Minister's Message



GRACE TO YOU AND PEACE FROM GOD OUR FATHER AND THE LORD JESUS CHRIST

Romans, 1&2 Corinthians, Galatians, Ephesians, Philippians, 2 Thessalonians, 1&2 Timothy, Titus, Philemon...

It has been two months since I last composed an article for the Messiah Messenger; two months since I've had the privilege of

sharing God's Word with you as a leader in worship; two months since I abruptly took time to care for my mental health. I will need to continue to be aware of what is happening with me mentally, and it will not be until March when I have the opportunity to share God's Word with you in worship, but I get to address you in this way now.

So, I started with a quote from Paul who, early on in most of his letters, says: "Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ". We are in such need of grace and peace in our lives and it seems especially in *these times*. But I wonder if we often dismiss these words as the writer's simple intent for something "nice" for us. Yes, Paul intends something "nice" for those to whom he is writing, but I think he is saying more.

"Grace to you" Paul says to his dearly beloved siblings in Christ. Our word "grace" is used for many different purposes (much like "love" is...) such as: elegance, courtesy, allowance of time (grace period), a prayer before a meal, an address (his Grace, the Duke of...), or as a *Christian* word indicating a free and undeserved favor of God. But for Paul and the Greek word he used there is also a range of meaning to be aware of. The word Paul uses is also used to indicate: charm, beauty and gracefulness; or a beneficial opportunity; or a courtesy – just like our word. In addition, the word that Paul uses can indicate a free gift or favor, especially from God. And, another closely related word to the word for "grace" in Greek has to do with "being glad or full of joy".

Paul continues with "and peace", to be imparted to his audience. It seems to me that we normally think of peace as the absence of something – like no noise, or no arguing, or no war. This is likely a part of what Paul desires to impart to his friends. But the peace that Paul is passing along to his friends is more than the absence of something. I think Paul also desires that his siblings receive something tangible: tranquility, agreement, unity. I'm sure that Paul had a good understanding of the Hebrew word often translated as peace which includes harmony, wholeness, completeness, and welfare in its range of meaning. This was also likely part of what he and his hearers understood of the gift of "peace".

So hear again: **Grace** (joy, beauty, charm, opportunity, courtesy, free gift/favor, joyfulness) **to you, and peace** (tranquility, agreement, unity, harmony, wholeness, completeness, welfare) **from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ**. We need it. I need it.

I was in a dark place in December. Depression is an insidious place to be. In part, my mind was broken and needed (still needs) repair – much like a broken arm or hip needs repair - and I needed (and still need) help to continue repairs. As I felt depression there was little room for joy or seeing beauty or opportunity or any idea that I should receive any free gift or favor. In depression I felt anxiety, conflict, disunity, incomplete, and incompetent – so you can see my need for the peace that can only come from God in Christ Jesus. I've known this all along as what is offered by God, but I was having trouble "knowing" these feelings in my being. Certainly, I have not done enough to merit God's grace and peace – but that's not the point. These things come from God, not because I deserve them, but because God gives them. Grace and peace comes from God in part through people, in part through medication developed by wisdom from God and in part reminders of what I know of God's love and light.

If you are in a place of darkness – whether it be depression or any other adversity – God cares. There are people and opportunities that can provide light to dispel the darkness, even just a little bit at a time.

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

Bishop's Message For Congregations and Lay and Rostered Leaders

Dear Beloved of God -

Recently the Annual Study Conference concluded. During the Conference, as is our Synod's long practice, I shared a Bishop's Time with those gathered...this year via ZOOM.

It's nearly been one year....COVID-19. It is incredible to note that a year has come and gone. Together we continue to seek to listen, discern and explore how we might support, encourage, and innovate for mission and ministry in a constantly changing context.

There are new opportunities and possibilities before us, including recommitting to a missional model of listening, discerning, experimenting, reflecting, and learning. And, all the while, asking the questions: where is God in our neighborhood? Our community? Our world? And equally importantly: how might we join God in God's mission?

In this liminal time, we are seeking to wonder, reflect, pray, discern, imagining what wants to emerge, to be birthed:

What have we learned about what is most important in our life together as the body of Christ? And how can we use that knowledge to shape how we will live, work, and serve together? What might we bring into the future from this experience?

What new skills have we picked up? What other skills and gifts will we need to embrace a new future?

What relationships/collaborations/partnerships will we need to initiate or strengthen in the months ahead?

What were the things that seemed so important before the coronavirus crisis that we might give less attention to, or let go of altogether?

What is/are our greatest asset(s) now?

