Easter is Every Day!



In our Easter story, the day between Good Friday and Easter Monday is what I call an "in between day." It is a really important part of the Easter story. The followers of Jesus had just watched him die

and did not know the end of the story and so they were hiding away and hoping no one would find them. They were afraid. They were grieving, and they did not know where to turn. Their world had been turned up-side-down with not much hope of things being righted. All their hopes were dashed and their dreams were squashed. And now they did not even feel safe. They did not know really how to be. They were not sure how the future would look and were not sure how things would unfold. It was an uneasy time. It was a time of "not knowing". Does this sound familiar?

I think so much of our lives are "in between" moments... and sometimes these times can seem to go on and on without an end. The waiting can feel unbearable.

Sometimes it can feel like "nothing" is happening while without our knowing it, new life is taking place. The "in between" days remind me of the growth of a small seed underground. We plant the seed in the ground and for a very long time we wait for signs of new life. This can take many weeks. And while we wait it is hard to believe anything will grow out of the earth. Then suddenly without notice a little sprig of green pops up. At first its

just a small sign of life... and after more time of waiting a beautiful flower appears.

I bet for the disciples that day in between Good Friday and Easter morning felt like an eternity also. They did not even have hope that things might improve for them.

The tomb was a grave that their Lord had been put into and that meant all was lost. Little did they know... just how God was going to spring up out of that grave and come to life. The symbol of this was the Easter tulips we placed on our cross on Easter morning.

We are in a time of being "in between" also in the world right now. Things seem to be falling apart all around us. The gas prices are sky rocketing. Wars are breaking out and we can only just watch and wait and hope that it stops and hope for peace. The land and creation is suffering and dying. Churches are limping along and some are closing because of this pandemic the past couple of years. Life has really changed. The world as we know it is in such an "in between" place. Everywhere there are shifts and changes. The earth looks pretty bleak and black, much like a grave.

This is the place where things can feel stuck; where we have no more moves. It is a place of waiting and wondering. Being "in between" is not a terribly comfortable place to be... and yet there can be some peace in those moments if we are open to letting God be there with us. It's ok to just be there. There is something freeing about allowing ourselves to be in the moments of being in between because even there our God accompanies us.

None of us know how our story will end on this earth... but we do know one thing... our God is with us... no matter where we are. And we can know that new life will spring up out of that dark place because our God is here and with us and is the bringer of new life. We also know that our story will find its way into the next part of the story. As someone said to me not long ago... "We do know that we will be with our Risen Lord at the end of our story." The thing that is most important about this time is that our God is not dead! Our God is alive and well and with us.

As we pass through these times of waiting and being in between... God is here. In Psalm 27:14 we hear, "Wait for the Lord; be strong and take heart and let your heart take courage; wait for the Lord."

And in Isaiah 40: 31 we hear these words, "but those who hope (wait) in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint."

"In Between" moments are moments of waiting and hoping. We often try so hard to wiggle out of these times and moments because its super uncomfortable to be "in between" but we can actually be at peace in those moments if we remember the ONE who waits with us; the ONE who is ever and always with us... and who loves us at all times no matter where in life we find ourselves... And as we remember that we are free and forgiven and loved.

The Good news of Easter is not just for Easter morning moments. It is for the ordinary moments of our lives because Easter is every day; in the moments of death and of new life and all those "in between". The disciples of Jesus had no clue how to be in that day in between Good Friday and Easter Sunday. What they did

not know (which we often forget) is that God had not left them there at all. God was with them in that time every bit as much as God was with them on that Easter morn.

Are you in an in between time? Are you waiting for something to change ? for someone? Well you are in good company because our whole world is there right now and God remains with you and with me and with this aching world and our churches as we wait and hope for the hope of Easter to spring forth on this earth.

Meanwhile, Easter has already come through our LIVING LORD who is ever and always with us for Easter is for all the ordinary moments of our lives!

**Christ has Risen! He has Risen
Indeed! Hallelujah !!**

Dear Beloved of God –

We meet the disciples huddled together. The doors are shut and locked. They can hardly breathe in that airless tomb. Their hearts are racing. Their minds spinning.

