



#### Minister's Message



In the beginning
when God created
the heavens and the earth,
the earth was a formless void
and darkness covered
the face of the deep
Genesis 1:1-2a

There are moments in the last couple of months where I have felt that we are in a big, formless void. So much has been taken away. So much is unclear (dark) about what is going to happen – and when it will happen. I can feel like I am treading water with no apparent possibility of respite. Some of you may be feeling similarly.

This time can feel like the end of... everything.

So it is interesting that these first words from my most favorite book in the Bible resonate right now. These words come at the "beginning". And yet, these words *also* speak to us who may be feeling we are at the end. I've always been drawn to the first 3 words: "In the beginning". Today, I'm drawn to: *formless*, *void*, *darkness*, and *the deep*.

Maybe – even though this time is feeling void and formless and dark and way over our heads – maybe this time is a beginning for us.

This text signals the creation story where God creates the world by speaking it into existence over six days, with one more day to rest. Each day begins in darkness and ends in light. Are we on the way to light?

The whole *beginning* isn't immediate. I know that six days sounds quick but just ask someone who is lonely, or waiting for something, or in turmoil – they will tell you that each moment is an eternity! Beginning is not immediate. It will take time; time that we don't think we have; time that we don't want to take; but, time it will take. There may be some periods of sudden realization that we have moved along – that something new has begun – but the fullness will take more time.

Our province has begun to take the first steps in a new beginning. I think we are all hoping that things will get back to the way they once were (only better...) But, what if God has something new in mind? What will that new day look like? Remember, each day starts in darkness. We don't know what the new day will look like as it begins. What we do know is that God will see that what is created will be "good". Can we expect something good in our new beginning?

What might a new day, that is good, look like? Look expectantly for what God is calling into new being. Look expectantly for what will be good. Look expectantly for how you will be called to be a part of that good, new day.

It will take time. Let time be fulfilled. Don't rush it. Don't become complacent either – thinking that you don't have a part in God's grand new design. Prayerfully anticipate. Prayerfully step into the light of each new day. Could it be that God is beginning something "very good"?

And there was evening and there was morning, the new day.

## Bishop's Message For Congregations and Lay and Rostered Leaders



Dear Beloved of God -

I know I have said it before, but it bears repeating: I have experienced in these past weeks so many signs of hope, and of faithfulness, trust, courage, and encouragement:

- congregational leaders, lay and rostered who, under extraordinary stress, pressure and restraints have poured themselves into the work of leadership;
- congregational leaders, lay and rostered who, tired and weary and wondering, have reached out to one another, and to those in their midst, providing pastoral care, connection, compassion and care;
- congregational leaders, lay and rostered who, in the midst of an unprecedented time, exercised great skill (and energy and time) in preparing and/or searching for worship resources;
- rostered ministers who gather each Wednesday via ZOOM with Synod Staff for prayer, affirmation and encouragement, updates, and connecting;
- Area Deans who gather with rostered ministers via ZOOM for check-in with each other, study and/or prayer;
- and, creativity, ingenuity, openness, support, encouragement, trust, community.

At this time, I am inviting you – encouraging you – to pray for rostered ministers in varied ministry contexts, because I am hearing, seeing and recognizing that many of our rostered ministers are tired, weary, exhausted from:

- the emotional toll of being a leader in a time of uncertainty, crisis, liminality;
- leading sudden adaptive changes with technical challenges;
- disruption and change to regular patterns of spiritual and self-care practices;
  - · constant remote availability;
- worship preparation, pastoral care ministry, connecting with the congregation and community;
  - and all, without any specific training or experience. This means that the skills, experience, training, networking, resourcing, and best practices, for many, have all needed to be created and learned in real time.





Bishops and treasurers of the ELCIC's synods and national church have written to The Hon. Ahmed Hussen, Minister of Families, Children, and Social Development, to encourage action by the Canadian government to sustain the charitable sector during the COVID-19 pandemic.

I am attaching copies of the ELCIC letter and Canadian Council of Christian Charities (CCCC) letter for your information, as well as a template for correspondence to your Member of Parliament.

Spirit -Led Leadership

Specifically, the letter endorses the CCCC proposal to sustain the charitable sector during the COVID-19 pandemic, as submitted to the government on April 21, 2020. The CCCC has written to The Hon. Ahmed Hussen, Minister of Families, Children and Social Development with a funding proposal, "to sustain and strengthen the charitable sector during the COVID-19 pandemic crisis, when demand for services is very high, but significant decreases in donations due to income insecurity threatens to destabilize charities."

Hope-Filled Discipleship

I invite you to consider sharing copies of these letters with your Member of Parliament (MP), and to share these letters with your congregation asking them to consider contacting their MP. #### Greetings from Rev. Brian Rude in El Salvador

#### **Easter New Life**

I haven't set up an altar at home.

My home surrounds me with altars--Easter altars.

Anyone who is half a gardener would have a hard time denying the resurrection. New life abounds. New life springs up, quietly, unannounced, waiting to be found, waiting to be celebrated, waiting to renew our faith, waiting to teach us lessons of life, new life--and rainy season hasn't even started yet!

