Minister's Message

Come Away With Me

I am sitting on my front step as I write this today. The sun is warming my face... and I am grateful for this time of year. The flowers are blooming and the birds are singing many songs in our trees. We wake to them in the morning. The evening sky has been majestic and full of color.



We have just had some rains and so the grass and the trees are lush and green. So much so that I am realizing I need to get out my mower again. It sure is not long between the times of needing to mow. But it is lush and green except, of course, in our backyard where the grass struggles to grow. We are beginning to realize that we need to trim trees as they are seemingly taking over our yard because they are thriving so.

Things slow down a bit also this time of year it seems (for just a bit) and so we are all looking forward to a different pace. There are still the regular ministry moments that take place but the programs and meetings are less and it leaves us time to breathe and just put our eyes on our relationship with our creator.

That is what summer does for me and I am quite sure it is that way for many of you.

This is a time for renewal and for replenishing our souls and our bodies. Nature does that for me in spades no matter what season it is. But summer is warmer and so invites me into moments with my creator where I soak in the love that is there for me. God calls us into these moments where we press the pause button and breathe and walk and be in God's creation. I sense many of you are with me on this.

There is something about nature that comes alive this time of year that invites us into rest and relationship with God.

Song of Songs is a good book to look at this time of year. We don't often go there to read. But I invite you to read it a bit especially chapter two. The middle part of this chapter is especially meaningful for me. This is a love poem and often used for weddings but actually it is a reference to our God and how incredible that love is for each one of us.

It speaks to an intimate relationship with our Lord and how our beloved wants that relationship to be close and intimate. I invite you to read it all but beginning at verse 10 we find this invitation *"My beloved spoke and said to me, Arise my Darling, my beautiful one, come with me."* Here is a lovely reference to how our Lord sees us... as beautiful. God wants nothing more than if we would take the time to come away with God and be nourished and fed and spend time with God. Our Lord wants this kind of relationship with us... one that is close and where we can sense and feel God's love.

And so, we have this lovely invitation... come with me. I picture God coming to each of us and gently inviting... with hand outstretched and saying... *"come with me... come and spend some time with me"*. This is truly the time of year to take God up on this invitation.

Then the text continues:

"See the winter is past the rains are over and gone. Flowers appear on the earth; the season of singing has come, the cooing of doves is heard in our land. The fig tree forms its early fruit the blossoming vines spread their fragrance. Arise come, my darling; my beautiful one, come with me".

I really hear the love God has for us, his beloved and how God sees us as beautiful like all of God's creation which we are also a part of.

And so as I sit on my step and hear these words, I hear how intimate these words are

and how valuable we are to God and how much the Lord loves each one of us and sees me as beloved.

We have trouble sometimes seeing ourselves like that but there is no doubt, this is how God sees each of us.

Our God SEES you as beloved... as beautiful and wants nothing more than that we spend time in the Lord's presence to be renewed, to be loved, to be seen and to be in a deep connection with our beloved.

Let's take this time of summer to accept this invitation to come near to our Lord and spend time together as we would a loved friend or family member.

Hear these words again today... "Arise my darling, my beautiful one, come with me."

I picture us spending time with the Lord this summer and growing ever closer to the one who loves us dearly.

There is a song that many of us know called, *In the Garden*. The lyrics go like this:

Indeed, the voice of our beloved is calling each of us to come and spend precious time with God as we enjoy the incredible world that has been created for us.

May you have a blessed summer as you connect deeply with those you love and with your beloved God.

Enjoy each moment to the full. Let yourself relish in this love God has for you.

I shall do the same.



Dear Beloved of God -

"Faith is the ability to listen to the melody of the future and hope is the courage to dance to its rhythm now" (adapted from Brazilian theologian Rubem Alves).

Participants at the May 9-13, 2022, Leadership Conference of the Americas at Santiago, Chile – of member churches of the Lutheran World Federation in Latin America, the Caribbean and North America – gathered, were encouraged and guided by the theme, "I breathe upon you the breath of life," based on Ezekiel 37, the story of dry bones.

Ezekiel's text is charged with this image of movement. The blowing, breath, spirit (*ruach*) of God has been present since the beginning. YHWH's *ruach* moved over the waters. That same spirit falls on the dry bones causing the revitalization of that which had died.

"The bones have dried and are making noise," shared keynote presenter, Rev. Dr. Rafael Malpica Padilla, Executive Director of Global Mission, ELCA, "and our churches are in crisis." Yes, in this time of pandemic, but even prior to this with our mission context marked by the great "isms" (patriarchism, racism and populism), and like the dry bones of Ezekiel they are making noise.

