At the very same time there are things that continue to niggle at us. We have worries (not that worry ever solved anything or made any difference, still we worry). We worry about all kinds of things: our families, health, covid19, money (or lack of it), world oil prices, economic troubles, how will others react to isolation, how will **we** react to isolation. I suspect you have your own special worries.

Sin and doubt are still hanging around. Death still has a definite air of finality. But we know that this is not all there is to say about what is because of Jesus.

We are an Easter People. We live in the present that is permeated with both sin (along with loss and loneliness and doubt and death and...) and the peace from God that passes all understanding (along with joy and love and courage and strength and hope). One day, God's word of life and peace and joy and hope will finally eradicate that other voice.

This is so much like those first believers experienced. They knew joy and fear. They knew worry and peace. They knew seclusion and brief moments of fellowship. They knew Jesus risen and much of the time hidden but that he was coming soon.

This covid-19 thing will not last forever: there will be an end.

In the meantime, the Holy Spirit is with us giving us the light in the midst of the darkness, strength in our weakness, hope in our waiting, joy in our hardships, connection with others in our loneliness.

Bishop's Message For Congregations and Lay and Rostered Leaders

Dear Beloved of God -

Christ is risen. Alleluia!

You may recall in my correspondence this year for congregational AGM's these words:

"Since being called to serve as your bishop, October 2012, my prayer has often been the following: O God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go forward with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

One of the reasons I love this prayer is because it is realistic but encouraging, honest but hopeful. It doesn't deny difficult truths, but neither does it succumb to sterile pessimism. It was written in the first part of the twentieth century by a Church of England priest named Eric Milner-White. Like many good prayers from another time and place, it sounds like it was tailor made for us here and now."

Little did I know the future when I first penned these words last December.

The prayer is realistic, encouraging, honest, hopeful, no denying of difficult truths nor succumbing to sterile pessimism.

The prayer continues to be 'tailor made" for us here and now. The Spirit of God continues to lead us into a future that is unfamiliar, with the assurance that God is present, that God's hand is leading us, and that we are cradled in love.

Friends, you continue to be witnesses to me of Resurrection, to the truth that there is life and hope and promise.

I have experienced in these past weeks so many signs of hope, and of faithfulness, trust, courage, and encouragement:

- Congregational leaders, lay and rostered who, under extraordinary stress, pressure and restraints have poured themselves into the work of leadership
- Congregational leaders, lay and rostered who, tired and weary and wondering, have reached out to one another,

and to those in their midst, providing pastoral care, connection, compassion and care

- Congregational leaders, lay and rostered who, in the midst of an unprecedented time, exercised great skill (and energy and time) in preparing and/or searching for worship resources for Holy Week and Easter services
- Rostered Ministers who gather each Wednesday via ZOOM with Synod Staff for prayer, affirmation and encouragement, updates, and connecting
- Area Deans who gather weekly with rostered ministers via ZOOM for check-in with each other, study and/or prayer
- Creativity, ingenuity, openness, support, encouragement, trust, community....

Friends, you have been signs to me of Resurrection life

And, I have never been so proud of you.






CONNECTING IN THE WORD

Although not the kind of Easter any of us were expecting - there are certain truths that are not changed by our current situation. The power of an empty tomb to give hope is not different if we can't be sitting in the same building on Sunday morning.

The power of resurrection to change lives is not reduced if we can't gather with extended family for brunch. The power of love to heal, restore, and renew is not mitigated by staying physically distant from others.

In fact, the point of Easter - that death is overcome - means seeing daily updates of confirmed cases and infection rates should not rob us of our deepest, truest hope.

While many of the things we miss are good - and we can't wait to get them back - hopefully we've all learned something from this collective experience about what is necessary that we never noticed, what is optional that we thought required, and what is harmful that we thought was beneficial.

We are especially glad that we are all together this year, and pray you have found meaningful ways to maintain connections to those you hold dear.

Jonah and Matea came home early as their term was halted just a day after we returned from Kenya, but since then the decision was made that they will not be returning for the final term this year. This, of course, was a huge disappointment especially for Jonah who now misses out on all his senior year activities which are uniquely special and important at a school like RVA where the kids live together for years, before dispersing to all corners of the globe after they finish.

Our family continues to heal and recover from the armed robbery at our home in February. My physical wounds are healing quite well, though I still don't have my normal voice back, we still have hope it will recover. The anxiety we feel is slowly decreasing, sleep has mostly returned, and we feel that as the days pass things are generally getting better.

Thanks for all your care, support, and concern for our family, through this last season, and over the five years that we've been in Burundi so far.

Greetings from Rev. Brian Rude in El Salvador

Palm Sunday / Sunday of the Passion Reflections

Have we mortals ever been in more dire need of a Messiah?



Messiahs abound. The president of El Salvador might have been hailed as "Messiah" had the distribution of his \$300 / who-knows-whom aid package flowed more smoothly.

"Cuaresma" (Lent) has reached its end. "Cuarentena" (quarantine) goes on (indefinitely?).

It is high time we seek a Messiah, to celebrate a triumphal entry.

So, today we mortals seek a Messiah. If you live in a clime which requires a coat, grab it, and let's go find ourselves a Messiah. If you live in a clime where palm branches flourish, grab one, and let's go find ourselves a Messiah. Be sure to practice physical distance, of course--only your two feet every two metres. The "corona" (crown) part doesn't come until Friday.

