We move into the fall season, we find the leaves turning color and the air getting cooler in the evenings and the dark comes earlier. There is indeed a letting go of summer as we enter into this new season. The fall programs start up and it

also seems like things come to life in other ways.

It is also a time for giving thanks as thanksgiving approaches. Wait a minute... aren't we supposed to give thanks every day and not just once a year? Indeed we are! The scriptures remind us over and over again to give thanks and praise to our God each and every day. We do have much to give thanks for. We have been blessed in so many ways; more important that the loving grace and forgiveness of the God who If we spent our moments looking at what is not adopts us as daughter and sons. I could name many things we have to be thankful for as could you.

Today I want to remind us though that its takes work to give thanks. It's not always easy. When tragedy hits, we may not feel much thankfulness. We might only have tears. We have had much of that this summer too. When hearts are full of grief it is hard to give God thanks and praise. God knows this... perhaps in those times our thankful prayers are prayers of thanks for God's presence with us and that God remains steady when our hearts are broken.

Sometimes also we can find ourselves even in our ordinary moments of life... looking more at the stuff we might complain about rather than what we have to be grateful for.

The pandemic has changed and shifted this world and that includes our churches. Attendance is down. Things have changed, some changes seem normal and others can feel a bit unstable sometimes. It can be tempting too to look at our church and all that is and rather than giving thanks complain about the little things that in the bigger scheme of things

doesn't matter that much. The thing is we are human. We live together in human ways. And so we can at times spend more of our energy complaining in our churches and at one another rather than giving thanks. We can find ourselves looking at what is not working anymore, how the changes are affecting our lives, how this or that is not as it used to be... the list goes on and on. We can become a bit discontent and that shifts things in a direction that is never helpful for any of us. There is a reason that our scripture constantly reminds us to give thanks. Its actually good for

Phil 4:8-9 we are reminded to make a point to look for the positive... for the things that are worthy of praise and to think of these things. The result... the peace of God will be with you. We actually have a choice about where we focus our attention.

our souls.

working or how things are not to our satisfaction... we will live dissatisfied. But as we turn our eves to all of the blessings that God has given us, we see things with a different set of glasses. Suddenly our viewpoint changes and often even our mood and opinion about things and people even change.

This can be the case in every area of our lives. One simple example in our church might be coming to worship and looking for what blesses us and for a connection with our God. Then we would have no time to see all that is not perfect.

Indeed... we are not a perfect church nor are we a perfect people... but we are God's people. That is something amazing to give thanks for in this season of giving thanks.

Blessings to you all this season of change. I am very thankful for you and for God's presence in God's imperfect but beautiful church across the world.

Dear Beloved of God -

Frederick Buechner was arguably the foremost spiritual writer of his generation. An American writer, novelist, poet, autobiographer, essayist, preacher, and theologian, his writing career spanned over six decades, during which time he

wrote thirty-nine published books, now translated into twenty-seven languages.

He died peacefully at the age of 96 (July 11, 1926 -August 15, 2022), having become a master of four distinct genres: novel, sermon, popular theology, and memoir.

I was introduced to Buechner in my early 20s during my college days and his words have been a constant source of reflection and wonder as I prepared for and entered pastoral ministry. Over the years his writings became my journaling partner, mentoring and forming me as a pastor, as I added one Buechner quote after another to my personal journal and reflected on their meaning for my life and calling. I have often returned to these journal writings, some written nearly 40 years ago. Each time I have been filled with gratitude for the clarity of Buechner's writing, his wisdom, and the personal and pastoral formation I experienced.

I believe that some of Buechner's best writing is found in his memoirs. They are unflinchingly honest, particularly in his accounts of the painful aspects of his life, but they are never without hope. Buechner never stopped searching his own life for clues to the presence of God. This quest became one of his overarching themes: "Listen to your life. See it for the fathomless mystery that it is. In the boredom and pain of it no less than in the excitement and gladness: touch, taste, smell your way to the holy and hidden heart of it because in the last analysis all moments are key moments and life itself is grace." (Now and Then, 1983)

Buechner's writing inspired me, time and time again, to listen to my life, and there to see grace.

