraordinary measures," now in their third year, prohibiting members of civilian society from entering prisons, and maintaining the prison population extremely isolated and out of range of communication with the outside world, I linked up with the Lutheran Church's "Pastoral Migrante," (Ministry to Migrants), seeking to respond to the myriad needs of those who have left home or are feeling the need to do so (such as those fleeing to the USA, and those deported from the USA), due to a variety of reasons.

I continued to rework and revise my DMin thesis--"Dialogue as a Faith Response to Social Violence in El Salvador"-- throughout the year. It focuses on the faith response of IPAZ and its pursuit of dialogue leading to social peace.

I participated in the AIDS Conference, including the Interfaith Pre-Conference, for a week in July.

Not being able to conduct seminars in prisons freed me to accompany the two week-long health brigades in March, conducted by Lutheran teams of about 15 members each from ELCA churches in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. These provided me with welcome immersions into numerous Lutheran church communities in El Salvador, as well as an opportunity for mutual enrichment with numerous ELCA Lutherans, from youth to seniors, lay members to bishops. They have developed these health-days over the years into smoothly-flowing, effective events of holistic health services (up to 20 different kiosks), faith and social accompaniment, and solidarity.

I had a couple opportunities to preach at Resurrection Lutheran Church, once at the Monday morning staff devotional.

2018 was a good year for contact with numerous ELCIC congregations throughout the ABT Synod. [Between June 10 and July 3, Pastor Brian visited nine congregations (including Messiah), and participated in the Alberta Synod Convention, visited LCBI, Outlook, and joined in on Prime Time at Kuriakos.] This short speaking tour I feel was most worthwhile. Visiting congregations in our ABT Synod always encourages me, both with respect to the ministries in each congregation and in the Synod as a whole, as well as with respect to the support demonstrated for our joint ministry "In Mission with El Salvador".

I met with several delegations to El Salvador throughout the year, including high school student group from Luther College, Regina. Others were Roman Catholic, Methodist, UCC and Lutheran delegations from Ontario, BC, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Washington D.C., Wisconsin, Minnesota, Colorado, Norway and Germany.

My home continues to be filled with displaced Salvadorans, unable to live in their own homes with their families due to threats and violence. There are usually 3 or 4 permanent residents, besides up to a dozen occasional guests. I assist these with free room and board, some with bursaries, or funds for family, health, phone or other expenses. Daily this calls for discernment over what it is they "want" and what it is they "need," as well as some assessment of the reality of their needs. This applies also to the requests of numerous others in need, who do not live in, or stay at, my home.

I join the 35 Lutheran pastors from around the country most Wednesday mornings, for worship, study led by a rotation of pastors or guests, wrapping up with lunch fellowship. I sent out sixteen e-newsletters in 2018.

I would like to thank all who make this ministry possible, from administrators to donors, those who pray and those who write, those who visit and those who minister at home. May God continue to bless this ministry, and to bless us all, throughout 2019 and beyond.

- 2. The Messiah Annual Report for 2018-19 on page 57 provides the official information that \$4,810 was contributed by Messiah members (and the MLW) toward the financial support of Rev. Rude's ministry in El Salvador. Messiah members may be interested to learn that Alberta Synod congregations and individuals contributed roughly \$23,000 to "In Mission with El Salvador" in 2018. Other sources provided about \$27,000.
- **3.** As we start a new financial year, Messiah members contributed \$295 in May. As you can see by Rev. Rude's report, these gifts are well used in the ministry to which Rev. Rude is called in El Salvador. To facilitate the gathering of further gifts, yellow donation envelopes are available at the Welcome Centre at the rear of the sanctuary. To God be the Glory.

Opportunities For Designated Giving

As a part of the ongoing maintenance and improvements at Messiah Lutheran Church the Support Committee, with the approval of Church Council, is informing our members of two projects that are in need of financial assistance going forward.

- 1) Improvements to our sound system beginning with the installation of a T coil that will assist the hearing of those with hearing aids that have a setting that connects to this system. Other improvements to the sound system will be made as we can fund them.
- 2) Starting and building up a designated fund over a number of years for the replacement of the shingles on the sanctuary roof, as well as for the replacement of the covering on the flat roof areas will prepare us for this inevitable cost.

These are major projects that will require significant financial resources so we must prepare in advance. More specific dollar amounts will be supplied later for your information.

Just a reminder that your REGULAR GIVING should not be used for these projects, since our operational budget continues, but as you are able your designated gifts will make these projects possible.

Messiah congregation has successfully use this method over the years to fund many important projects. Contact any of us on Support with questions or ideas. Thank you for your support!

At the last AGM the matter of how best to steward and invest our endowment funds came up. A decision will be made at the June 2020 AGM. As with most money matters there are options. Gathering information and weighing the pros and cons of each is important before we vote next June. One route would be to engage ELFEC to invest our funds. Jeff Pym, director of ELFEC, will be at Messiah **September 12 at 7 p.m.** in the basement auditorium to talk about ELFEC and answer any questions we may have. 