It was evening on that first day, the first day of the week. They had heard from Mary Magdalene that she had seen Jesus alive, that he had called her

by name and turned her toward the new dawn of the empty tomb.

It was the death of Jesus that brought them together that evening, but it was not simply the death of Jesus that drew the disciples together – it was his resurrection. It was Mary Magdalene's witness: "I have seen the Lord."

And the doors were shut and locked. They could hardly breathe. They were afraid of everything on the other side of those doors: afraid of the forces that killed Jesus. Afraid, perhaps, of living. They were winded by fear. What now? Yes, what now?

It isn't hard for us, to imagine ourselves in that room. No, not after two plus years of pandemic. And not when we know for ourselves, and for others, of war and trauma and anxiety and fear and constant change and uncertainty and grief and losses of many kinds. And we are ourselves hardly breathing in our airless tombs. Our hearts racing. Our minds spinning.

All of which points me in the direction of the disciple, Thomas.

I know that we tend to think of Thomas in terms of his doubting, but what if that doubt were part of a larger insistence on dealing with reality, on getting things back to normal, on moving forward now that the worst has happened?

Why isn't Thomas in the house when Jesus makes his first appearance? I wonder if unlike the other disciples, who are behind shut and locked doors, Thomas has already accepted what has happened, has moved on, and is now out and about rebuilding his life from the fractured pieces that were left to him after the horrific events of Good Friday – or at least was attempting to, attempting to put things back in order and get back to normal.

It would explain why it's so hard for Thomas to accept the witness of his friends: "We have seen the Lord." The joyful confession of the other disciples may have seemed like oh-so-much wishful thinking to this hardboiled realist. Which is why, when one-week later Jesus came and stood among them, I wonder if the noticeable change in

Thomas's tune is less about simply coming to faith – to belief – and more about realizing that, after the resurrection, reality itself had changed and there would be no normal to go back to.

For how do you even talk about "normal" when someone has been raised from the dead? What can possibly be the same? Your work, your sense of meaning, your relationships, your purpose, your view of past, present, and future – all of it is changed irrevocably by God's act of resurrection.

When Thomas confesses, "My Lord and my God," he is abandoning all his conceptions of "normal" and opening himself to a very different reality than he could have previously ever imagined. And here is the promise for us. Here is the promise – the good news for us – today and each tomorrow: Jesus comes to us.

Jesus comes to us...yes in this time of pandemic, yes into our communities and our fearful hearts, into the airless tombs in which we dwell, behind the shut and locked doors.

Here is the promise – the good news: Jesus comes to us, bearing the marks of suffering and death, revealing that the body of Christ, though risen, is always wounded.

Here is the promise: Jesus comes to us, speaking a word of peace and revealing the startling truth for our present and future, that what is true of Jesus will be true for those who bear Christ's name.

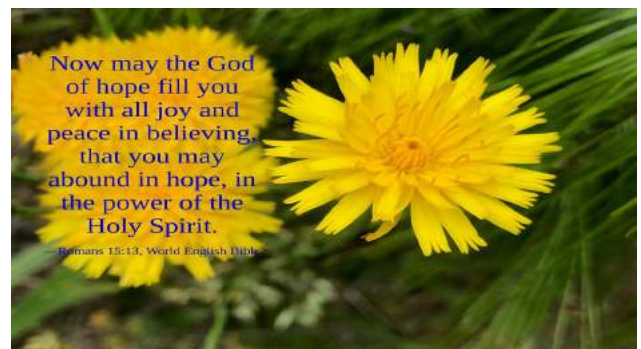
Here is the good news: Jesus comes to us, with a word of forgiveness, with grace that unbinds the clenched heart, with love that loosens the power of death, with mercy that unbars the doors we shut and swings them wide open.

Jesus comes among us...and is with us amid necessary changes and faithful adaptations, calling us forward, blessing us to believe though we do not see, and promising to be with us.

Alleluia! Christ is risen. Christ is risen, indeed. Alleluia!

DISCERNMENT PROCESS SUMMARY:

PREAMBLE

Purpose:

Every church and organization has been fundamentally impacted by the Covid-19 Pandemic. As a result, Messiah is contemplating and refining its focus during this time of transition. We ask God where the Spirit is leading us as a church to focus our ministry. We step aside and ask for new eyes to open to God's guidance for our community. From the themes brought forward from this discernment process, we can now choose our direction and next steps as a church and a faith community.

