



#### Minister's Message



God sent me before you to preserve life.

Genesis 45:5b

I began my last month's article with the first chapter of Genesis.

For the next two months we will continue through the stories in Genesis: Abraham, Isaac, Jacob and Joseph. What wonderful stories. I encourage you to read through those stories in full (not just in the little snippets we will get from Sunday mornings).

In all these stories I believe we read about real people in real situations. In the midst of real life, God acts to cause chosen people to grow into who they are intended to be by God. Abram is led in the direction his own father had begun years before. He does this in faith but not without a number of problems along the way. He becomes the father of Isaac – the promised son – and the father of many nations through the faith he had in God.

Isaac had a rough life: one hundred year old parents, danger from an older half sibling, an episode with his father where he was a breath away from being sacrificed, a partner chosen for him from far away, wondering if they would ever conceive, dealing with sibling rivalry between his two twin (but very different!) sons. In all this he was blessed. He found love. He had hope. He was able to pass along blessing from God.

Jacob also had a tough life. He was the younger (by minutes) and so was not in line to receive his father's inheritance. Favored by his mother, but second place to his father. Smart, but not as "manly" as his brother. Because he was cunning, he cheated his brother out of the inheritance – that brought about hard feelings from his brother, Esau. Jacob ran away and ended up serving his uncle Laban. Jacob found love, but there were hurdles to consummating it. He competed with his uncle as well – again bringing about hard feelings. Jacob ended up with many sons – good – but that introduced its own set of problems.

Jacob strove with people and God. In the end he received blessing and passed it along.

Joseph started out as a favorite. But that, and the fact that he embellished that favoritism, found him at odds with his many older brothers. He ended up as a slave, then a prisoner but in all of this found a way to come out on top. His gifts from God allowed him to be of benefit to everyone he came in contact with. Eventually he wound up as 2<sup>nd</sup> in command in all of Egypt. In this position he reconciled with his brothers and ended up saving his family from starvation. All the good that happened he attributed to the working of God.

May we find ways to bless others with what we have received from God.

May we find ways to give praise to God even when our situation may look dire from time to time.

May we know the hope that is in God through Christ Jesus, who lived, died and rose again (alive still today!) and share that hope with everyone we encounter.

cannot gather which for some creates a whole new level of pain.

And yet God continues to be present with us, continues to encourage us through one another, through God's word and through natures beauty. We are daily reminded that God remains present and that that nothing can separate us from the love of God.

In Romans 8: 38-39 we hear these words... "For I am convinced that neither, death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord." NIV

What a comfort it is to know God's steady presence in these times when we are faced with the "REAL" struggles of life. The reality is that nothing can happen to us that can keep God's love from reaching us. NOTHING!! We may not feel it or even know that God's love is there... and even that will not separate us from this reality.

## Bishop's Message For Congregations and Lay and Rostered Leaders



Dear Beloved of God -

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

I am writing to a future that is uncertain and unknown, to a situation that is changing not by

the month, week, day, or even by the hour, but literally minute by minute, with the certainty that nothing will be the same again. Our church and our world will be very different for all of us on the other side of this coronavirus wilderness.

In many ways, this tragic time has accelerated the movement of the church into profoundly adaptive changes and challenges. And we need to address these challenges in order to be vital communities of witness to Jesus in the 21st century.

There are new opportunities and possibilities before us, including recommitting to a missional model of listening, discerning, experimenting, reflecting, and learning. And, all the while, to keep asking the questions: where is God in our neighborhood? Our community? Our world? And equally importantly: how might we join God in God's mission?

## Dear Church, I continue to wonder, to reflect, to pray:

- What is God calling us to be and do in the time ahead? What is God's purpose for us – what is God's mission through us – moving forward?
- What have we learned during the last few months about what is most important in our life together as the body of Christ? And how can we use that knowledge to shape how we will live, work, and serve together? What might we bring into the future from this experience?

- What new skills have we picked up? What other skills and gifts will we need to embrace a new future?
- How might our theological, denominational, and biblical perspectives and traditions inform how we move forward?
- What were the things that seemed so important before the coronavirus crisis that we might give less attention to, or let go of altogether?

#### Dear Church, I wonder, reflect, pray:

Our life together as the body of Christ, in service to our neighbours and all of creation, is going to be very different moving forward. Be humble and gentle with one another. Honor each other. Make space for lament. Welcome moments of joy. Help each other live into hope. Learn from this journey through the coronavirus wilderness and let the learning lead you forward. Trust that God is at work in this time and look for the new things God is doing even now.

