

Ministers Message



I am Doing a New Thing!

We are opening into another New Year. And as we do, we look back at the moments of darkness and the moments of light... and all those in between.

As we move into a new year

we are welcomed and invited to breathe in the breath of the Spirit for strength to release the old and enter into the new.

Not unlike last year, there will be moments in the year ahead that will be difficult. Some will be sad and full of darkness. Many are grieving deep losses. Other moments will be celebratory and full of light. Some will be mixed and the light only comes through in a small way at first. There will be some change and we will find ourselves fighting the transitions or embracing them. They also bring new life. The truth is that life is unpredictable, but God's love is ever and always there for us no matter what comes our way.

As we move into a year full of all kinds of moments, we know this... our God remains with us as we step forward.

In Isaiah we hear these words, "See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland."

This is indeed such a hopeful way to be in the new year. We will not live our moments perfectly for that is not possible. But as human beings loved and forgiven and taken care of by God we can walk in confidence through our days moving forward.

Indeed, "God is doing a New Thing... it will spring forth!"

I look forward to seeing how the light of God's love shines within each of us this year.

And let us begin by saying, "Thank you Lord for this year and for this present moment of this day".

I wish you a blessed beginning to this New Year as we journey together embraced in the love of God.

Dear Beloved of God -

"In the time of King Herod...," that's how the story begins.

"In the time of King Herod...."
He built monumental structures including the Second Jewish Temple, the mountaintop palace at Masada and the

palatial Herodium complex whose desert palace included a grand residence, a theater and large pools, baths, and gardens. When his position was seemingly threatened, he did not hesitate for a second but had his wife killed and at least two of his sons.

"In the time of King Herod...." He dominates the story. Of the twelve verses of the Epiphany Gospel, Matthew 2:1-12, he controls the action in ten of them. He rules a world dominated by his authority, his power, his ruthlessness.

King Herod so rules over the world, over this story, that it would be easy to miss the good news of the birth of an infant for it is almost buried, almost hidden, almost veiled in the reality dominated by Herod.

It is no wonder then that he, and all of Jerusalem with him, are stunned by the arrival of foreigners from the East who come to Jerusalem wishing to pay tribute to a "child who has been born king of the Jews." It frightens him, and all Jerusalem and he moves quickly to control, to assess, to dominate calling the religious leaders together and then secretly meeting the visitors.

And later we will learn that Herod had been fooled by these wise foreigners – fooled but not beaten. He fights back as cruelty does and has all the infants slaughtered.

"In the time of King Herod...."

This is not an easy, gentle story – but the gospel writer, Matthew's witness, does not shy away from recognizing that the good news of Jesus –

of the birth of the Christ-child, "the king of the Jews" is surrounded by, it is immersed in, harsh reality. And that beneath this reality as defined by Herod – almost hidden, almost veiled – is the truth.

Foreigners arrive in Jerusalem with wealth to place at feet of an infant. And, in this act of homage, they become the first to see what God is up to in the birth of this child. An epiphany which means something like manifestation, or unveiling, or revealing the truth. That the steadfast love of God is met in the flesh and blood of Jesus, born of Mary and that it is veiled, revealed in weakness, hidden in poverty, seen in helplessness.

The gospel writer's witness invites us to see that the epiphany is not obvious. Rather, it is fragile, tenuous, dreamlike, as vulnerable as an unnoticed baby in a god-forsaken little village, witnessed to by foreigners, in a land ruled by Herod.

And this is where we find ourselves. For if we are to be a people who seek to be disciples of Jesus Christ, "in the time of King Herod," then we are invited to see God at work in the hidden, veiled, fragile, tenuous, vulnerable, weak, poor; in people and places and events one would hardly notice at all.

For what child is this whose epiphany is so quiet, so unobtrusive, little more than a whisper and yet this one is known, is revealed in the sharing of a little piece of bread and a sip of wine?

For what child is this whose epiphany is so fragile, so veiled, in a village fifteen kilometers from the center of power in Jerusalem and yet this one is baptized, and we are ourselves, baptized in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, are named and claimed children of God?

For what child is this whose birth in a manger is

witnessed hardly at all, and who is killed on a cross, arms flung wide open embracing the whole world. A story from start to finish surrounded by loss and grief and yet a story that ends in surprising, new life?

"In the time of King Herod...." And soon this family will be running to Egypt.

God give us eyes, new eyes, to see You at work among us. And then nurtured in the water and the Word of our baptism, nourished in the communion meal, and upheld in community move us to action for the fragile, tenuous, vulnerable, weak, poor.

Treasurer's Report December 2022

Last month I was happy to report a significant improvement in Messiah's financial situation. November turned it around a bit, with a deficit of \$3,919. That leaves a surplus of \$3,755 for the first seven months of our year.

We are doing well at keeping up with current expenses, but it will be a challenge to cover increasing costs and our share of the costs of the new pastor who we expect to be called soon.

There is a significant monthly variation in envelope giving, which is a bit of a puzzle for me. Total envelope offerings this year have been:

These do not include Thanksgiving, Christmas, or other special designated offerings, which are recorded separately.

If you have any thoughts or insights about this variation I'd be happy to talk with you about it.

It does remind me of the benefits of making regular offerings by preauthorized debit. Many of us already make our regular offerings this way. You still have an envelope number, and can make special offerings that way. If you aren't already using pre-authorized debit for your regular offerings, but are interested, it's easy to set up. The office has an authorization form you would need to sign, and may need a cancelled cheque to get the account number. After that everything is automatic.

Entering the new year is a good time to review the amount of our regular offerings, whether automatic or not. For example, we have come to realize that our offering has been the same amount for some time, even though what we spend on almost everything else has increased. We will be increasing ours in January, and I encourage you to review yours as well. To make a change is easy. You simply need to sign a new authorization form at the office.

This winter we are facing three capital projects that I expect will add up to about \$20,000. These include repairs to the bottom of the elevator, roofing repair to stop the leaking in the flat roof near the steeple, and replacement of all smoke/fire detectors as required by fire regulations. There is no provision for these in the regular budget, but we are fortunate to have a reserve fund for major capital expenses that can be used. If you are in a position to do so a special donation to assist with these costs would allow us to retain more reserve funds for major capital costs that are sure to come in the future. The next big one that we can see coming in a few years will be roofing on the sanctuary.

Please call me if you have any questions or concerns about Messiah's financial position that I may be able to answer.



Perhaps you will find some holiday reading among these recent library additions.

Let's start close to home: **Rescue from Darkness**, self-published by Wendy Roste, is her memoir on living with bipolar disorder. Do we know Wendy Roste? I asked our guest minister Darrel Roste, who confirmed that Wendy is the wife of his cousin in the Saskatoon area. Wendy also attended CLBI in younger years. Look for her book in our Biography section.

MLC readers must enjoy Max Lucado, as our library already hosts four of his titles in the "Christian Living" section. We have more ground still to cover — he has written over 100 books. Now we host two more from the 1990s: When God Whispers Your Name, one of Lucado's best loved; and The Great House of God, which is (surprise!) a meditation on the Lord's Prayer. Read it to learn the connection.



Given Lucado's traction within MLC, I was surprised to notice this month that his modern fellow-writer in the Christian Living genre, Philip Yancy, is only twice on our shelf. Now we have a third: *What's So Amazing About Grace?* is Yancey's best-known book in recent years. He describes how God's grace applies to you and me, in *very* real and personal ways. All three are on the Christian Living shelf.




