Minister's Message

Where Do We Go from Here?



We are moving into a new time. Things around us are opening up. People are coming out from under their rocks of safety and slowly we are meeting again.

We have stayed connected because that is the work of the Spirit. Now we are meeting more openly than

we were during the pandemic.

We are starting to have coffee together again in our churches and our communities and beginning to have some meetings in person rather than on Zoom. Communion will be served in lodges more often. We are able to connect more in person in our homes.

As we conclude the formal part of our discernment here at Messiah, we ask ourselves, where do we go from here? (Many are asking this same question.) And maybe the more important question is, "Where is God calling us to go from here?" What or who is God calling us to be? What an important question in times of transition. As we do this we look to God for wisdom and guidance.

In Isaiah we hear, "I am doing a new thing - it springs forth!" Our first instinct is to look at the reality of our situation... which usually brings us often to money. Can we actually afford to do "the new thing"?

But sometimes God calls us to step out in faith or to be creative and think of new ways to follows God's leading.

Abraham was called out into a land unknown. He had no clue where it would take him. He was even given promises that made no sense. How could a man who was without children have many descendants? In Genesis 12:1 we hear this "The Lord said to Abram, Go from your country, your people and your father's household to the land I will show you." Abram and Sarah trusted God and stepped out into places they had no knowledge of. Can you imagine this? We have done this a few times in our lives and I think most of you have also. But it does take some trust in the one who will walk with you on that journey.

Listening to where God is leading us as his people does not always make sense in our real world. Often it doesn't. We are often called to simply trust. We would rather put all our ducks in a row, circle our wagons so to speak and then we will trust God to lead. But truly we are called to ask God freely, "What now? Where do we go from here? What are you calling us to?" Then the question is this, "How will we do this?"

On a more personal level, we are called to do this in our individual lives and daily as we walk with the Lord. Where do I go? Where are you calling me? What "new thing" do you want me to step into Lord?

Our God commands us to be the loving hands and heart of God in this world. This is always our calling. But how we live this out each day is a question we need to ask the Lord every day. Show me how to love and how to live.

Perhaps the question is this? "How would you have me be your love in this world? Where are you calling me this moment, this next year and into the future?"

Let us each be open in our personal lives and in our churches to where God wants to lead us. What will be my response to God's call? What will be yours?

In Isaiah 6:8 we hear these words, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us? Then said I, "Here am I; send me."

May this be our response as God calls us into new places to serve and new ways to be.

Stepping out together... let us trust our God.

Dear Beloved of God -

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

Two years ago, almost to the day, I was preparing an article for the Canada Lutheran to be released in June of 2020.

So much was uncertain. The future was unknown. A future that was changing not month by month, nor week by week, but minute by minute, with the certainty that nothing would be the same again. "The church and world," I wrote, "would be very different for all on the other side of this wilderness."

During the ancient wilderness wanderings of our Hebrew forebears in faith, God did extraordinary things to lead and feed God's people. Water from a rock. Pillars of cloud and fire. Manna rising from the ground. Quail falling from the sky. In the wilderness, severed from the moorings that had held their lives, the people of God received extraordinary, unexpected, unanticipated, previously unimagined grace to keep them focused on God, God's presence, God's provision, God's promise, even though they, like us, often turned their attention elsewhere in their anxiety or fear.

God is present as God has promised. Of this I am assured, dear Church.

God's presence, God's provision, and God's promise have been demonstrated in countless ways over these past two years. Imaginative creativity, thoughtful ingenuity, collaboration, re-connection, care for neighbor, and through simple, and yet radical...love – love, as Jesus taught and embodied it.

The New Testament makes it abundantly clear that Jesus was about love first and foremost, in word and in deed. Jesus begins with love for God, but inseparably linked that love with love for neighbor, which includes the other – the outsider, the outcast, the last, the least, the lost, the disgraced, the enemy. Dear Church, who are we becoming? We journey knowing God's presence, God's provision, God's promise. And our journey will deepen through love, in word and in deed, taught and embodied by Jesus.

