Pastor's Ponderings



I told you last month about one of my favourite hymns from our new hymnal supplement, *All Creation Sings: May This Church Be Like a Tree* (#1042):

*"May this church be like a tree, O God,
that thrives where you have planted..."*

...and I wrote about the warming hub community experiment as way for Messiah to embrace it's identity as an inner city church and thrive literally where God has planted us at the centre of Camrose.

So now I want to reflect in these Messenger articles over the coming months about what it means for Messiah to thrive in different ways, as we grow into our values and identity.

The pandemic forced churches to embrace technology to connect with and bring worship to their congregational members and as a witness to the community. Before that fateful March, I had never live-streamed a worship service, or even posted a video to YouTube or Facebook. At Messiah though, broadcasting worship was old hat, a decades old practice. You embraced TV ministry a long time ago as way living out the mission of *Sharing Jesus Christ with All People*.

I remember when I was pastor at New Norway and visiting our members who had retired to Camrose, who were either shut-in or they couldn't always drive out to worship, especially in the winter. They would tell me how much they appreciated the worship broadcasts from Messiah. It turns out that we were partners in ministry even then! And Pastor Bev continues to tell us similar stories as we have formalized that collaboration.

When the pandemic hit, as other churches were trying to figure out how to best record sound from their smart phones or unpacking their newly purchased live streaming cameras — you were already broadcasting on YouTube. It wasn't a shift for you.

We learned a new phrase — "hybrid church" — to describe this experience of being able to worship in -person and online.

But Messiah has been a hybrid church long before that phrase was conjured up. (By the way, I'm not sure I like the word "hybrid" — it makes me think of tomato varieties or orchids!).

I see this in the ease at which you worship from home one week, from your travels to Toronto or France the next week, and then in-person in our church building a couple of weeks later. I hear how you re-listen to sermons on the road or through the week.

See you are hybrid people! — doesn't that sound weird?!

I have heard stories from people who appreciate my sermons that I have never met. It's humbling for me.

We have been working in Worship Committee on a proposal for online communion which will go before council this month. You have embraced sharing the word through technology for a long time, and now we are asking if the sacrament of Holy Communion can also be shared this way, too? Can those of you hearing the Word at home also share in the presence of Jesus Christ in communion when you join us for online worship?

Pastor Bev and I often make the invitation at worship for those of you that join regularly through our broadcasts be in touch with us or the office. And we love your messages. We want to hear from you. Is it possible to be an active member of Messiah even if you live in another city? Province? Country? Continent? I think that the answer is yes!

So if you are regularly participating in our online worship send me an email or text — let us know you appreciate our ministry together. How can we support you for pastoral care? How can we bring you into our ministry more fully as an active participant? How can we connect you into our community?

It seems to me that experimenting with answering these questions might just lead to a thriving church.

Dear Beloved of God –

May grace and peace be yours in abundance (1 Peter 1:2a).

Why not begin the new year with something NEW! Begin 2024 with a “Blessing of Your Home,” or your church, as the season of Epiphany begins.

The gospel of Matthew records that when the magi saw the shining star stop overhead, they were filled with joy. “On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother” (Matthew 2:10-11). In the home, Christ is met in family and friends, in visitors and strangers. In the home, faith is shared, nurtured, and put into action. In the home, Christ is welcome.

Twelfth Night (January 5th) or another day during the season of Epiphany offers an occasion for gathering with friends and family members for a blessing of the home, perhaps using the following four-fold model. Someone may lead the greeting and blessing, while another person may read the scripture passage. Following an eastern European tradition, a visual blessing may be inscribed with white chalk above the main door; for example 20 + CMB + 24. The numbers change with each new year. The three letters stand for either the ancient Latin blessing, *Christe mansionem benedica*, which means, “Christ, bless this house,” or the legendary names of the magi (Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar).

Greeting – May peace be to this house and to all who enter here. By wisdom a house is built and through understanding it is established; through knowledge its rooms are filled with rare and beautiful treasures. (see Proverbs 24:3-4)

Reading – As we prepare to ask God’s blessing on this household, let us listen to the words of scripture. Read John 1:1-4, 14, 16.