Our neighbour, who wages war against green--against trees, against leaves, against shade--is forever attempting to de-green our yard. A couple months ago, she sicced the street-guard on the trees over my front terrace. I was expecting a basic pruning, especially of any wayward branches encroaching on her shadeless domain. She and all my neighbours have air-conditioning, I'm sure. We don't need it, even at daily temperatures of 32C, thanks to all my forestry shade. Every visitor comments on how cool our home is, compared to anywhere else in the country. I came home to discover, to my dismay, that my entire front terrace had been deprived of all shade, left to bake in the merciless sun. I desperately watered this garden space, daily, but alas, dozens of lovely plants perished, scorched brown. My favourite plant, just outside our front door, suffered not only shade-deprivation, but the blow of a huge branch carelessly felled on it, which left it totally destroyed--crushed, smashed, kaputz-with not a hint of green left. I was too grief-stricken to go about the sad task of removing it.

Oh me of little faith. My plant, however fragile and embattled, was determined not to bow to evil forces, not to succumb to death. It had life left in it, and delicate leaflet by delicate leaflet, re-emerged from the grave, to a wondrous splendour. With the sun playing on the leaves, this altar even provides images of a crown and a bell, apt for Good Friday and Easter Sunday. New life. Easter life.

On the other side of the other front terrace, neighbours had detached a vine, no doubt eager to free the spy window which it had gradually covered. Here, too, I was slow to chop all those dead vines down and haul them to the compost heap. Here, too, life was still in those vines. New leaves have appeared and grown. Rainy season, starting in May, will no doubt transform it, revive it, into a fully-green wall once again, beautifying one of our favourite picnic nooks.

One plant which has not suffered such calamities, but remains faithful, is that of the "monjas blancas,"--white nuns, or white sisters. These flowers endure, always vigilant. I call them Mary, Joanna, and Mary. I could call them Marlys, Gail, and Lisa, my three sisters, always vigilant. These three white sisters will be the first to witness us emerge from our covid-19 tomb, resurrected to new life.

Even "dead" plants--formerly green plants--do not lose their beauty, their charm, in my humble opinion. These change, but are not lost.

So Easter surrounds me. New life. Resurrection life.

Jesus is risen. Jesus is risen indeed. Surrounded by such Easter life, Easter altars, how could I but proclaim my Easter faith?

#### **Developments in the "World Mission" Scene**

1. El Savador: Please do read Rev. Rude's Easter greeting which precedes this message. Thank you again to all those who contribute to "In Mission with El Salvador" through their donations, usually through use of the yellow envelopes at the rear of the sanctuary, or more directly through a cheque dropped off at the Church Office in these corono virus days.

In the Messiah Annual Report being prepared for the Annual Meeting, there will be a final figure as to how much Messiah members have contributed to "In Mission with El Salvador" in the financial year which concluded on April 30. Each and every donation is appreciated!

- 2. Mission Aviation Fellowship: Several people gathered via ZOOM to participate in a presentation by Ryan and Shiobhain Cole, on April 29. The Coles serve with MAF, he as a pilot, and Shiobhain, Ryan's wife, in a support role. Due to the corona virus, the Coles, who are "home" on a brief leave are stranded in Canada, and therefore not able to go to congregations to share the story of their ministry in Papua New Guinea. Their presentation was thorough and challenging. Their testimony on how God called them to this ministry was up-lifting! They emphasized the importance of prayer on their behalf because of the challenges that there are in what they do in Papua New Guinea's mountainous landscape.
- 3. Also by ZOOM, the World Mission Group at its regular May meeting was honoured by the participation of **George and Susan Watts** who had just completed their 14 days of isolation after returning from Burundi. As a family they were in different stages of recovering from the experience of being attacked in their home in Burundi. The local residents have been very supportive of them. George and Susan each shared with the Group the joys and challenges of their responsibilities related to the medical centre where they serve. They are the only expatriate lay persons among the expatriate medical staff at the medical facility at Kibuye. The Group has great admiration for the ministries in which George and Susan are involved and assured the Watts family of its continued support through prayer.
- **4.** The World Mission Group has put forward a resolution to the Support Committee which, if approved, would come to the June Annual Meeting. The resolution recommends that a portion, or all, of the interest from the appropriate Endowment Fund be directed to the support of students attending the **schools of the Lutheran Church in Colombia.**

We are happy to be one of the ministries of Messiah which serves and joins in proclaiming Jesus, our Risen Lord.