I believe...and what I am hearing across our Synod...is that we are discovering that we have the capacity to be more creative and flexible than we had imagined.

practice, I shared a Bishop's Time with those gathered...this year via ZOOM. we are discovering that we have the desire and willingness to work cooperatively, with innovation, and are learning together from our experiments, including our missteps.

I continue to be moved, impressed, and filled with gratitude during this coronavirus wilderness for rostered and lay leaders, congregations, specialized ministries, and our strengthening relationship across the synod and church. For pastoral support, connection, compassion and care offered. For creativity, ingenuity, openness, support, encouragement and trust-building.

Opportunities for imagining, experimenting, risk-taking, innovating, and learning abound in this time even in the midst of yes, anxiety and disorientation.

May our Lenten journey be one of deeper reflection, attentive listening and wise discernment as we seek to be the Beloved of God.







Council Highlights for February 2021

Lael's devotion to start off the meeting carried an important message for all of us. In it she reflected on the time in the wilderness following the exodus from Egypt when the people wandered in the wilderness frustrated and seeking their identity until they came to understand their reliance on God. These days we too may feel frustrated and like we are wandering in wilderness and uncertainty, but she reminded us to remember and to trust that God is always with us.

Until further notice, we will continue to gather, worship, and study through the gifts of technology. The Support Committee is continuing to work through the problems with our broadcast system.

It is time to start planning for the Synod and National Church conventions! The Synod convention will take place on one day, July 17, 2021, over Zoom. The theme will be **On the Road**. We are allowed both a youth delegate (aged 16-22) and other delegate(s). More information will be coming; but meanwhile, please consider if this is something you would like to do and let Pastor Calvin know.

The National Convention will take place at SAIT in Calgary in the summer of 2022. Again we are allowed both youth (under 30 years) and other delegates. Watch for precise numbers and think about if this is something that you would like to do. More information will be coming.

Despite Covid-19, it sounds as if we could soon be welcoming refugees here to their new home. Let us hope.

Discussions are underway regarding possibilities for collaboration amongst churches in the area.

The budgeting process for 2021-2022 is getting underway in order to be ready for presentation at the Annual General Meeting on June 6. The AGM will take place over Zoom.

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the Communion of the Holy Spirit be with you.

During this time of continued restrictions in response to public health concerns regarding the ongoing COVID pandemic, we again enter the season of Lent. A time of waiting, pondering, and reflection. We slow down. We refrain. We anticipate resurrection.

Collaborative Partnerships These past eleven months have been trying ones at best. They too have been a time of waiting, pondering, and reflection. We still have a long way to go before our social interactions, at church and in our wider communities, can fully resume as we so dearly desire. I am confident that the Holy Spirit, who has sustained us these difficult months, will uphold and lead us throughout the duration of the pandemic. Thank you for your sacrifice, your persistence, and your loving care for those you are called to serve.

I am deeply grateful to the rostered and lay leaders of our synod for your diligent protection of our communities and congregations in refraining from in-person worship, as I have repeatedly recommended. By utilizing means of worship and congregational life not reliant on inperson gatherings, and by adhering to the guidelines set forth by Alberta Health Services and our Chief Medical Officer of Health, you are acting in love to protect both the members of your congregation and the communities in which they live, study, and work.

Recently, as many of you know, Rev. James Coates of GraceLife Church, Spruce Grove, was arrested after repeated violations of public health directives including refusal to maintain social distancing at worship services, wear masks, and limit the number of attendees as directed in the provincial mandate. On their website, Rev. Coates and his congregation urge churches to disregard public health directives and encourage Albertans to resume social interaction around meals, in defiance of provincial guidelines aimed at preventing the spread of

COVID-19. Protests in support of Rev. Coates and against public health measures took place in Edmonton over the weekend.

I am sorely disappointed, frustrated, and concerned when I hear of those who have chosen to openly defy the good work, advice, and directives of Alberta's public health officials.

As Christians, the call to love others is inseparable from our call to love and serve our God. The protection of our neighbours from COVID-19 is, in itself, an act of worship, in that so doing honours and glorifies God by the offerings of mercy and compassion. Conversely, actions that endanger others are not compatible with either the worship of God or our confession of faith in Christ.

During this pandemic, which imposes restrictions echoing practices common during the season of Lent, let us show mercy and compassion. Let us refrain. Let us anticipate resurrection.

"The God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit" (Romans 15:13).





Devotions for MARCH 2021




We have assembled a devotional booklet with contributions from members of Messiah. It will contain readings based on the Bible texts from the daily lectionary.