Dear Church, we have learned a lot about what it means to be the Church these past two years. Learning, as we have journeyed, about the essential value of community, of how we need one another, and how we thrive when we feel we are connected.

Dear Church, I am continuing to wonder, reflect, pray.

Dear Church, I wonder, reflect, pray: rooted in God's mission, are we being called, driven to be a church, identified more as a movement than an institution? Drawn together not only by doctrine or liturgy, but by unity of way of life, mission, practices, and vision for the common good? A re-formation?

Dear Church, I wonder, reflect, pray: rooted in God's mission, are we being called into a more significant radical collaboration with others, working across and outside of denominational and inter-faith lines, to seek the common good? Trans-institutional?

Dear Church, I wonder, reflect, pray: rooted in God's mission, are we being called into deeper, and fuller love for the sake of the world? Love, in word and in deed of the neighbor that includes the other in ways never before fully lived out by us, by me?

Dear Church, I pray that we will be given eyes to see and ears to hear the Spirit of God at work. Guiding, encouraging, pushing, inviting into a future yet to be realized, all-the-while knowing that, "the Lord of hosts is with us" (Psalm 46).

Meet Our Recent Refugee Arrivals

This is a message from Yeamlak on behalf of her father and family:

My name is Fikiru Assefa. I am fifty-one. I have a very happy and big family. One is me, my wife, and my two daughters. my wife's name is Hellen she is the house manager and my first daughter is yeamlak she is twenty years old also my second daughter is Eden .she is 16 years so we are Ethiopia in 2017 and when I was in Ethiopia I were the driver I was working hard to make my life better so I drive so many years that mean up to I left Ethiopia I like my work and in my part-time, I meet with my friends my brothers gets some fun.

Let's talk about my wife's most of the day she spends her hours in-home doing home matters she plays the best version of the house she is so responsible person also take care of my girls besides home matter she likes talking get some coffee and also most of her time she spends in church.

My girls spend most of their time in school after then they do like sports, volunteering, playing games with our neighbors and so many fun things.

I left my country with some political issues in 2017 I decided to go to Kenya and stay there after I leave Kenya there was some struggle as a refugee and in 2019 my wife and my children come to Kenya to stay with me so finally, we become together as a family and then we stay in Kenya for some years. Kenya's life is a little bit difficult but it's all gone after march 16,2022 we come to Canada



Mengestab's Story My name is Mengestab Tesfameskel Gebremariam. I was born in Eritrea in 1986. When I was about 3 or 4 years old my mother died. I can't remember what happened when my mother died and I didn't understand it. But my father didn't delay, married a second wife, because my mother died leaving him five children with me six. So it was very hard for him to raise us without the help of a woman. Now we are lucky because the woman he married the second is very kind and loving and she raised us in love just like a mother. Then I started school when I was seven years old. From first grade to fifth grade I attended a school near our hometown. Then I went to a school in a town about 12 km from my home to continue learning. Because there is no high school where my family living village. I attended at this school from sixth grade to tenth grade. One year I learned that I had traveled from school to my home. I traveled more than two hours everyday and I learned for two years in a small tent. It was like a house and also for about a year I learned that I had gone to my home some time and I had spent the night with my friends some time. I couldn't continue like this, so I guit my school and I went to work in a big city. One year I worked and asked to return to school, but the school superintendent told me that you were not allowed. Later they tried many times to take me to the soldier but I was hiding. I lived with my family and I was helping to my father at work with farm for two years. But still the police and soldiers were looking me to took to soldier. In September 2008 I left my family and my country. I moved Ethiopia. I lived in Ethiopia for one year but when I was living in Ethiopia I was thinking about my family everyday. After one year I decided to leave Ethiopia to go Sudan. I went Sudan from Ethiopia October 2009. From Ethiopia to Sudan I walked on foot with three my friends. From Ethiopia to Sudan we spent 8 days in the crossing. We spent 8 days on the walk from Ethiopia to Sudan. We had five days of food but three days we arrived without food in Sudan. From Sudan to Egypt, we spent 9 days in the desert, and again we were 17 persons on the little track. We spent the night crossing from the border of Egypt to Israel. We took our shoes off and held them in our hands without being listened to by Egyptian soldiers. But when they heard us crossing the line, they shot us a lot, but no one hit us. October 29 2009 we entered Israel. I am so lucky to have been through all this trouble and getting into Israel because so many friends and people I know are lost and dead in all the ways. I have been in Israel for 12 years. I have been working in my own business for 9 years and for two years I have been working as a cleaner in a school. In my own business I have been working at internet Cafe for seven years and then I opened another business like a pool table and I worked there for a year. Finally, I opened a restaurant before coming to Canada and I worked there for about a year. All there years in Israel however, I have helped my family with almost all my money. Because I have many brothers and sister and my family is very poor, and then it was a great chance for my family to be in Israel and also when I was in Israel on weekends or on break time, I also spent time with my friends and my Community group on art works. I have made a lot of poems and a few Comedies. Last November 7, I came to Canada and now I am living in Camrose, a Canadian City. Thanks God.