These three "isms" are present, unfortunately, in the life of our faith communities. "It is they who have dried the bones...and now the bones are making noise. It is these "isms", said Padilla, "that cause the great abyss between the church and life project of Jesus." These "isms" seek to hoard and maintain power while the life project of Jesus sought to empower, to serve, to embrace all in grace and love even to the point of death.

So, where do we go? The Brazilian, Vitor Westhelle, gives us a clue: "The theology of the cross is neither a discourse nor a doctrine. It is a way of life that we live out. It is a practice that involves a risk. It is a story that if truly told, courts danger but moves also into hopeful solidarity, the solidarity of those who are moved by the pain of God in the midst of the world, or by the pain of the world in the midst of

God" (quoted by Padilla, "Martin Luther for the Life of the Church," in *The Forgotten Luther III: Reclaiming a Vision of Global Community*, Conrad A. Braaten & Ryan P. Cumming, eds. [Minneapolis: Fortress Press, 2021], 92.).

The Spirit, the *ruach* of God, pushes us to translate the good news of God into concrete actions for life in community. The Spirit pushes us towards God's mission; to restore community which occurs through reconciliation.

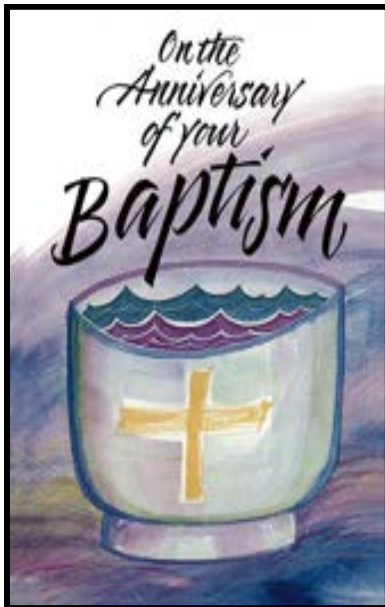
The Indian-Spanish theologian, Raimundo Panikkar, says it this way: "The great challenge today is to convert the sacred bread into real bread, the liturgical peace into political peace, the worship of the creator into reverence for the creation, the Christian praying community into an authentic human fellowship. It is risky to celebrate the Eucharist. We may have to leave it unfinished, going first to give back to the poor what belongs to them" (Raimundo Panikkar, "Many as a Ritual Being," *Chicago Studies*, 16 [1977]: 27.).

The bones will continue to rattle if we stay where we have always been. For this journey we carry our backpack, and in it we carry the tools for the work: faith, hope, and love. "Faith, the ability to hear the melody of the future; hope, the courage to dance to its rhythm here and now; and love, a stubborn and unwavering commitment" (Douglas R.A. Hare, *Matthew: Interpretation, A Bible Commentary for Teaching and Preaching* [Louisville, Kentucky: Westminster John Knox Press, 2009], 260.).

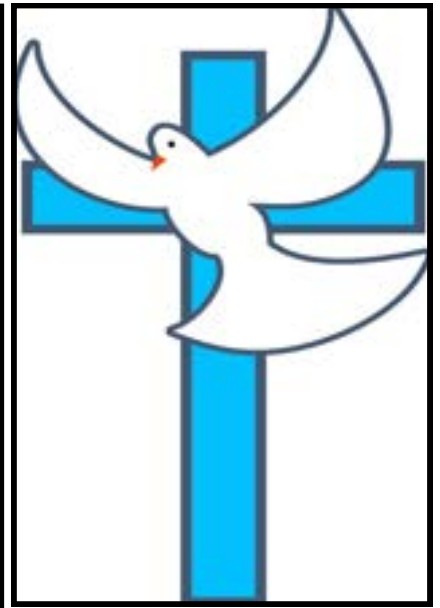

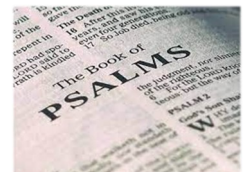

We wish you all a sunny, safe, refreshing summer.

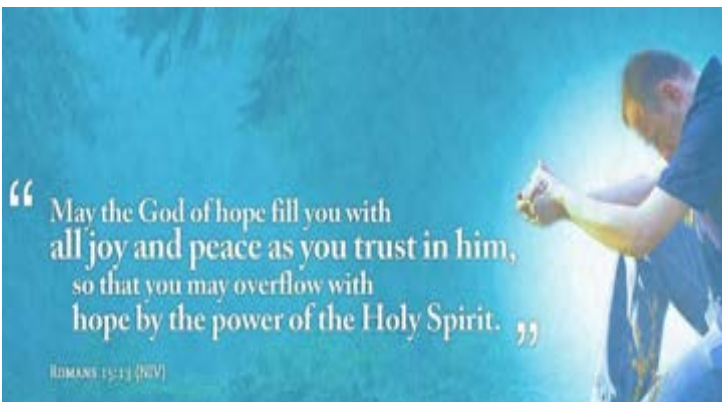

18th National Convention of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada

