LEAD THE WAY OH LORD

We have found as
January ends and the
year moves forward, that
we are already in new
places and heading onto
new paths. We experience
the familiar of the cold

of winter, deep snow, the dark mornings, the crystal clear moon and the morning light and evening sunsets that are all a part of our moments. At the same time we are aware that we are in a place of beginnings; beginnings that bring many transitions. For some it is a year that brings hope for a new tomorrow. For some you have opened the year in sadness and grief and even despair. For some you are faced with fear for the future. Maybe you are faced with something completely unpredictable that you now have to live with. Nothing in life is all wrapped up in an easy box... for us to open.

Life is all about transitions isn't it? We transition into the unknown, step by step. We have to step out sometimes in faith, always knowing that we don't really know what is up ahead... but we know who holds our hand. God, our ever faithful God is here... guiding us and leading us.

As we move into what is new... maybe a move... maybe a new place to live... a new job... a new way to be in the world... a risk we are invited to take... a difficult situation that seems to have no solution... no matter what, we have to step in or nothing moves. can trust that as we journey forward we are always led into a path of love and we can always trust the loving presence of the Lord along the journey who leads the way.


Perhaps our prayer might be this...

Dear Beloved of God -

Imagine yourself as a witness to the crucifixion. How would you react? How would your life be impacted? What would it mean to you? How would you be changed?

In her book Witness at the Cross, scholar and teacher, Amy-Jill Levine, examines how the people at the cross each have distinct roles to play in the Gospels. For each, Jesus has a particular meaning and personal message, shaped by their background, social context, and their role in the crucifixion and the events leading up to Jesus' death. From each of them, we learn how those meanings and messages cross the centuries to any who would come to the cross today.

What do the derisive words of the bystanders, the political leaders, the chief priests and scribes show us about the nature of blasphemy, and how does their presence force us to confront our own complicity: Can bystanders be innocent?

How are our views of criminal justice today challenged by our understanding of Rome's judicial system, which resulted in the deaths of the two crucified with Jesus and of Jesus himself? How does this knowledge inspire us to live as good neighbours to all?

The Roman soldiers: to what extent does their complicity and apparent indifference to Jesus' death indict us? What is the message to us as we go about our own business while innocents suffer and die?

What can we learn from the Beloved Disciple about Jesus' "new command" to love each other? Does this anonymous figure have anything to teach us about observing all time as sacred time?

What do the roles of the women at the cross (patrons, followers, supporters) reveal about the role of women in the church today? What roles can men and women play in bearing witness to

God and Jesus in powerful ways?

How did Joseph of Arimathea and Nicodemus relate to Jesus before his death? How do their actions after his death provide a model for modern "sympathizers" of Jesus?

I invite you to explore these and other questions with me, to come to the cross.

During the 6 weeks of Lent, leading to Holy Week and ultimately to Holy Friday and the looming shadow of the cross, I invite you to participate with me in a Bible study, offered online to lay and rostered members across the synod. Gather as community, as family, as witnesses at the cross, for a weekly ZOOM meeting, where we will read, view, ponder, discuss, and pray together. Be ready to tackle some hard questions as modern witnesses "at the Cross".

Walk with me and other siblings in Christ from across the synod, as we explore what it truly means to be a witness at the cross. Our journey begins on Shrove Tuesday (February 21) and continues to Holy Week, with meetings each Tuesday, at 9:00 am or 7:00 pm. We will spend 75 minutes together exploring Amy-Jill Levine's book *Witness at the Cross: A beginner's guide to Holy Friday*. I encourage you to gather as a small group in your church, as a community of neighbours, with friends in one another's homes, as family. What better way to build stronger relationships across the synod, than to ponder together such matters of faith? To explore together how being witnesses at the cross today continues to mold our lives as individuals, as members of church, as congregations, within our communities, in everything we do.

WITNESS at the CROSS: A Beginner's Guide to Holy Friday



Time: 9:00 am OR 7:00 pm

Bishop Larry invites you to join him in an online Bible study each Tuesday in Lent, beginning on February 21, 2023.

The study will be offered at 9:00 am and again at 7:00 pm each Tuesday until Holy Week. Each participant will be asked to purchase their own copy of *Witness at the Cross*, by Amy-Jill Levine. The book is available in printed, digital, and audio versions



from Amazon and local booksellers. Prereading in preparation for each will be expected.

Each 75-minute session will view the crucifixion from the viewpoint of a different witness: bystanders and scoffers, the other victims, the soldiers, the beloved disciple, the women, Joseph of Arimathea and Nicodemus.

Discussions will include historical contexts, different biblical texts, and social backgrounds and contexts for each of the people at the cross.

