### Minister's Message



The message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.

1 Corinthians 1:18-31

This verse shows up in our lectionary texts two weeks in a row (January 26<sup>th</sup> and February 2<sup>nd</sup>). Those who put together the lectionary must think that this is an important message for us as

followers of Jesus – I agree. What underlies this passage is the surprising (foolish?) news that God's very being is present in this fallen and hurting world right at the point of our deepest failings and most excruciating pain. And Paul says that it is at this point, on the cross, that God's fullest power, wisdom and love is on display and most clearly seen. John, in his gospel account, see's Jesus' death on the cross as his "coronation".

I know that many of us have grown up with this language and quite easily agree that this is the truth. But take a moment to think about this again.... Does Jesus' death on a cross as a convicted criminal of the lowest order display the power and wisdom of God?

It's easier to see his power in:

His command of the sea and waves...

Jesus' healing of all who were sick and possessed... His teaching and debating abilities with the most intellectual of the day...

His announcements of forgiveness of people no one else wants anything to do with...

Jesus rising from death on the third day and ascension into heaven...

These things are easily seen as signs of his power, wisdom and love... but,

His vulnerability?

His acceptance of an unjust judgement by Pilate?

His bleeding?

His crying out in despair?

His death?

Really, how can these things be considered power, wisdom, or love? (Let alone the deepest expressions of them?) But we know this is true.

We know it is true because AS God is vulnerable and dies (in Jesus), God has done something impossible. God has proven complete connection with us AND has overcome what seems to be the ultimate power: death.

We can participate with God in this power. We can allow ourselves to live in our vulnerabilities – especially when it comes to becoming more connected with others. We can help where help is welcome. We can accept help when we could use some help.

Our "Eating Together/Getting to Know You" initiative is very much in line with this participation with God in acknowledging our vulnerabilities and living through them with others. Invite someone to share a morsel of food or drink with you. Accept an invitation from someone else. Then share a part of your lives together.

Another initiative that I want to encourage each of us to participate in, is reading together the book titled: *Real Faith for Real Life*. Hopefully some small groups can be formed to read it together at their own pace. We will also focus on one chapter for each of the 6 weekends in Lent. Michael W. Foss will encourage us in 6 practices of our faith: prayer, weekly worship, daily bible reading, serving in and beyond the congregation, nurturing relationships and generosity in and beyond the church.

There is so much to be encouraged by here at Messiah. May we continue to grow in our faith and in our serving to the praise and glory of the one who lived, died and lives again.

### **GREAT IS THY FAITHFULNESS**

As January has come and gone so quickly we find ourselves moving into the month of February. So many things have happened already. We have already lost beloved loved ones

in our midst as we moved into our year. We have begun our regular routines of daily living and worship in our community.

We have already experienced a mix of the joys and sorrows of life.

We are also in the season of Epiphany. This season where light is shone into our lives and God's divine love is made known. We begin to walk with the stories of Jesus time on this earth and rediscover the moments of history in our old testament. We have a banner up in our church that says... "RENEW DAILY"

Indeed the faithfulness of our Lord and God's presence is renewed not only daily... but moment by moment. There is never a moment where the light and love of God does not journey with us and in us.

As we move through each present moment of this year... may we always be reminded of the faithful presence of our God in everything and in every moments we experience.

Indeed... God is faithful. It is renewed each and every day.

I have been meditating on a verse in Lamentations 3:22-23 as of late that speaks of God's faithful love:

<sup>22</sup>The steadfast love of the LORD never ceases; his mercies never come to an end;

<sup>23</sup> they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness" esv

Indeed... God's faithfulness is ever with us. What a comfort as we open our year, knowing that God shows up for us every moment... and his love is ever with us.

As we journey together let us never forget the faithful love of our Lord... and make sure everyone we meet knows it also.

### Bishop's Message

### For Congregations and Lay and Rostered Leaders



Dear Beloved of God -

Since being called to serve as your bishop, October 2012, my prayer has often been the following: O God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the

ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go forward with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

One of the reasons I love this prayer is because it is realistic but encouraging, honest but hopeful. It doesn't deny difficult truths, but neither does it succumb to sterile pessimism. It was written in the first part of the twentieth century by a Church of England priest named Eric Milner-White. Like many good prayers from another time and place, it sounds like it was tailor made for us here and now.

O God, you have called your servants.... I have seen so many signs of hope in these few years of serving as your bishop, not just in projects and initiatives and ideas, but in our people:

- in the faithful and dedicated rostered ministers, who are a gift to us all;
- in the diligent and committed staff and officers of the Synod, who it is a joy to work with on a daily and weekly basis, who love the Synod and serving it;
- in the lay leaders of this Synod, serving in various and multitude capacities;

• in the faithful people who hold no particular office or position, but who form the faithful backbone, week after week, that is the body of Christ in the ABT Synod.


You are all not only living, breathing signs of hope, but you also have my profound thanks for all that you do, and it is my privilege to serve with and among you.

### For Age 3 to Grade 6



### **Refugee Support Group Update**

Grace & peace to you from God: Father, Son & Holy Spirit.

Messiah's Refugee Support Group has not been "active" for some time now. There is no action in the foreseeable future, but we do have some updates about people we have supported in the past and are committed to support when they arrive in Canada. When support action is needed, we will contact previous members again and also contact the whole of the congregation for people who will have time and abilities to help out at that time.

### Past Support:

News from Jemila. You may have heard already, Jemila has been married and is expecting a child in the spring. Everything is going so well for Jemila in Brooks. I don't have contact information, but Yvonne and/or Sharon may be able to help you to contact her with congratulations or the like.

News from Weini & Yohannes: They have been doing very well in Edmonton with their supportive community from Eritrea. They recently welcomed a new son into their family and all are well. I have had semi-regular contact with Yohannes through texting.

### Future Support:

Messiah has committed to helping 2 family units. One a family of 4 who are currently in Nairobi. The other a single man currently in Tel Aviv.

Both have been approved by the Canadian Government in early September 2019. We hope to see them arrive around September of 2020 - but there are no guarantees... We also expect that we will have a month's notice before they arrive to do that last minute planning, but again, no guarantees of that either.

Each of the families we are sponsoring have families in Camrose already who are willing to do a lot of the work (housing, interpretation, incidentals are primary pieces they will look after) but will need help financially when their family members arrive as well as other help.

Currently, we have \$16,590 reserved for the families when they arrive to support them for 1 year. Thank you to all who have contributed here over the years!

We will likely need more than that, but Century Meadows has pledged to support the single man. Also the families here will be providing at least in-kind donations that will reduce the total needed from us.

Again, thank you for your interest and support over the years. This is just to keep you up to date with what has been happening and what I know of our future refugee families.

Please contact me if you have more questions or know more or different information than I have been able to provide.

God's blessings to you and the refugees we have/will support.

On Saturday, February 29, 2020, the East Central Area will offer four workshops on the following topics:



We are making diapers out of flannelette sheets, but need several other items to complete a kit. These could be gathered from a garage sale, thrift shop etc. The following items as follows are for 1 kit: 2 sleepers or gowns; 2 undershirts or onesies; 2 receiving blankets; 6 safety pins; 2 washcloths; 1 sweater or sweatshirt; 4 diapers. We were very fortunate to have a group of ladies from another church make baby bundles but they have retired. It would be wonderful if we could make 15 kits. We would have a work bee to put them together. Thank you for considering.

She has facilitated many workshops on Interpretation Through Storytelling, and shares historic stories with community groups and school children.