Online, July 15 and 16, 2022

The National Convention of the ELCIC, which was originally planned to be an in-person meeting in Calgary, in Assembly with the Anglican Church of Canada, has been postponed until next year. However, the Bylaws of the ELCIC required that the business portion is slated to be taken care of every three years so we are meeting online to take care of the necessary items. These include hearing reports from the National Bishop, the outgoing National Church Council, and the ELCIC Group Services (regarding pensions and benefits), as well from Canadian Lutheran World Relief, LCBI High School in Outlook, SK. and Luther College in Regina, SK. We will be electing new officers (Vice-Chair, Secretary and Treasurer), as well as members of the National Church Council and Court of Appeal. Passing a budget for the next three years is also on the agenda. All recommendations coming in the *Report of the National Church Council* will be held until next year when we hope to meet in-person.

It has been interesting to read the various reports, one being *One Flock, One Shepherd*, a proposed call for the Lutherans, Anglicans and Moravians to walk together in full communion. Others include the ELCIC Task Force Reports addressing *Ablism* (the concerns of people living with disabilities), *Racism, White Supremacy and Racial Injustice Issues, Homophobia, Biphobia and Transphobia*, and *Carbon Neutrality*. There is also a lengthy report on the *Theology and Practice of Online Communion* which our Worship Committee will be studying.

There are 27 lay and rostered delegates from Alberta, representing each of our province's areas. Our area, the East Central Area, will be represented by Shae Belanger, Scandia, Armena; Pastor Mike Harmon, Armena Parish; Kathy Nelson, Bethesda, New Norway; Pastor Eleanor Ness, Star of Hope Parish (Hughenden/Czar area); and Pastor Craig Wentland, Chaplain at Augustana. I and the others were elected at the July 2021 ABT Synod Convention.

The Convention theme, *Let There Be Growing*, underlines our Easter hope for our church, our world, and creation. It is based on Revelations 22:1-2:

Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life, as clear as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb down the middle of the great street of the city. On each side of the river stood the tree of life, bearing twelve crops of fruit, yielding its fruit every month. And the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations.

The delegates and leaders attending this online convention covet your prayer support. Thank you!

Attention Messiah Ladies: Sharing with Tanzania Families

Re Quilting: a small group have finished sewing a few quilts, but we will take a break now until Sept. Then in the fall we will get together to finish off all those colourful quilt tops to share with others.

We have been connecting with Connie Landstrom to find out the needs of the children in Tanzania. After her injury last year, she is not ready to travel yet, but she has been shipping items to the areas she was ministering to.



Items that would be appreciated there:

- : Pillow case dresses (we have 22 on the shelf)
- : Pneumonia vests and knitted hats for the new born babies.
- : Receiving blankets and smaller quilts, no batting inside. (about 1Yard sq.)
- : Knitted bears, stuffy toys (no buttons)

Another item she has been gathering is cloth-like grocery bags, to help eliminate some of the plastic bags they have. Walmart bags are 15 cents each. We could collect a few of these as well or sew some for them.

It would be good if we could send some of these items we have in our cupboard. The postage is very expensive, but if we work together over the next few months we can bless these folks. (Connie sent 7 boxes which cost her \$1000.00 in postage.)

Our goal is to make a few pneumonia vest and hats and add dresses, receiving blankets and quilts to send off to Tanzania by late fall. Maybe 1 or 2 boxes.

If you'd like to knit vests and hats, Marilyn Hoveland will post patterns on the lower edge of the bulletin Board in the Fellowship wing.

If you have wool to donate for these items, any colour, we will put a box in the centre shelves of the quilting cupboard by the nursery, to collect donations. Knitters help yourselves.

Donations for the shipping postage would be gratefully accepted within the Circles when we are ready to send.

These gifts seem small but are very appreciated.