Thank you for your witness to patient trust in God and to sacrificial, cruciform love for your neighbours. And know that God is with you and even now is planning and nourishing seeds of resurrection life.

Who is the young person in Colombia, South America, who, wanting to attend a Lutheran school there, will not have to wait this year because Messiah Lutheran Church in Camrose voted (on June 14) to provide \$1,200 for his or her support to attend that school? Praise the Lord!

## Plans for Resuming In-Person Worship

Bishop Larry Kochendorfer has recommended that we not gather for in-person worship at the present time but he has encouraged congregations to intentionally prepare and plan for in-person worship so that is what your Worship Committee has been doing!

The Worship Committee's recommendation was approved by Church Council on June 23<sup>rd</sup> with the added condition that the daily reporting of new cases be static or decreasing. The recommendation was as follows:

- (a) in-person worship resume on September 13, 2020
- (b) the guidelines outlined by the Alberta Government on June 9<sup>th</sup> and those of the Synod of Alberta and The Territories on June 12<sup>th</sup> be implemented,
- (c) any updates posted by the government and/or the Synod be followed

## Details will be published in the September Messenger.

In this, the last "Messenger" until August 28, the **Alpha** organizing group wants to bring you up to date on the planning so far.



## **Sunday School Update**

Not much has changed from last month in regards to Sunday School.

The teachers and organizers will meet in August (date and time to be announced) to plan for the fall. We will need to not only do our usual type of planning of schedules, registration, and class ages, but also make decisions and plans on how to function safely in this time of Covid-19. A third, much more pleasant, set of decisions to make will be deciding how to spend the generous \$500 gift from the MLW. We have several good ideas on how to use this money to help and enhance our Sunday School. Thank you, MLW!

We would love to add another teacher or two to our Sunday School. We usually have difficulty filling all the teaching spots especially February to May due to life commitments of our current teachers. You don't have to teach often if your desire or schedule does not allow it. You don't have to spend hours planning, unless you want to, because the curriculum that is available for you as a resource is laid out in a helpful and thorough way. If you are more comfortable with one age group than another, you can specify which age group you are willing to help with. If you don't wish to teach on your own, perhaps you have a friend who you would be willing to co-teach with? Or, if you are okay teaching a class on your own, but want some help just initially, we can arrange that. Class sizes have generally ranged from 4 to 10 children - although we may have to limit class size differently depending on the pandemic recommendations.



During this time of not meeting in person for Sunday School, we have some online resources our families can use at home. Thank you to Pastor Bev for her Connecting in the Word children's messages with Andy on the Messiah Camrose YouTube channel or website messiahcamrose.ca. There are also weekly Activity Pages on the website under the Worship Tab. We also emailed out a link to our Sunday School families to the publisher from whom we get our Whirl curriculum - Augsburg Fortress. Their website has had videos of Family Sunday School.

## **Council Highlights for June 2020**

President Charlene Brown welcomed the Council for 2020-21 year. New to Council this year are Vice President David Dahle, and Member-at-Large Lael Olson.

Members-at-large and their liaison roles are Carolyn Andersen (Witnessing), Chris Hohm (Service), Dave Larson (Support), Donny Loewen (Learning), Lael Olson (Worship).

Although the course of Covid-19 remains unknown, we are making tentative plans to resume in-person worship on Sept. 13, 2020, following the guidelines of the AB government and the Synod of Alberta and the Territories (as of June 12) plus any updates posted by them. We will also require that the daily reporting of new cases be static or decreasing.

There have been several inquiries about renting some of our space. We will seek legal and accounting counsel on this while the Support Committee reviews our rental rates.

At the end of August, Pastor Bev will have completed her three year first call term and according to the Bishop will have to be issued a new letter of call. This will require congregational approval.

On a recommendation from the World Mission Group, we agreed that Messiah would establish a designated account in support of scholarships for Lutheran schools in Colombia.

Council embraced the recommendation from the Worship Committee that the following statement appear on our worship screens at some point during each service: We acknowledge with gratitude and respect that the land on which we gather is Treaty 6 territory and the traditional meeting ground for many Indigenous peoples.

Pastor Calvin commented on the financial report noting that in May we experienced a \$5000 deficit.


