Minister's Message

WE GIVE THANKS



As Thanksgiving approaches we turn our minds to those things we the struggles in life take over and we find it hard to be in a place of giving thanks. It is much easier to think about all the things that are not going right.

The truth is, life is not always easy.

It is important that we remember that we have a choice about where we put our focus. Its just that sometimes that is easier said than done. I find that sometimes I tend to look at all the things that are not going right when there is so much that I have to be thankful for. The Apostle Paul in his letter to the Philippians speaks to us about this. I find this passage to be one of the most helpful to me in scripture.

Philippians 4:8-9 Says this:

May you find the peace in your soul that God would want you to have each day.








The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the Communion of the Holy Spirit be with you.

Yesterday, September 15, Premier Kenney once again declared a state of Public Health Emergency which includes mandatory restrictions.

Beginning immediately, these restrictions include no indoor social gatherings for those who are vaccine-eligible but unvaccinated, and limited gatherings indoors for those who are vaccinated. Outdoor gatherings are restricted in number and physical distancing must be maintained. As of September 20, funerals and weddings also have mandated restrictions, whether held indoors or outdoors, seated or not. No receptions are permitted. Restrictions are available on the alberta.ca website

Spirit -Led Leadership

For worship, restrictions taking effect immediately include a maximum of 1/3 fire code occupancy and masking is mandatory. Physical distancing between households or cohorts must be 2 metres.

Innovative Tradition

With the state of Public Health Emergency in mind, I caution councils and lay and rostered leaders to prayerfully consider all plans for in-person worship and meetings, and, if in-person activities go ahead, to carefully review safety measures to protect the most vulnerable in the congregation and community.

Collaborative Partnerships

This is a time for us again, as a faith community, to show leadership. Our baptism calls us to care for our neighbour; right now, that means, in part, encouraging one another to be vaccinated, limiting how many people we come in contact with, even for worship, and ascertaining that contact is conducted in the safest manner possible.

I encourage you to make use of the many ways that rostered and lay leaders continue to provide worship and devotional materials for those who cannot gather or choose not to gather. Many of these resources have been highlighted in recent editions of Wednesday's Word and continue to be available on the Synod website.

The Synod Office will be closed to the public.

Please pray for those who will find these restrictions difficult, for all who are isolated or lonely, for our congregations, rostered leaders, the vulnerable in our midst, for those suffering from COVID-19, for provincial leaders, and for emergency workers, doctors, nurses, and essential workers who continue to bear the burden of this pandemic.

Beloved of God, as people of faith, continue to be humble and gentle with one another. Honour each other. Make space for lament. Welcome moments of joy. Help each other live into hope. 

Council Highlights

As we learn from Genesis, God makes space for life and creation, for order, and new beginnings. We can hope in this as together we move once again into many changes and unknowns.

In the wake of Pastor Calvin's departure, Council has been reviewing and adjusting the roles and responsibilities of our Council, Committees, and Staff. We have developed a six month interim plan which will give time to reassess and look ahead.

Pastor Bev has taken on the role of Acting Senior Pastor. She will be responsible for Pastoral leadership and the supervision of all staff except Lori Mokry. A supply pastor will be engaged one Sunday per month.

Lori Mokry has taken on the new position of Administrative Coordinator. She will have responsibility and authority for some of the administrative tasks previously assigned to Pastor Calvin and will report to Council through a Council member who will meet regularly with her. This is a new, full-time position; however, Lori will continue to work four days a week with assistance from Shirley. These changes will be re-assessed in six months.

As we all know, we live in a technological age including one in which our broadcast ministry has become increasingly important. In recognition of the time and expertise this requires, there will be a Worship Technologies Task Force of five people formed, responsible to the Support Committee.

Lael Olson has tendered her resignation from Council and liaison to Worship Committee. She was thanked for her service and will be missed. Dena Grue has been confirmed as member-at-large relating to the Worship Committee, completing Lael's term.