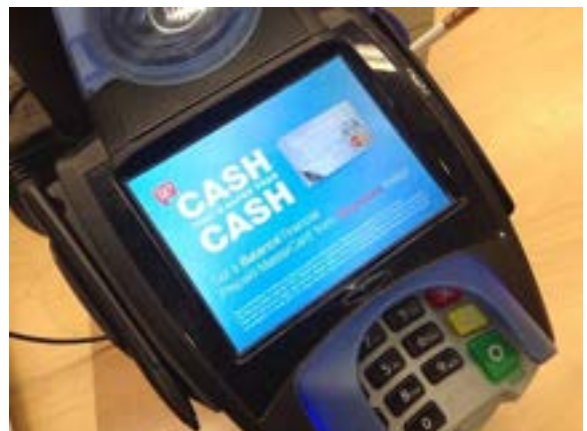

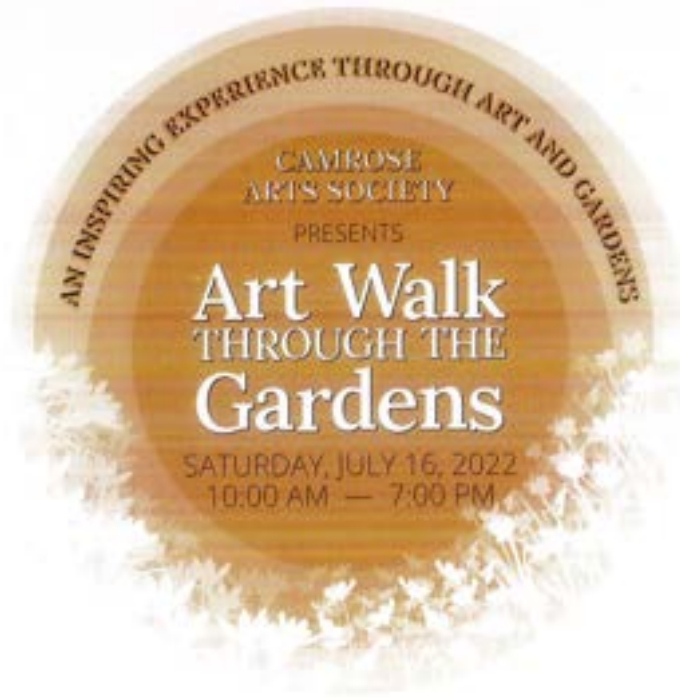

Treasurer's Report - June 2022

The annual report included unaudited income statements for the year ended April 30. If you were at the annual meeting or read the report you will know that with the assistance of about \$23,000 of estate funds we ended the year with a balanced budget. We were happy to see this, as we began the year with a budgeted deficit of \$45,738, with an understanding changes needed to made.

One of the unplanned changes was when Pastor Calvin left part way through the year, reducing our pastoral costs. But it was also another year of Covid, and partly because of this, offerings were down by about \$30,000 from the year before.

Now we are able to gather again, and looking ahead into the new year. It isn't possible to make projections for the year based on only one month, but it is encouraging to see that offerings in May were up by about \$3,000 from last year. But in spite of this there was a deficit of \$2,500 for the month, caused in part by an insurance premium payment. We need to recognize that many costs are increasing.

It is exciting to look ahead at what the year will bring for Messiah. Following a year of discernment of what God is calling us to do the annual meeting enthusiastically made the decision to call a second pastor, and to enter a collaboration agreement with the congregations in New Norway and Bashaw. Messiah will provide each of them with one quarter time pastoral services, and they will contribute their share of the costs. It will be a challenge for us to cover the added costs of our share, but if our offerings can return to what they were two years ago it should be possible. We are fortunate to have some reserve funds available to assist in the first year, and the annual meeting allocated part of the available income from the Ministry Endowment Fund to assist. It offers a challenge to each of us to increase our offerings as we are able.

We move forward in confidence and optimism for the year ahead.

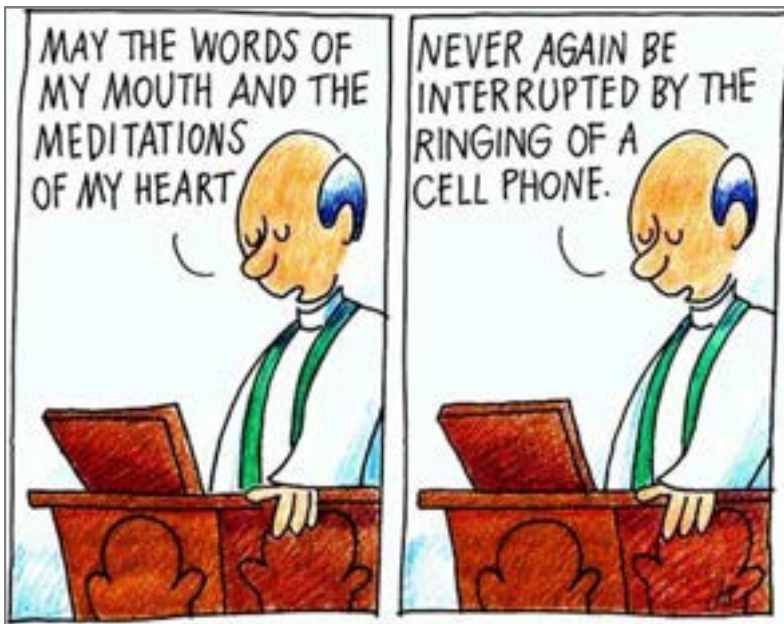
