Dear Beloved of God -

I have been thinking a lot about the church lately. I know that many others in our postpandemic world are also thinking about the church.

A major shift is taking place. A major shift institutionally which

will re-shape us, re-form us, and re-make us in ways as yet not imagined or fully known.

The ministry and ministry, our calling as baptized children in the body of Christ, has not changed. We are yet called "...to do justice and to love kindness and to walk humbly with God" (Micah 6:8). But make no mistake we are in the midst of what is a seismic shift.

Authors such as Phyllis Tickle ("The Great Emergence") have written that every 500 years, the church goes through a rummage sale, and cleans out the old forms of spirituality and replaces it with new ones. This does not mean that previous forms become obsolete or invalid. It simply means they lose pride of place as the dominant form of Christianity. Constantine in the late 4th century, early 5th, the Great Schism of the 11th century, the Reformation in the 16th century, Postmodern era in the 21st century now shaped by a global pandemic have all been points of reference for these changes. This rummage sale is not only about the church, but about political systems, financial institutions, education, and the list goes on.

What is emerging is a new form of Christianity, what Tickle named many years ago, "The Great Emergence." One can only guess whether or not it is tribal form, an individualistic form, a social form, a combination of all of them, or something else entirely. But what we can say is that Protestantism in all its denominational forms is losing influence and is giving way to alternative forms of Christian expression.

Of course, the world-wide pandemic has greatly influenced and moved this shift forward, but it is a shift which had already begun.

As I think about church I've been wondering if our ELCIC global mission accompaniment model might be a guide for us as we journey forward together as the ELCIC, its synods, congregations, specialized ministries, synodically recognized ministries, and as full communion, ecumenical, interfaith, and global partners such as The Lutheran World Federation.

Our ELCIC global mission accompaniment model is one of walking together in solidarity, side by side, practicing interdependence and mutuality, in service to God's mission. The values of the accompaniment model are interconnected, and include mutuality, inclusivity, vulnerability, empowerment and sustainability.

The core purpose of these relationships, this accompaniment, is God's mission.

Might we consider journeying forward together as the ELCIC, in whatever institutional structure we are being transformed and lead into, including with local and global partners, as a church immersed and leaning into walking together in solidarity, side by side, in service to God's mission?

An accompaniment model of:

- Mutuality: All/each of us (national/synod, synods/congregations, corporately/personally, etc.) have gifts to support God's mission. There is no mission to, only mission with and among.
- Inclusivity: We seek to build relationships across boundaries that exclude and divide.
- Vulnerability: Just as Jesus became vulnerable to us, we open ourselves to others.
- Empowerment: We seek to identify and correct imbalances of power, which may mean recognizing and letting go of our own.

• Sustainability. To ensure the longevity of ministries, we seek to embed mission in ongoing relationships and communities.

Relationships and accompaniment are at the heart of our approach to global ministry. Might this also be at the heart of our ministry as the ELCIC, its synods, congregations, etc., including our ministry together with local and global partners? In service to God's mission?

In our posture in global ministry, we seek to actively listen to our partners and companions, share in their joys and sorrows, support them in their mission – as they support us in ours. Might this stance of active listening, sharing and support, including receiving support, be a model

for our living and ministry as the ELCIC, its synods, congregations, etc., together with our local and global partners? Walking and working together in service to God's mission?

I've been thinking about the church lately. I realize that many others are too.

In Lectio Divina we work intensely with a short scriptural passage in four steps, reading, reflection, prayer and rest. It is not Bible study, however

it may ignite curiosity about the passage and one may desire to engage in study on one's own after the hour of lectio is over. Lectio Divina is offered at Messiah one hour a week, from 10:30 to 11:30 on Monday mornings in the Lounge (downstairs) excluding holiday Mondays. Celebrating the 20th Anniversary of the Waterloo Declaration





A Note about Offering Envelopes and "Envelope Numbers" It will come as no surprise to any of you that there has been a shift in the way some of you give offerings in the past 3 years and therefore in the way that we receive offerings here at Messiah. I have no idea if you are still experimenting or have settled into a new pattern that you expect to continue for the foreseeable future. With the way timing worked out for ordering new envelopes, the physical envelopes have already been ordered (and received) for 2023, though we will wait to hand them out until closer to January. It did occur to me to try to ask about envelopes and make a shift prior to ordering the envelopes for 2023, but I got around to it too late to have time and also wondered if people were still settling in to new patterns. The way we assign the envelope numbers depends on the way you expect to give. I am expecting to make an adjustment for 2024, after I ask you in the spring about the way you want to continue and have a better idea about preference for physical envelopes. I expect to need to order fewer physical envelopes for 2024, but for 2023 they are already here and available. Since that's the case, if you want to keep your number and envelopes for 2023, there's no reason to change or let me know anything. It was a surprise to me when I came to Messiah, that the envelope numbers didn't change from year to year, and I know that most of you like that aspect of things. However, be warned that the numbers will be changing in 2024. After that, the numbers should be consistent again for a few years, maybe a lot of years, if I remember to build more flexibility into it. In the spring I will ask whether you want physical envelopes for weekly giving, physical envelopes for monthly giving or an assigned number for any other pattern of giving. Since we send out unprinted physical envelopes for specials, but have been including them for everyone, I will include a special box for "want physical envelopes for Christmas, Easter and Thanksgiving" after the assigned number option, to prevent sending out physical envelopes to people who don't want them. 

THE EMERGENCY SITUATION IN ETHIOPIA CONTINUES

In November, 2020 – just before the global pandemic – war erupted in northern Ethiopia between the government and rebel forces. Since then, violent conflict has spread throughout multiple regions, destroying hospitals, schools, water facilities, herds of livestock, farms and homes. Thousands of people have died and many more are displaced with no access to their belongings or bank accounts. Trapped in conflict zones, families are searching for safety in the desert.

On top of all of this, Ethiopian families are also facing the worst drought in decades and invasions of desert locusts that eat their crops. Because of the fighting, humanitarian workers aren't able to reach these families to provide emergency food, water and shelter.



This is why our help today is so important. A gift of \$35 can provide a family experiencing extreme hunger with 25 grams of seeds, so that they can plant next year's harvest. It will also provide training, like land preparation and crop management, so that they can produce the best yield possible.



Treasurer's Report

The September financial statements show a deficit of \$2,703 for the month. We are now five months into our fiscal year, and there have been deficits in four of them. It starts to look like we have a pattern, and this is becoming a concern. For the five months we have accumulated a deficit of \$7,172. Giving is not the same every month, and we look forward to a boost in October from the Thanksgiving Offering. At the same time need to remember that we will soon face the months with higher utility bills.

At the October church council meeting there was a decision to create an ad hoc committee to consider means of increasing income.

Gord Myrehaug and the Support Committee have now finalized agreements for two major projects that need to be done and that we have known were coming.

In January, D-2 Electrical will replace all the smoke detectors and duct detectors as required by fire regulations for \$9,950 + GST.

Goodmen Roofing Ltd. of Red Deer have quoted \$7,830 + GST to repair the roof leak over the doors by the bell tower. They are very busy, and do not expect to do the work until 2023.

We have reserve funds for Capital/Major Projects that are adequate to cover these two significant expenses, so they will not impact our operating budget.