There will be a Special Congregational Meeting on Sunday, October 17 at 7 pm on Zoom to deal with proposed changes to our Endowment Funds. The Treasurer will prepare a background document about the proposed changes which will be sent to members in early October. In addition, there will be a report on the state of affairs at Messiah and an opportunity for discussion.

Thank you to all faithful supporters of Messiah. Regular giving is holding close to previous year levels.

In the face of escalating Covid cases, a motion was passed that Messiah adopt the Restrictions Exemption Program for all gatherings, except regular worship services which are covered under other regulations. This will remain in effect until the restrictions are lifted by the Province. This policy is in line with the decisions made by the City and many local businesses.

Effective September 27, the Restrictions Exemption Program will apply to all staff and volunteers engaged in in-person events in the church.

Discussions will continue with Bethesda, New Norway and the Bashaw congregation about ways in which we may collaborate in our ministries.

Truth and Reconciliation

Each Sunday we recognize that we are meeting on Treaty Six territory. On Thursday, Sept. 30, Truth and Reconciliation Day, we invite you to set time aside to consider more deeply what this acknowledgment means and begin learning more about the Indigenous people of this land.

News from the World Mission Scene

September 5, 2021

Greetings from the Watts family in Kigali, Rwanda!!

Hi, just a quick note to let you know we are one week into our new life in Kigali.

We had a great last few weeks in Kibuye,enjoying everything we could, and saying a lot of hard good-byes.

As can be expected in these times, we did have a few hiccups on the way. Before we could even leave Burundi we had 2 false-positive COVID test results which caused our family to be stuck in Bujumbura for a week. We tried to treat it as a family holiday, and we all ended up where we needed to be just in time.



Matea and Micah had to fly directly to Kenya, arriving the day before classes started (having to spend one night in the quarantine dorm since they were exposed to a 'positive' case in our family). Susan, Alma and I arrived in Kigali Sunday afternoon, were out of quarantine on Monday, got a rental car, moved into our temporary house, and Alma started school Tuesday morning.

Plus - Susan and I got VACCINATED! This was a HUGE deal for us. Having spent the majority of the pandemic in a country with zero vaccines, and with supplies to places like East Africa being hampered, we never imagined it would happen for us here.

I start my new role at Karisimbi tomorrow, so we were able to spend the week getting bank accounts, phones, internet, etc sorted out, figuring out grocery shopping and trying to get some familiarity with the city. We are thankful to have a temporary house and car while we're trying to sort out what we'll do long term.

We now have one week under our belts, and are excited for what God has in store for our family here in Kigali.

Well, that's it - just wanted to let you know we did make it - and are starting to settle in.

Prayer Requests:

- For Jonah as he moves into dorms this weekend, and starts classes on Tuesday. Even though this is his second year at King's University in Edmonton last year was all remote/online so it's like he's starting a whole new school (again)
- For Matea & Micah as they readjust to school in Kenya and protection for their school as they struggle to keep kids safe in a country that still has very limited access to vaccines
- For us to have grace for ourselves, each other, and others as we hit the inevitable frustrations of trying to adjust to a new place/country/culture/etc

Thank you SO MUCH for your continued support, concern, and prayers for our family.

Everything we are involved with here in East Africa is an extension of the kindness, generosity and love you have shown.

WE JOINED IN CELEBRATING CLWR'S 75TH ANNIVERSARY ON

CLWR SUNDAY 2021 – SEPTEMBER 26

CLWR was founded on March 14, 1946, to provide food and clothing to occupied zones of Germany and Austria, but as early as 1947 realized that there was a need to facilitate resettling ethnic Germans in Canada. CLWR joined with other faith-based agencies which by 1961 had brought 41,000 refugees to Canada. Over 33,000 came on the steamship, MS Beaverbrae, which Canada had received as war compensation.

Through the years, much of CLWR's work has still been directed towards helping refugees, bringing many to Canada or helping to provide necessities of life wherever people have been forced to flee.

Much support has also been directed towards areas affected by natural disasters. The most recent one is the earthquake in Haiti which caused great loss of life and destruction.