The author of the study, Amy-Jill Levine, is an eminent Jewish Biblical scholar, a professor of New Testament and Jewish Studies at Hartford Seminary and professor of Jewish Studies Emerita and Professor of New Testament Studies Emerita at Vanderbilt University. She is considered one the best teachers and scholars alive.

Council Highlights January 2023

The devotion recalled the sermon hymn from Sunday, January 1, the energetic and hopeful *Canticle of Turning*. In it, Mary asks "Could the world be about to turn?" She had many reasons to fear, but she also faced the future with the promise that God would always be with her. As we ponder the future at Messiah and the possibility that we will soon call a second pastor, we too face many unknowns, and some risks along with the excitement; and we too have God's promise to always be with us as our world is about to turn.

The majority of the Council meeting was a discussion of the compensation package for our prospective pastor.

A policy recommended by the Support Committee for guidelines for disposing of outdated or unneeded church property was approved.

A request was made to have a full review of our AV equipment and a timeline/cost analysis for equipment repair and replacement. Our broadcasts are a significant part of our mission and it was felt that we need a careful overview of the future needs in order to maintain the quality and reach of this medium.

Three groups meet in the morning, and two in the evening.


The days they meet are Tuesday pm; Wednesday, both am and pm groups; and Thursday am.

If you would like to be involved, you are welcome to join a group.





All Volunteers must undergo an application process and criminal record check that is provided by Camrose and District Support Services



It's a QR code.


What is it used for?

Call for Continuing Prayer for George and Susan Watts



After 7 years of serving in Burundi and Rwanda, the Watts family has moved to Kijabe, Kenya. They are now house-parents at Rift Valley Academy (RVA), which is a school for children of missionaries who serve all over Africa. They are "parents" to a house (dorm) for Grade 8 girls. Besides helping to make the children feel at home, they have devotions and social events for the girls. They also teach some classes in the high school and lead chapel services for the whole school. This school is more than 100 years old to provide education for children of missionaries who work in areas of Africa where there is no opportunity for education.

Their two youngest children, Micah and Alma attend school there. The two older children have graduated from RVA. Jonah is in his third year of computer science at Trinity Western University in Langley, B.C. Matea is in her first year at a Bible school in France. (This past Christmas was the first time that the parents had two children away from home.)

The Watts family continues to serve under "Serge", as they did in Burundi and Rwanda, so their support remains the same. They have been in Kijabe since August, 2022.

News from Ryan and Shiv Cole in Papua New Guinea.

(Ryan is a pilot with Mission Aviation Fellowship. He is an Albertan.)

"Occasionally MAF PNG sends our planes to the MAF Maintenance facility in Mareeba, Queensland, Australia. This maintenance facility mainly supports other MAF programs in the Asia Pacific region, but sometimes they help PNG too. Flying internationally is not standard for the MAF PNG program. Some of the MAF programs in Africa do that for their passengers, but not us. PNG only does this for maintenance, so it's referred to as a "Ferry Flight". Ryan will be ferrying P2-MAF, the first Caravan which came to



PNG, down for 3 weeks of maintenance and then he'll return to Australia to pick it up again.

"Please pray for good weather for Ryan when he does the Ferry Flights! He'll travel Mt Hagen-Horn Island-Cairns-Mareeba this Tuesday 24 Jan. He'll bring P2-MAF back Mareeba-Horn Island-Mt Hagen on Wed 15 Feb and Shiv will travel as a passenger with him, just for the experience! It's Cyclone Season in this area so please pray for clear skies & tail winds. He'll be taking off around 7am PNG/Sydney time each day which is 9pm UK time or 2pm Alberta time the day before!"

Ryan and Shiv Cole visited Messiah in June of 2022 and reported on their ministry of ferrying pastors, the sick, and school children, in Jesus' Name, within Papua New Guinea.

News in regard to Rev. Brian Rude



Rev. Brian Rude served for many decades as a missionary of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Canada, and subsequently under the direct support of the Alberta Synod. He "retired" in 2021 but continues to live in El Salvador where, as he puts it, "There is no change for me in my ministry in El Salvador. I continue to minister in a land where the needs of the population for the Gospel of Jesus is as great or greater than ever. Thank you for your continuing prayers."

Treasurer's Report

I am happy to report that December offerings were much higher than November, while expenditures were less, leading to a net income for the month of \$18,139. The year to date net income to December 31 is \$21,894. This is a major change from the end of November.

Part of the difference was the special Christmas offering of \$10,117 (last year \$11,857), and another factor was a significant increase in envelope giving in December. Offerings vary by month, and looking back it appears December is usually a high month, with a likely drop in January.

I can't foresee what will happen for the remaining months of our year, but for now the numbers are much more encouraging than they have been.


