# **Pastor's Ponderings**



One of my favourite hymns from our new hymnal supplement, *All Creation Sings*, is *May This Church Be Like a Tree* (#1042). I hope to introduce it to you in the coming months. It's a text from an Argentinian pastor, Pablo Sosa, and he imagines the church planted beside God's river of life. The third verse asks

God to shape us into a church that offers its shade, fruit and wood for the sake of others:

"May this church be like a tree, O God, that thrives where you have planted, may it stand to show the way, your way of loving and self-giving, offering shade, and fruit for sharing, giving up its wood for burning.

May this living church that names you be a tree of life eternal"

The hymn prays that we would become a thriving church by living into Jesus' self-giving love.

During the call process when I met with Messiah's staff, and I asked around the table what they loved about this place, one of the answers was: "we are an inner city church," to which I said in surprise, "Camrose has an inner city?"

Over these last couple of months, on my walks to the church office in the mornings, I have often come across people sleeping on a park bench, or in the underpass tunnel, or right outside the Link doors in the alley behind the church.

Messiah was approached by Camrose Family and Community Support Services (CDFCSS) as a possible location for a **Warming Hub**. It was noted that we are planted right in the center of where people are, and conveniently across the alley from CDFCSS, where multiple community support services can be accessed.

A Warming Hub is different from a homeless shelter. It is not a permanent shelter space with beds that would be open 24/7. Instead, the hub would only operate on nights when the temperature goes below -20 C. It would be open limited hours from 10 PM until 7 AM. No beds or mats would be set up, but space would be available

with places to sit and with coffee to drink so that no one would have to be outside on the coldest winter nights. In the morning clients would be given a coffee gift card and transportation tokens, so that they are not sent out with nothing back into the cold.

Our Church Council, along with the Service and Support Committees, have worked hard to identify a space that would meet the needs of this Warming Hub. We have determined together that the Fellowship Centre makes the most sense, with its easy access to the alley, as well as with bathrooms and a kitchen.



We recognize that there are security considerations in our large building. However, with relatively minor modifications — alarms added to the interior Fellowship Centre doors — we can prevent access to the rest of the church. These alterations would be paid for by the community partnership that would sponsor this project.

It's this aspect that's important. This isn't Messiah's project — instead we are working collaboratively with community partners. The Warming Hub would be staffed by an organization that has operated hubs in other cities, and understands the complex needs of those who are living unsheltered. These staff members would be supplemented by Camrose volunteers, organized by CDFCSS. The staff would be responsible to ensure that there are no wanderers through our building and trained to know when the police and paramedics are required.

This is a huge experiment! We are stepping into the unknown. We don't know how many people will use the Hub. We don't know how many days this winter will be below -20, and so how much it will

be needed. We can't predict all the consequences of opening our building to this project. But we do know that God has planted us right in the middle of Camrose, and that we have had people sleeping right outside our doors. And so, we will offer our space as a place of shelter and warmth through this winter, and we will see what happens, and evaluate this experiment in the Spring.

Church Council approved offering our space to this community experiment at our November meeting. Our hope would be to have the Warming Hub open within the next few weeks, depending upon the timeline of our community partners.

Lyndel Kasa, Executive Director of CDFCSS will be present during Coffee Fellowship after worship on **Sunday, December 3rd**, so that you can ask questions and hear about this project directly from her.

# **Pastor's Ponderings**

We are beginning the Advent season. This is a season of waiting and of opening. It is always a good idea to be open to more than the external things that are a part of this season. These things can be quite empty if our soul is longing for something deeper

and often we **are** longing for something much deeper.

There can be so much that distracts us from the real "soul stuff" that this season is about. We can get caught up in the physical stuff of the shopping, baking, hanging lights and the preparations of this season and forget to prepare our souls for the coming of the Lord into our lives in a fresh new way. Without the latter the external stuff becomes empty.

I love Advent because it is a time of waiting in openness for our God to enter our lives afresh though the Spirit; to be born anew into our lives. I think of Advent as a time where there is invitation for stillness, for reflection and for the Spirit to breathe into us the very life of God in a fresh new way. And I think that need is different every year and different for each of us.

# My Soul Waits for You ... My God

And so I wonder this time of year...

- -Where in your soul is there a need for God's healing and renewing love to be with us?
- -Where are you feeling empty and in need of renewal?
- -In what ways are you weary or lonely or discouraged?
- -Are you lonely or afraid?
- -Where are you joyful and want God to join you in that joy?

So I wonder, how is it that we do this intentionally as people of God? I think there are many ways to be open in this season to new life.

I think one of the first and most important things we can do is take some time for worship and for quiet reflection. Some places are joining in an Advent devotional time and reflection time. Others find this in worship. Others like to have a more private daily reflection time with God that is more focussed. I think the key thing here is that we wait with openness and intentionally making space for the presence of the Divine to enter our souls anew.

So what is it that you need this year? This season?

Another important thing we need to do is be open and aware of places we can "give and share" God's love with many who are lonely and in need. It is so deeply important this time of year to pay attention to these needs among us. This can be one of the loneliest seasons for those who are alone and for those who struggle and are in need. It can also be a really depressing time for many. Is there someone you can think of that might need the gentle love of God through you? And we can always pray...and ask for guidance as we open in this season.

Jesus came into this world not dressed to the nines. He came as a poor lowly child and the only place open to him was a bed of hay in a manger. He cares deeply for those who are depleted, grieving, weary and struggling as well as those who are celebrating.