URGENT APPEAL FROM THE CAMROSE REFUGEE CENTRE

Recently the Camrose Refugee Centre has received requests from two former residents of The Ukraine, now residing in Camrose, for assistance in getting four families settled in Camrose. The Camrose Refugee Centre Board met last week with some community organizations and representatives of five different churches to discuss how we might engage the Camrose community in supporting the four Ukrainian refugee families that are expected to arrive in Camrose over the next few weeks. The group set the ambitious target of raising \$20,000 within the next three weeks to help the families with airfares and other short-term needs. Another goal is to be able to provide furniture and household goods to the families as they arrive. Between what the Refugee Centre has in storage and what has already been collected by Century Meadows, we believe we have the basics for the first family that arrives which we are told will be in two to three weeks. Following is a letter from Olena, one of the individuals who reached out to us, with her request for help:

My name is Olena and I urgently need your help to provide life-saving protection and financial support to my Parents Dina and Serhii, my Brother Vitalii and his 2 children Emiliia and Volodymyr and Wife Olena along with my Best Friend's Family Alexandra and Hennadii and her 17 month old son Volodymyr that were forced to flee their homes in Ukraine due to the ongoing crisis.

Your support can help ensure that these 3 Families that were forced to flee their homes and leave everything behind are sheltered and safe.

I am Olena, I myself moved to Canada 9 years ago for a better future and life for myself, I call Camrose home. We are a young Family of three with a young toddler ourselves, we are an average income household and currently unable to financially support our Family and 3 other Families on top. I am asking for my Community to come together and help with the hard financial assistance that is required for my Family and Friend to come to Camrose, Alberta Canada to reunite and start their new lives with us.

The expected but not all foreseen expenses for them are listed below:



- Accommodation in Europe while awaiting their visa application and work permit approval.
- Plane tickets to get to Canada.
- Clothing for the children and possibly parents etc (most only have 1 suitcase full of personal belongings)
- 2-3 months rental fees per Family in Camrose until they have settled and found employment.
- Basic furnishing necessities for their rental units.
- Groceries and personal necessities until they are able to provide for themselves through employment.
- Transportation to get to and from places and employment.

These families are an average Ukrainian Families. They are hard-working and honest people. All of them are going to find employment once they have arrived in Camrose and will benefit the Camrose community. They will have work permits in place.

The current situation is quickly becoming Europe's largest refugee crisis this century. Every Dollar counts, and if you cannot donate, then please pray and share.

Treasurer's Report

March 2022

It was encouraging to see offerings increase in February after the decrease in January. But costs also increased and there was a deficit of about \$2,000 for the month. At this stage we have a deficit for the year of about \$20,000. The annual meeting last spring approved a budget with a deficit \$45,738 with an understanding that changes would need to be made. We have been making progress toward a balance by the end of our budget year at the end of April, but it looks like there will still be some shortfall for the year. The special Easter festival offering will make a difference in April.

Work is underway on preparing a draft budget for the new year beginning in May. Please pray for church council as we plan for the next year of our ministry at Messiah.