In the absence of a messiah-rescuer, if my housemates were not such cynics and were more religious, more into rites, such as Palm Sunday processions, we could work something up here at home, quite convincingly, with this palm bush just outside our front door. The trick might be finding some coats to throw down, here in this tropical clime where even shirts are too much.

Hordes surround us, though most are held at bay most of the time. Last Monday thousands took to the streets, carelessly shedding any quarantine directives or wisdom, eager to claim the \$300 subsidy promised by the president over the weekend. If he'd have succeeded in satisfying them, the mobs might well have hailed him as their Messiah. Alas, we may have to look for another (as many continue to look for their \$300).

The Emperor's triumphal security forces abound, parading all over this tiny country, guarding gates everywhere, reinforcing blind border entries, ensuring that no-one wanders outside their front door without written permission, signed by who-knows-whom. Many of these agents are appointed by the state (police and military). Many are self-appointed (gangs). Tales abound of brutality and illegal detentions. Wanderers are beaten into submission, or imprisoned for a month. Salvadorans aren't yet so afraid of the coronavirus (about 60 confirmed Covid-19 infections to date, 3 deaths, 2 recoveries) as they are of the means being imposed to prevent its spread.

Here in El Salvador, it is those leaning to the left (politically, human rights oriented), who caution against its over-implementation. With a primarily informal economy, too many are left without their daily bread, or tortillas, and those taking control are overly concerned for their own people, at the expense of others. Quarantines don't inspire justice and peace and compassion any more than our everyday homicide-plagued society does.

So, this first Sunday, this launching of "Holy" Week, is more a Sunday of the Passion--yet another any-day-of-the-year Passion, than it is a Palm Sunday, liturgically-speaking. May God have mercy on us all, moment by moment, day by day.


Via Facebook live and WhatsApp, we will come together to relive the rituals, as best we can from the isolation of our own homes, as corporately as possible while in solitude.

HOSANNA! Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest heaven!

Good Friday Corona

I've had a crown of thorns on my front terrace for almost as long as Jesus walked this earth. It grew from a clip I borrowed from Maryknoll sister friends (Maryknoll sisters know about crowns of thorns).

"Crown" (corona) has taken on a much more sinister significance this year, a profoundly "Good Friday" significance, as so much of the world Jesus came to save is being crucified along with him--so many due to the corona virus itself, so many others due to collateral effects.

Besides the news, personal messages keep pouring in, and I am helpless to respond in any life-giving way. I am surrounded, but out of "touch" (now only

virtually), by neighbours and friends without food, without water, without healthcare . without security from violence . . . almost without hope. Life for them has become a *corona* of thorns--not only the worrisome, often deadly virus, but also with a few "corona of thorns" layers thrust on top, gouging into the scalp, provoking bleeding and pain.

May God's children not lose Easter hope while being tormented by this Good Friday corona of thorns.

As an addition to the article from the **Watts family in Burundi**, Cece Watts has reported that by the time you read their article, they will have returned to Edmonton and will be in isolation for the required time. Will they go back? Are they staying home in Canada? Stay tuned!!

Displayed on our link bulletin board are the pictures of **Ryan and Siobain Cole**, he a pilot with **Mission Aviation Fellowship in Papua New Guinea**. They are currently on leave from PNG, having already visited her folks and friends in the United Kingdom. However they are now in Alberta at his parents' home in Brownfield, Alberta. They had plans for visiting their supporters in Canada, and particularly in Alberta, but the pandemic has restricted those face-to-face meetings, and is even raising questions as to when they will be able to return to Papua New Guinea. Perhaps we could have a ZOOM visit with them!

As COVID-19 reaches every corner of the globe, CLWR is more thankful than ever for our friendship and support, making sure that the most vulnerable aren't forgotten during this crisis.

Here's how CLWR and its partners are already responding:

Southeast Asia: Since the outbreak started, partner offices in Myanmar, Nepal and Laos have been running campaigns in remote and vulnerable communities to provide information about the virus and limiting its spread. CLWR's ongoing work in Myanmar includes providing sanitation and hygiene access to vulnerable families in IDP camps.

Jordan: CLWR's partner office in Jordan is working with the UNHCR to rush hand sanitizers to Za'atari refugee camp, home to almost 100,000 displaced Syrians.

Ethiopia: CLWR partners are scaling up water and sanitation projects, and providing protective equipment for staff in critical ongoing aid efforts.

Jerusalem: As the virus began to spread in Gaza and the West Bank, Augusta Victoria Hospital moved quickly into emergency operations mode and has been set up as a key facility for testing and treatment of severe cases of COVID-19.

Refugee Camps: Partner staff in all locations are increasing focus on hygiene, sanitation and clean water to protect the most vulnerable and the staff administering vital aid programs.

Roof Repair Update


The final cost of roofing repairs completed on the flat roof sections of the Fellowship Center increased by \$7612.50 including G.S.T.

There were sections totaling 608 sq.ft. where rotten insulation had to be removed and replaced. As well there was new plywood and expanded foam insulation put around the roof perimeter at the base of the parapet walls to insure leak proofing.

This additional cost was not unexpected since we did not know what conditions would be discovered when the old roofing was removed.

Thank you to everyone for your generous support of this project. It has been about 1/3 covered through these donations to date.

The office door is now open which makes dropping things off and appropriate cleaning of surfaces easier.


Pastor Bev reported that the virtual retreat she led was well received and could lead to other virtual events.