Process:

Over several months, our discernment process evolved. Initially, a discernment planning group of 7 people was formed. This group discerned what types of questions would best lead our prayers and thoughts as the church entered the process. Pastor Bev reflected with Spiritual Direction Colleagues as the process evolved.

The questions that were discerned, follow:

HOW DO WE HELP ONE ANOTHER TO GROW IN OUR RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD/JESUS?

WHAT DO WE APPRECIATE AND CELEBRATE ABOUT BEING HERE AT MESSIAH - WHAT IS SPECIAL AND UNIQUE?

WHAT DRAWS YOU AND OTHERS TO THIS FAITH COMMUNITY?

HOW CAN WE BEST LIVE OUT OUR FAITH FROM THIS TIME GOING FORWARD?

The selected guiding scriptures, follow:

Jeremiah 17:7-8

Psalms 1:3

Ephesians 3: 17-19

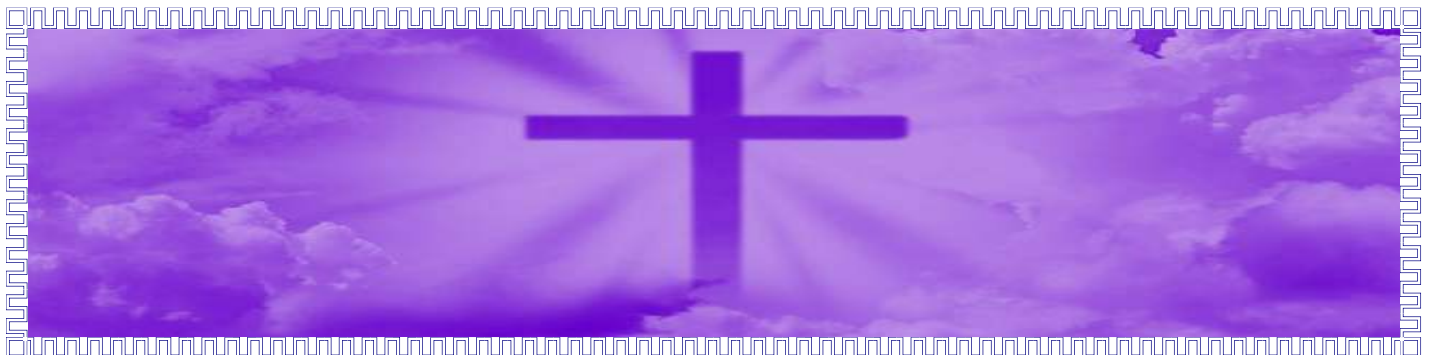
John 15:5

Isaiah 40:31

Psalms 46:10

Micah 6:8

Groups were identified to explore where God might be leading us. Together we resolved to think outside the box and consider the gift the pandemic has brought us. The gift of opening to the new ways that God desires our church to show up in this world as a faith community.



The groups that were gathered to contribute, follow:

The staff

The committees

The council

The senior youth girls (met with their leaders)

The boys youth group (met with their leaders)

The men's bible study

Two groups that were offered on line for all to join

Individuals who discerned on their own

Each group met for 1.5 to 2 hours. We listened to God through prayer, hearing scripture, silence, and dialoguing as we discerned the questions. It was good to see the connections strengthening between one another. Pastoral connections also evolved from this time together. As the Holy Spirit spoke to our deep hearts, careful notes were taken. The compilation of these notes gave rise to the following theme:

"MAKING CONNECTIONS AND BUILDING RELATIONSHIPS THROUGH OUR FAITH COMMUNITY IN-PERSON AND ON-LINE"

This theme from our discernment process, leads us to connect with God and others, through our faith community in the following ways:

- through small groups (some to be formed and others already connecting)
- through fellowship opportunities that allow for social connection (a chance to meet together and build relationships)
- through sharing our faith together in: Bible studies, Lectio, sharing of faith stories, prayer for and with each other, Sunday School, Youth groups, Worship, music, etc.
- through joining together in service, and in outreach beyond the walls of our church
- through connecting on-line in our Worship Ministry, Connecting in the Word and our Zoom groups (it is felt we need to look at expanding our on-line and social media ministry)
- through being an established presence on the streets of our Camrose community and using our building (and its location) in more effective ways to reach out into the community
- through helping people feel a sense of belonging and purpose in our Faith community
- through collaboration with other churches and communities

This document is a compilation of many pages of notes that arose from our discernment times together and individual responses from people.