They called me again and again to consider my baptismal vocation and profoundly shaped who I am and who I seek to be.

They became a source in discernment and decision-making throughout my life: "The place God calls you to is the place where your deep gladness and the world's deep hunger meet." (Wishful Thinking: A Theological ABC, 1973).

They deeply impacted my preaching and writing and guided my pastoral heart: "A Christian is one who points at Christ and says, 'I can't prove a thing, but there's something about his eyes and his voice. There's something about the way he carries his head, his hands, the way he carries his cross – the way he carries me." (Wishful Thinking: A Theological ABC, 1973).

They spoke to the significance of each moment, of daily living, and of relationships and community: "The life I touch for good or ill will touch another life, and in turn another, until who knows where the trembling stops or in what far place my touch will be felt. Our lives are linked together." (The Hungering Dark, 1968)

They made me laugh hysterically and poignantly affirmed me: "Whether your faith is that there is a God or that there is not a God, if you don't have any doubts, you are either kidding yourself or asleep. Doubts are the ants in the pants of faith. They keep it awake and moving." (Wishful Thinking: A Theological ABC, 1973)

"Pay attention to the things that bring a tear to your eye or a lump in your throat because they are signs that the holy is drawing near." (source unknown) His words continually invite me to pay attention, to listen to my life, and there to see grace, and there to see the holy.

I am grateful to God for Frederich Buechner, for his creative, poignant, and inspiring writings which continue to profoundly touch my life and the lives of so many others.

When? Saturdays, 9:00 to 10:15 am


Where? Via ZOOM (call the church office for the link.)

Lectio Divina, Latin for "sacred reading", is a practice that offers a profound way of praying scripture. It is a way of "ruminating" scripture, being nourished by the living water as Jesus offered the Samaritan woman in John 4. In Lectio Divina we work intensely with a short scriptural passage in four steps, reading, reflection, prayer and rest. It is not Bible study, however

it may ignite curiosity about the passage and one may desire to engage in study on one's own after the hour of lectio is over. Lectio Divina is offered at Messiah one hour a week, from 10:30 to 11:30 on Monday mornings in the Lounge (downstairs) excluding holiday Mondays. In this offering of Lectio Divinia, there is the opportunity to speak or to be in silence.



PAKISTAN FLOODS

A catastrophic flood in Pakistan has affected 33 million people.

Catastrophic flooding in Pakistan has destroyed homes, crops, health centres, roads and bridges, affecting more than 33 million people. Rain is expected to continue through September and there is an elevated risk of the spread of malaria, dengue fever and other diseases.

CLWR – together with leading Canadian aid agencies in the Humanitarian Coalition – is appealing for donations to respond to the flooding emergency unfolding in Pakistan. Your



Treasurer's Report - August 2022

It is encouraging to see increases in attendance at worship, and choirs and programs starting up again. Perhaps this is part of the reason there was a financial surplus August, following three months of deficits.

Let us hope and pray for continuing recovery from the difficulties of the Covid period.

Here is a summary of the first four months of Messiah's fiscal year:

Surplus/deficit:

May - \$2,508

June - \$4,038

July - \$1,494

August + \$3,571

This makes our year to date deficit: \$4,468.

This is substantially less than last year, which showed a deficit of \$36,835 for the same period. One of the significant differences is that last year we had two pastors.

There has also been a drop in offerings of \$10,186 for the first four months of this year compared to last year. This is a reduction of 9 per cent.

It is a concern that we have been operating at a deficit so far this year with only one pastor.

There is a significant variation in offerings by month, and we will need to watch the coming months carefully.

It has also been encouraging to see the strong support for the Camrose Refugee Centre's assistance to refugees from Ukraine. Since May 1 \$61,966 has been received, and assistance provided to the end of August has been \$26,462. This is still an active area. These amounts are not part of our regular budget, as this assistance is entirely funded by designated donations, and the available balance is held in a designated reserve account.




