

**Church** is made up of the people of God not belonging to individual churches and denominations.


**Church** is the body of Christ... united in our Lord!

# Bishop's Message For Congregations and Lay and Rostered Leaders



Dear Beloved of God -

I've been thinking lately about the conclusion of the liturgical year and the coming New Year in which this article will be read.

The Reign of Christ includes the gospel reading from Matthew

25:31-46. The familiar passage of the sheep and the goats. Both those identified as sheep and those named goats are ... surprised: "When was it that we saw you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison?"

Surprised by their failure to recognize the Son of Man. Surprised that the Son of Man is present in the face of the poor, the imprisoned, and all who are in need. Neither sheep nor goats expected the Son of Man to be present and available in the face of "the least of these." Each imagined that the Son of Man would come in strength, power, might, and glory. Yet Jesus reveals that he comes in weakness, vulnerability, and brokenness.

#### Surprise!

God didn't come to us in Athens or Rome or Washington or Bejing or Moscow, or any other seat of power. Surprise! God came to us in lowly Bethlehem as a vulnerable infant. And God didn't conquer the world through military strength, but through the scandal, shame, and pain of the cross. And even more, the God we know in Jesus welcomed the child, the woman, the orphaned, the sick, the lame, the outsider. To these he showed compassion, grace, mercy, love.

The God we know in Jesus is revealed not in power but in vulnerability, not in might but in brokenness, not in judgement but in mercy. And God continues to come where we least expect God to be...in the plight of the homeless, the poor, the needy, the refugee, the imprisoned.

And, in those who work with great courage and confidence for justice for all. In those who seek reconciliation with First Nations peoples. In those who yearn and work for a place and a space of welcome for all. In those who seek to be bearers of God's grace, mercy and love.

And to us, and to all who are weak and vulnerable, worn and wounded, broken and hopeless. To all of us affected in one way or another by the roller-coaster ride of the pandemic.

In the midst of this time of crisis, this gospel reading draws our attention this New Year to what might be a surprise: that God regularly, even relentlessly, shows up where we least expect God to be. To surprise us, disarm us, overturn our expectations and judgements. God invites us to see and to welcome with open hands and lives God's surprising and unimaginable grace, mercy, and love.

Perhaps this text isn't as much about us - sheep and goats - as it is about God, and about who God is and where God is present. God is not only at the end of time waiting on a royal throne in glory, but right here, right now, in the face of those around us, with us — each of us—in the middle of this pandemic.

It may not be where we expect God to show up, but it is just where we need God to be.

Surprise! Blessed New Year!



# "In Mission with El Salvador" / "En Misión con El Salvador"

Submitted by Rev. Brian Rude, serving on behalf of "The Synod of Alberta and the Territories"

Inspiration and preparation for ministry with our sisters and brothers in El Salvador came via numerous channels. One of the primary ones was friendship with Salvadoran refugees settling in Calgary in the mid-80s, while I was pastor at Emmanuel ELC. They taught me so much about El Salvador, but also much about Calgary, Alberta and Canada. They taught me about our collective response--and lack of response--to refugees arriving and settling in Canada. Through them, my vision for offering ministry in El Salvador became two-fold: accompanying Salvadorans, for their own increased safety during an internal conflict; and learning from them, then passing on my learnings to the ELCIC and beyond.

Well, life has evolved continuously over these past 32 years, but those are still my primary visions, now primarily the latter. We still have much to learn from Salvadorans, most of it positive and productive and faith- and discipleship-inspiring.

My years have involved accompanying, and learning from, numerous marginalized sectors of Salvadoran society: orphaned children and youth (1988-present): persons living with HIV/AIDS (1994-present); prison inmates and personnel (1994-2015, since blocked by government). gangs; campesinxs; the LGBTQ community: youth in marginal neighbourhoods; migrants; deportees: and violently displaced persons. Life for these people is one of daily challenges and risks, oppressive lack of resources and opportunities, recurring crises and calamities. An adult Canadian male with no family living here faces a minimum of what these marginalized folk confront and suffer, but is not totally immune. Critical personal life experiences offer a glimpse, and some reason for empathy, with what folk here endure and so often flee, in life-anddeath flights, especially to the USA.

The latest phase of unanticipated accompaniment has been this 2020 year of the COVID-19 pandemic, and the diversity of challenges we battle through it. Besides those faced globally, El Salvador is having to overcome numerous destructive storms in 2020, including four hurricanes, with heavy rains, causing much flooding, many landslides, some loss of life, and many homes destroyed, provoking evacuations and mass sheltering in public schools. Much of the population has also suffered the official and non-official responses to the pandemic,

so often not health-related, but rather politicized, militarized and gang-controlled, including forced, prison-like, prolonged, risky, confinement; violence, including threats, assaults and robbery.

Living amongst these people, God's people, who have learned to survive by struggling, together, in the bleak, black shadows of so many murders, massacres, and martyrdoms, one learns from and is inspired by their basic faith, that God is with them and never abandons them—"Emmanuel"..as they strive and thrive together in solidarity as God's children, God's family.