Additionally, there are many unique ideas collected through this process that will be brought forward and reviewed as we seek to grow as a faith community.

Hello Messiah family,

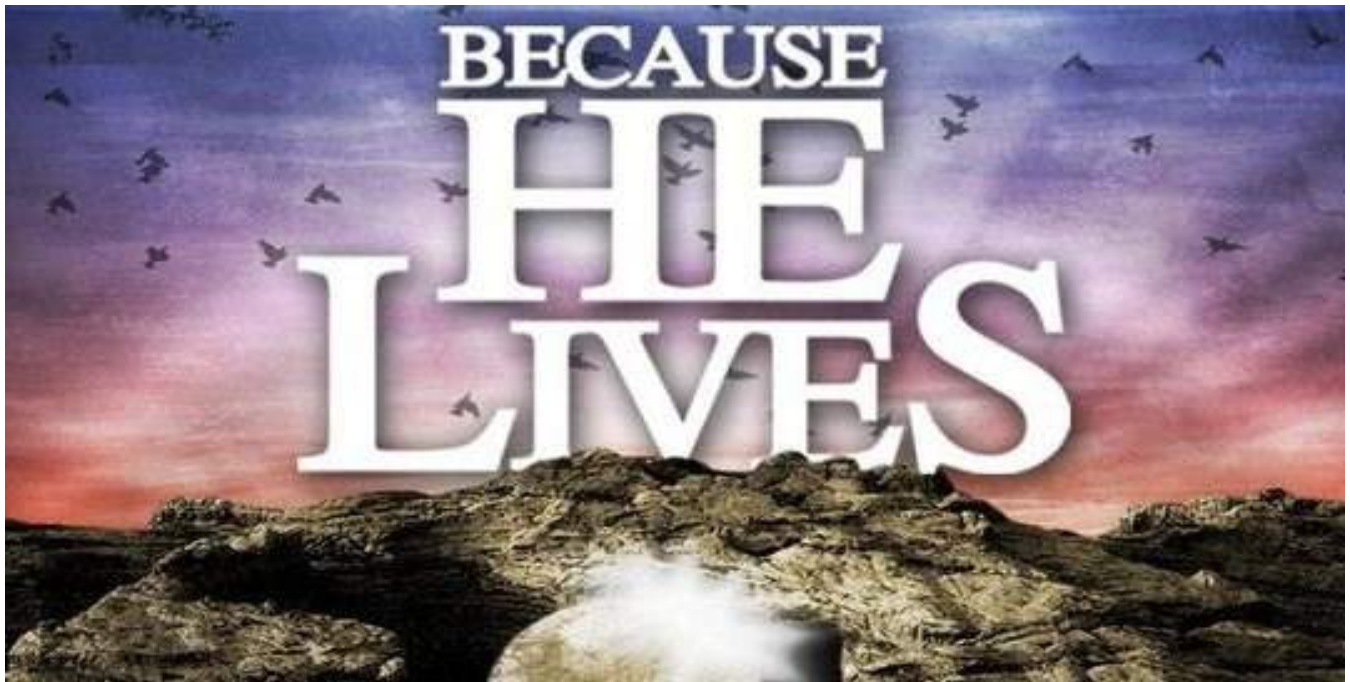
Please be advised that an email scam is circulating from Pastor Bev's email address asking for money in the form of gift cards.

We are still collecting used stamps and would appreciate your donations.



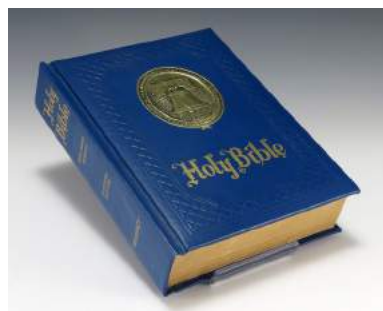
