Minister's Message



Hello beloved people of God at Messiah!

One of my favourite Easter stories is the one Luke tells of the pair (likely a married couple) who are walking along the road

from Jerusalem to Emmaus. They are forlorn over Jesus' death, and upset at the news that the tomb was found empty a few hours earlier. As they are travelling, they are met by a stranger on the road — and we know that the stranger is Jesus — but of course, they don't recognize him. Instead he meets them in their dashed hopes and walks with them. As they reach their destination, they invite this stranger in to share a meal, and it's around the table breaking bread that they see that it's Jesus who has been with them all along.

I love that Jesus is with them even when they don't know it's him!

I love how Jesus meets them at the moment when their hopes are most dashed.

I love how Jesus joins them on the journey, and it's a journey done in community, even if it's only a community of two!

I feel privileged to join you at Messiah on the journey and to be back home in the Camrose area.



A little about me...

I was born in Swift Current, Saskatchewan and baptized at St. Olaf Lutheran. We moved to Alberta when I was little, and I spent my childhood in several different communities... Wetaskiwin, Red Deer and Calgary before we settled for my high school years in St. Albert. As a young child, I can remember giving sermons to my grandmother as she sat on her living room couch. I don't know the quality of those sermons but the sense of call to pastoral ministry goes way back for me!

I went straight from high school to an undergrad in History at U of A in Edmonton, and then from there to Lutheran Theological Seminary in Saskatoon. My internship year was spent at Good Shepherd in Selkirk, Manitoba — an adventure moving to a new province and Synod. I had the joy of learning under Pastor David Saude — though he took a new call ten months into my internship — leaving me with with a couple of months to bear the weight of ministry solo.

I was ordained in July 2008 and was called to serve the Edberg and New Norway Parish. When Bishop Ron Mayan suggested this parish as a possibility, I had to find it on a map — but we fell in love with the beauty of the Battle River valley, the lush fields, and the wonderful welcome we received.

There were several Seminary grads who took calls in the Camrose area that year, and so it was a great place to learn and

grow as a new pastor. In 2011, we began a collaborative partnership where I also served the Bashaw Parish, and it's one of my joys of ministry that this partnership continues more than a decade later and now includes you at Messiah!

In 2014, we moved to Medicine Hat to serve Unity. In eight years, we came to love the milder winters (though it was much harder to cross country ski) and the hot summers, learning to give thanks for air conditioning. Another of my joys of ministry was in 2019 when Unity sold its church building to downsize our expenses, trading facilities with an Evangelical Free Church congregation. This was an incredible time of discernment, stepping out in faith and working together to make the move happen. If you drop into my office, I will proudly show you the pictures as we gathered one week for worship in one place, and the very next Sunday in the new.

Deanna and I are coming up to our 19th wedding anniversary, and she has homeschooled our boys and taught piano for the last few years. Our three sons are Jacob (14), Daniel (12) and Samuel (9). They all have different hairstyles — which reflect their individual personalities pretty well!

We are looking forward to get to know you, and for you to get to know us, too.

Thank you for your warm welcome over the last couple of weeks, and a special thank you to all those who dropped off food as we were moving into our new home.

As we begin this journey of ministry together, I look forward to the surprises of recognizing Jesus in our midst, and travelling the road with you all.

Dear Beloved of God –

Sometimes the demand to see is more than doubt. Sometimes it is love.

In my childhood Sunday school classes, the disciple Thomas was always

portrayed as “the bad guy.” When the other disciples told him that Jesus was alive after his crucifixion and burial, Thomas refused to believe it and demanded to see Christ for himself. The moral of the story was clear for us children – Don’t be like Thomas! Don’t question! Believe! Don’t doubt!

When I take a closer look at the biblical story, I see Thomas as a very practical, concrete kind of guy. We also learn about Thomas from two other accounts in the gospel according to John. Earlier, he insists that the disciples accompany Jesus when he goes to Bethany, a place he’d had to leave under threat of being stoned, “Let us also go that we may die with him.” This is Thomas.

And then, in the midst of Jesus’ long farewell discourse to the disciples on the night of his betrayal and arrest, Thomas speaks up again, cutting right through Jesus’ words. “In my Father’s house there are many dwelling places,” Jesus says, “... And you know the way to the place where I am going.” To which Thomas replies, “Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?” This is Thomas.

Thomas is plainspoken and gutsy, honest and direct. He wants to understand what’s going on and be able to face the situation at hand.

He isn’t there with the other disciples on

Easter evening. Mary Magdalene told the group she had seen Jesus. They were huddled together in fear in the upper room, behind locked doors – but not Thomas.

So where is he that first Easter evening? Maybe Thomas can’t imagine being locked in a room and he is out trying to discover the truth. Or maybe he just wanted to be alone in his grief. Perhaps he was just trying to move on and get back to work. Or maybe he was the only disciple with enough sense to realize that being in that room could take a long time and they would need some wine, cheese, and bread.

When the disciples tell Thomas that they have seen Jesus, he responds, “Unless I see the mark of the nails – in fact, until I touch those marks and put my hand in the wound in his side, I’m not going to believe.”

Thomas is practical, concrete, realistic. He simply has to see for himself.

And when Jesus appears again to his disciples a full week later – not the next day or two – but one week later, Thomas is there. And Jesus, far from rebuking Thomas, offers to meet his request. “Put your fingers in my hands, touch my side.” And Thomas responds, “My Lord and my God.” What a statement of faith!