#### PROTECTING THE MOST VULNERABLE IN ETHIOPIA

Millions of people in Ethiopia displaced due to conflict are living in temporary settlements which make

them especially vulnerable to COVID-19. Clean water sources are hard to find. So far, the rapid response has included:

- ~ 3,611 large jerry cans for families to store and carry water
- ~ laundry and bathing soap for 5,254 families for handwashing and household sanitation
- ~ personal protective equipment for staff so vital aid efforts can continue

#### INNOVATIVE APPROACH TO PREVENTION IN UGANDA

In Uganda, CLWR's partners are one of few organizations with permission from the country's Ministry of Health to continue work

> in the area. They provide basic service like shelter and clean water to over 450,000 refugees who have fled conflict in South Sudan and the Democratic Republic of the Congo. COVID-19 presents unique challenges to getting information and services to the people who need it most. To meet these challenges, the team is using radio talk shows and trucks with megaphones to broadcast important information about prevention measures. With our support to CLWR, they are also getting essential hygiene items like handwashing

#### **Council Highlights for May 2020**

Council expressed appreciation for the way that our ministry teams are adapting to the constraints of covid-19 by connecting online and by phone. The Witnessing committee has also stepped up to coordinate efforts to make sure everyone can stay connected. Pastor Calvin brought up concerns about those who have neither cable nor internet connections. Although this may seem like the widely accepted new normal, for a number of people it is not an option.

The consensus is that we should not re-open for public worship yet. This will continue to be monitored as we see the effects of the loosening of restrictions over the summer.

With this in mind, it was decided to hold the Annual General Meeting on June 14, 2020 by Zoom. Information will be coming from the office about how to connect. Annual reports will be mailed or emailed.

The personal, social and material losses the pandemic has brought into focus have raised the question of how we as a church, and the ministerial committee could work with the City and other agencies to meet the needs that are emerging. It is an old question the pandemic has made more urgent. What is our role?

The Support Committee reports that the roof fund has reached about \$40,000 of the \$94,000 total.

Our Pastors are utilizing technology and bringing us a twice weekly time to connect around the Word. Go to messiahcamrose.ca and click on Connecting in the Word on the



## ALPHA, a Tool We Can Use to Tell Others About JESUS

This past winter, the Learning Committee was wondering how it could reach out to people who don't know Jesus. Some church groups have tried to do this, but with varied success. Going out to meet people we don't even know and presenting the "Good News," often seems scary and even overwhelming.

Yet, scripture passages like Matthew 28:18-20 make it clear:

"All authority in heaven and earth has been given to me.
Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations,
baptizing them in the Name of the Father
and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit,
and teaching them to obey everything
I have commanded you."

I think that these words of Jesus tell us we are to get out there, mingle with folks and share the story of Jesus.

In another passage of scripture that we recently heard on Sunday morning says, Acts1:8:

"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes to you. Then you will be my witnesses to me in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

Here again we see Jesus telling his disciples to go, get out there and share the Good News.

I know that verses like this make us feel uncomfortable. Yet we probably know we should be out there sharing the Good News, telling and sharing the message of eternal life with Jesus, but this thought frightens us.

I guess it is that it is the Holy Spirit who actually makes disciples, but we need to be out there sowing seeds. A devotional I recently read stated:

"If the church does not have disciple-making as its center thrust, we are simply rearranging Deckchairs on the Titanic."

It seems to me that we often equate Mission work with serving in the community, helping the poor, putting up buildings, addressing justice issues, distributing literature, all of which of course are commendable activities springing from the love of Jesus in our hearts, but are people hearing the Good News?

The Church also does well at providing spiritual nourishment for its **faithful** attenders. Our pastors preach and teach. They were busy doing visitations regularly prior to Coved 19. The church has programs with something for almost everyone. We have music and choirs – some of the best! But are individuals outside our building, people who have never considered the claims of Jesus, are they being invited/challenged to respond to the love of Jesus?

There are indeed many ways in which people in our community can see evidence of the Gospel in action, many venues through which they can hear the Gospel, for example in a worship setting, or through Messiah's

TV broadcasts. But how do people who have a yearning in their hearts to really check out The Good News without having to step inside a church building get their questions answered?

How might we present Jesus to those that have not yet heard, and to those who have heard but want to explore Jesus' claims without actually showing up at church?

We have at our disposal a program which may serve these needs! We are prepared to use the Bible-based program **ALPHA** to be a means by which some of the concerns above might be answered. We will conduct the program in a neutral location. The message and theme of the program is **Jesus**. The Alpha Program has been in existence for many years, and been successfully used in many settings. What is success? People coming to faith in Christ, and then taking the step to participate in a church community.

#### Let's do It!!

If you feel called to participate in this endeavor, you are encouraged to contact me, or our church office, as we begin to plan for a venture which is designed to address the faith questions in people's hearts and minds.

Let's aim for a Fall start-up when, Lord willing, gatherings will be permitted again.

We will need leaders, support, and above all, prayer for this venture. Would you be willing to set aside time to specifically pray, that God would begin to prepare hearts and minds of those seeking to find the truths about Jesus' life-giving message.

It is intended that Alpha will be offered in a neutral location, that is, not specifically connected to any particular church.

As members of the Messiah community, please start to identify people in Camrose who might really benefit from this program, and be ready to encourage them to attend, maybe even bring them.

And of course, people who just want a refresher course in the basics of the Christian faith will be most welcome too!