## Congregational Prayer Time

#### Did you know?

During this time of everyone needing to "stay home" together...with no "regular" school classes, work happening very differently or not at all, and much washing and "wringing" of hands...things can get a "little tense" in some households. All the kids are home all day and aren't getting along...you can imagine the rest!

I have become aware, through listening to a lot of talk shows on the radio and through the fatigue in voices from some friends when we talk, that ways of coping in a healthy way are needed. How can one help? That was my question. "Do you know about the 'Family Resource Centre'?", a friend asked me. "No, but I will check it out", I answered.

And that was a good and helpful suggestion. What I discovered is: help is available by phone consultations, Zoom, online groups etc. (during Covid-19) to help parents build stronger family relationships in a number of ways like managing stress, conflict, misbehaviour and preventing problems from happening in the first place with the kids. They can also provide a referral or gather information on just about anything else. They are, I have discovered, here to help us help each other.

#### SOMETHING FROM THE SERVICE COMMITTEE...

Last year at this time we had just started talking about the "movement" of "Eating Together"... simply the idea of gathering around the table in someone's home to connect with others over food and conversation... something that could be good for the body and good for the soul. During the fall and winter several people in our congregation started doing just that... "eating together and conversing with others. It was so good to be connecting with each other in that way. The rewards were so worth the effort



But then along came Covid-19 and we were all told to "Stay Home" and not to go out. We understand the intention and reasoning why we are to comply with this regulation – to stop the

spread of Covid-19 and stay safe, but now we can't interact with the people we know or with those we might like to get to know.



We all look forward to the time, hopefully soon, when we can resume Worship Services and activities that join our church community together where we can talk, laugh, and share time with

fellow Christians to the time we can restart the initiative of "Eating Together" again...but what about now...because things are changing or emerging...and we are being told to be sure to keep physical distance from others (2 metres) but to go outside, to get some exercise and to connect with others. We see people walking together, visiting on

benches, sitting in gardens or on decks...honouring their physical distance and often wearing a mask...and they are interacting. Strangers seem to say "hi" more readily, it seems to me. This feels like a time when there is time to notice who my "neighbour" is and to find a way to connect. Jesus, our Lord has given us great examples of interacting with people from all walks of life. He did not only select a few he hung out with; he met with the poorest and marginalized to the elite of society...all were "neighbours".



Summer is a great time to meet outside in a backyard with chairs distanced apart and to share stories and conversation. It's a change from sharing a meal (that's for after Covid-19 again); for the present it is to still find a way for interacting. We all benefit from it.

So here is an idea or suggestion:

Until we can visit together again in closer quarters inside our homes, the Service Committee encourages you to call up someone(s) with an invitation to share some time and company in the great outdoors in the coming weeks.

Are you missing our LunchFests when we would come together to enjoy Soup and Sandwiches once a month?

Well, summer is here and that means zucchini should be here in abundance soon too.

So... in preparation for "future LunchFests" you might like to try out one of or both of the following recipes... Enjoy and share!

## An easy Cream of Zucchini Soup

Prep Time: 5 mins Cook Time: 20 mins Total Time: 25 mins



#### Ingredients

1/2 small onion (quartered)

2 cloves garlic

3 medium zucchini (skin on cut in large chunks)

32 oz reduced sodium chicken broth (or vegetable)

2 tbsp reduced fat sour cream

kosher salt and black pepper to taste

fresh grated parmesan cheese if desired for topping (optional)

#### Instructions

Combine chicken broth, onion, garlic and zucchini in a large pot over medium heat and bring to a boil.

Lower heat, cover, and simmer until tender, about 20 minutes.

Remove from heat and purée with an immersion blender, add the sour cream and purée again until smooth. Taste for salt and pepper and adjust to taste. Serve hot.

#### **Zucchini Patties**

Serve with a bit of tomato sauce or sour cream dabbed on top.

Servings: 4 Yield: 12 patties

#### **Ingredients**

2 cups grated zucchini

2 eggs, beaten

¼ cup chopped onion

½ cup all-purpose flour

½ cup grated Parmesan cheese

½ cup shredded mozzarella cheese

salt to taste

2 tablespoons vegetable oil

#### **Directions**

Instructions Checklist

Step 1

In a medium bowl, combine the zucchini, eggs, onion, flour, Parmesan cheese, mozzarella cheese, and salt. Stir well enough to distribute ingredients evenly.