Inscription – Write the inscription above the entrance to your home: 20 + CMB + 24 as the following is spoken:

The magi of old, known as

C Caspar

M Melchior, and

B Balthasar

Followed the star of God’s Son who came to dwell among us

20 two thousand

24 and twenty-four years ago.

+ Christ, bless this house,

+ and remain with us through the new year.

Prayer of Blessing – O God, you revealed your Son to all people by the shining light of a star. We pray that you bless this home and all who live here with your gracious presence. May your love be our inspiration, your wisdom our guide, your truth our light and your peace our benediction; through Christ our Lord. Amen

Then everyone may walk from room to room, blessing the house with incense or by sprinkling with water, perhaps using a branch from the Christmas tree.

Blessing upon your homes this new year!

The God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit (Romans 15:13).

A PSALMS STUDY ONLINE

Hello all!

I have been leading a study on the Psalms in the country parishes. What a powerful, practical and wonderful book in the Bible! We have been discovering just how much! The Psalms teach us so much about our God and also give us words to use in our lives.

We will begin this study by ZOOM on **Tuesday** evening, **January 16** from **6:30 - 7:45 pm for 6 weeks except on Feb 6** when I am away at the Pastor's Study Conference.

Note: If you cannot make every evening for different reasons, this study is easy to catch up on. **The study will begin with an evening of introduction to the Psalms.**

Basic Outline for our Study:

A basic introduction:

- Psalms as accessible and real – “a little Bible” according to Luther
- Psalms as prose, poetry and metaphor
- Psalms as real and honest, connecting us to our hearts and souls
- Psalms written in prose, poetry, Metaphor and imagery
- Authors of the Psalms
- Where we use the Psalms in our daily lives and in worship
- The arrangement of the Psalter

Psalms of Thanks and Praise:

How the psalms teach us how to give thanks and Praise.

The cost of the loss of praise.

The Rhythm of our Lives - Orientation, Dis-orientation, re-orientation.

Hymns of Praise: Enthronement, Royal and Zion Psalms:

We get in touch with God who reigns and as we do we reminded of who our God is.

Penitential and Wisdom Psalms:

Psalms of confession and righteousness - God's holy expectations and our response to our loving, forgiving God.

Psalms of Lament:

The Heart Cries to God in the “real” of our lives and God's presence in these moments.

Closing: Bringing it all together:

The practical use of the Psalms in our Lives as people of God living together.

We will send you out a link for the first study on January 15th.

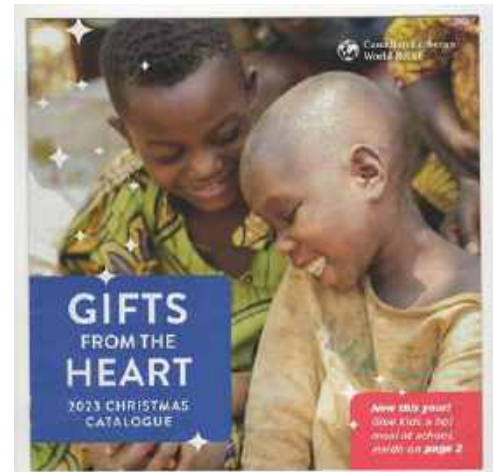

TREASURER'S REPORT

Last month we were happy to report that the October financial statements showed a surplus for the month of \$12,480. The special Thanksgiving offerings were generous, and regular offerings were higher than average. This left us with a surplus of \$8,915 for the first six months of our year.

November was a different story, with a deficit of \$10,719. We have noted before that there is a significant variation from month to month, so we shouldn't be surprised.

There was no special offering like Thanksgiving in November, and regular offerings which had been higher than average in October were lower in November.

Even so, general offerings year to date are up \$16,102 from last year, but staffing costs are also up more than that with the addition of our second pastor.

As a result, at the end of November we have a deficit of \$2,524, which is still under budget.

With special Christmas offerings I dare expect there will be more positive news in December.