We enter this season in expectation. As we wait in hope, in peace, in joy and in love for the presence of God to come anew into our hearts and souls and lives... let us be intentional about being open to the deeper parts of ourselves, where God wants to be present with us and with our neighbors.

Psalm 42:1 is a good verse and song for our Advent journey and perhaps could be our prayer:

"As the deer longs for streams of water, so I long for you O God."

# Synod of Alberta and the Territories

Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada



Dear Beloved of God -

We are taught by the morning newspaper headlines and by the evening news broadcasts to know names like: Donald Trump, Kim Jong-Un, Vladimir Putin, Emperor Augustus, Quirinius - governor of Syria. World leaders. Politicians, some of whom use

power, who keep records - who announce that the world should be registered - and the entire world moves at their command - even the poor and the pregnant!

Rome reaches out its long arms to the little towns of Nazareth and Bethlehem and tightens its grip on its subjects through taxation and military might and population control – the empire-building business!

But the name Augustus meant more than just an inconvenient government decree for an imperial document carved forever in marble heralded the birth-day of Augustus as the birthday of a god! Set in stone, this declaration announced the birth of Augustus as good news to the world! As emperor he was called *soter*, which means, "savior." He was: "god on earth in human form, protector of the state, cause of peace and of blessing in the inhabited world!" His laws were presented in official propaganda as, "good tidings of great joy."

The official party-line proclaimed that if you want to see deity at work look to the Emperor, savior, god, the rising star, the bringer of peace, the one who brings "good tidings of great joy!" And yet, what the record tells is of organized violence, militarism and exploitation of the poor. Of an emperor - a savior - who killed three of his sons and one of his wives, and a number of close advisors because he feared their disloyalty.

This is how the Christmas gospel begins - with a word of power - a decree - with powerful, important people in the powerhouse cities of Rome and Jerusalem. But the gospel writer doesn't stop there instead the writer tells of a bunch of politically powerful nobodies - like Joseph and Mary from the backward town of Nazareth - in a stable, in a dot-on-the-map-town called Bethlehem, surrounded by a group of scraggy low-life shepherds who lived in the fields and who, likely as not, smelled to high heaven!

The gospel writer invites us to listen carefully and to look closely as the stone-cut declaration about Emperor Augustus is countered with another word this one delivered by heavenly messenger rather than Roman decree.

This gospel writer, you see, is busy re-arranging and contrasting our ideas about power, about history, about good news of great joy - in this child lying in a manger - heard against the backdrop of empire builders, power brokers and census takers.

To people suffering under unbelievable oppression, under the thumb of imperial Rome - Luke proclaims that they will hear and see truly good news not in imperial decrees, but in a manger in this "good news of great joy for all the people" - in a birth announcement which calls forth worship and adoration, amazement and awe, wide-eyed wonder and running feet - and hope.

If we are not stunned by this declaration, perhaps it is because we fail to see what God is up to for when God chooses to challenge the empire and the idolatry of imperial power God comes as a helpless infant; when God chooses to bring hope God comes not as a declaration cut into marble but as a babe wrapped in strips of cloth; and when God chooses to embrace us and all of humanity with the gift of love God comes not as a decree but in flesh.

This gospel writer invites us to ask the very real questions. The very real questions during the candle lighting and the gathering with family and friends, with strangers and friends; in the midst of our very real grief, and our very real concerns for our family and friends and for this world: who saves and who gives peace? And who claims our ultimate loyalty? And who is it that brings good news of great joy?

Come to Bethlehem and see
Him whose birth the angels sing
Come, adore on bended knee
Christ the Lord, the newborn king.

The God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you many abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit (Romans 15:13).

I have been leading a study on the Psalms in the country parishes. What a powerful, practical and wonderful book in the Bible! We have been discovering just how much! The Psalms teach us so much about our God and also give us words to use in our lives.

We will begin this study by ZOOM on **Tuesday** evening, **January 16** from **6:30 - 7:45 pm for 6** weeks except on Feb 6 when I am away at the Pastor's Study Conference.

**Note:** If you cannot make every evening for different reasons, this study is easy to catch up on. The study will begin with an evening of introduction to the Psalms.

- The arrangement of the Psalter

How the psalms teach us how to give thanks and Praise.

The cost of the loss of praise.

The Rhythm of our Lives - Orientation, Dis-orientation, re-orientation.

# Hymns of Praise: Enthronement, Royal and Zion Psalms:

We get in touch with God who reigns and as we do we reminded of who our God is.

# Penitential and Wisdom Psalms:

Psalms of confession and righteousness - God's holy expectations and our response to our loving, forgiving God.

# **Psalms of Lament:**

The Heart Cries to God in the "real" of our lives and God's presence in these moments.

# Closing: Bringing it all together:

The practical use of the Psalms in our Lives as people of God living together.



# TREASURER'S REPORT

October was an amazing month, with a surplus of \$12,480. With the special gift mentioned last month and with the Thanksgiving offering I had dared hope there might be a slight surplus at the end of October. The Thanksgiving offering was \$13,571, more than \$5,000 over the budgeted amount. The year to date surplus after six months is \$8,195. Thank you to the faithful members and friends who made this possible. Praise the Lord!

The replacement of all smoke detectors has now been completed at a cost of about \$11,000. This was required by fire regulations. We were fortunate to be able to pay this from funds in a reserve for major capital projects, so it did not impact the operating budget for the year.

We can expect much higher utility bills as we move into winter, but we trust generous offerings will continue to cover the increased costs.