In fact, Thomas’ response, “My Lord and my God!” is the high point of John’s gospel. When Thomas gets it, he gets it.

There is something vulnerable and beautiful about this story. We see what Thomas needs – and perhaps our own needs – and even more, we see what Jesus is willing to give. We see that Jesus meets Thomas’ need by giving of himself. Jesus comes to

him, speaks a word of peace, invites him to see and touch, invites him to believe.

And Jesus comes to us in the water and the word of baptism, through the scriptures, in the simple meal of bread and wine, and through one another until we too believe, until we also profess our faith: "My Lord and my God."

Several years ago, my paternal grandmother was rushed from the hospital in Grande Prairie to one in Edmonton. We

were living in Lethbridge at the time – five hours away. My life was busy, but no phone call could reassure me. You see, I had to see her with my own eyes and touch her with my own hands.

Sometimes the demand to see is more than doubt. Sometimes it is love.

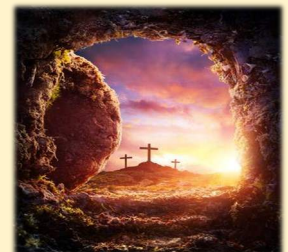

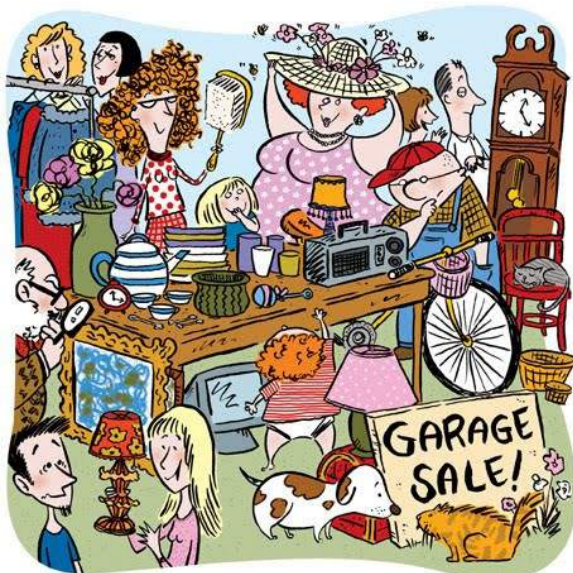

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

Over the past weeks, Council has been busy with plans for receiving Pastor Jeff and helping Pastor Bev move into her new role involving multiple congregations. This was Pastor Jeff's first Council meeting and we enjoyed getting to know him and answering his questions as they arose. There is a lot for him to take in! We are planning for a series of get-to-know-you coffee parties. There will be an opportunity for you to sign up to host a gathering and/or to indicate that you would like to be invited one.

The Nominating Group is still looking for a Treasurer; otherwise, all Council positions have been filled. However, spots remain on some committees including Service. This is a dynamic bunch with lots of ideas, but they need more people. In our discussion, it became clear that nominations / recruitment to committees needs to be a year-round activity. If you are curious about whether you might enjoy serving in some capacity, know that you would be more than welcome at any time to attend a meeting. Try it out. You don't need to wait to be asked, but if you are, say Yes. Get your toe wet. You may find the water wonderful.

Council approved an initiative from the Service Committee called the Community Fresh Vegetable Initiative. It is a simple way to help supply fresh, local produce for the Food Bank which reports a shortage in that area. Stay tuned for how you can participate.

GARAGE Sale - Watch for it! The indomitable Mary B. is at it again. Proceeds from this year's sale will be divided between the Messiah Refugee Fund and the Ukrainian Refugee Fund.

Did you know that 2026 will be Messiah's 125 anniversary? Council received an enthusiastic vision and report for how to renew, re-energize, increase membership and financial support, and serve our community all under the banner

"Messiah-Renewal 125."

Treasurer's Report

December was an above average month for income, and then there were deficits of \$4,846 in January and \$2,408 in February. But it is encouraging to see that for the first ten months of our fiscal year there is still a surplus of \$14,640. This is much improved from last year, when we had a deficit of \$21,000 for the same ten months. The biggest reason for this is that we only had one pastor during this time.

At our last annual meeting we agreed that God was calling us to move ahead in an arrangement to share pastoral staff with the congregations at New Norway and Bashaw, and in the process to add a half time position to our pastoral staff. It has taken several months, but last month we were happy to welcome Pastor Jeff to serve full time with us. We wish God's blessings to Pastor Bev as she transitions to spending half of her time with the other congregations, at the same time as she continues half time at Messiah.

This understanding of where God is leading us comes with financial implications for both our congregational and personal planning. Church council is considering how we will cover the added costs. There was one special meeting in March to begin the process of drafting a budget for next year, and another meeting is planned for April. We are be challenged to increase our income, or find ways to reduce expenses, or move into next year with a deficit budget. Because we may carry forward a bit of a surplus the latter would be possible for one year, but we need to be prepared to balance the budget in future years.

It is encouraging to see the level of engagement in our congregation. You may have ideas of how we could increase income or reduce costs, and if you do please discuss them with me or any member of council. We would be happy to hear from you. And if you don't have anything specific to suggest, please pray that council may have wisdom in planning for God's work at Messiah.