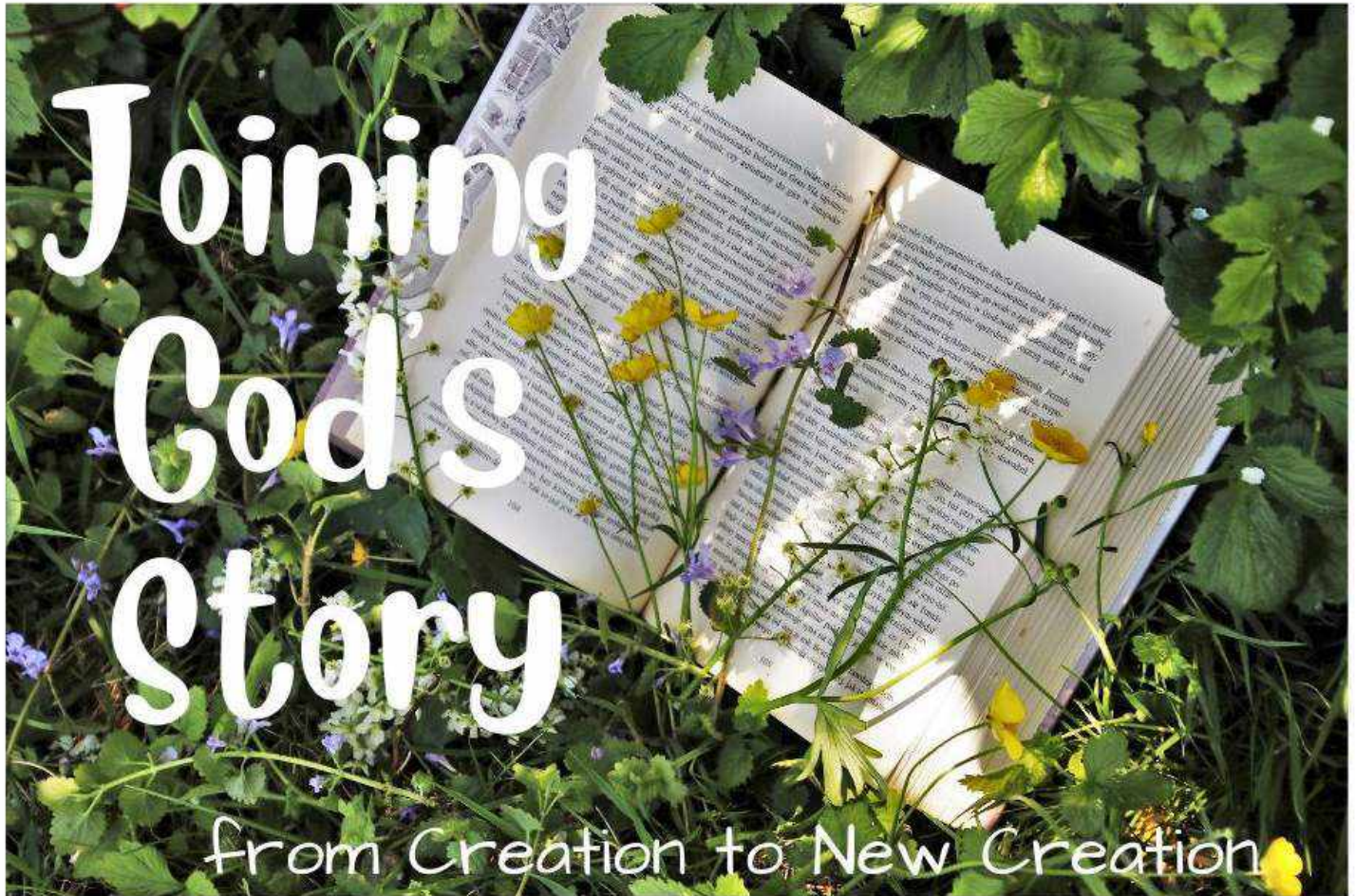
Camrose Women's Shelter Society

Items can be placed in the white wooden box at the back of the sanctuary labelled Women's Shelter.

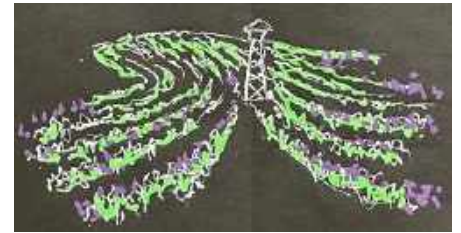
