

Pastor's Ponderings



One of the things I love about being a pastor is the variety that comes with the job. I think of some of my evenings over the last month — listening attentively at the council meeting wearing my administrative and visioning hat; the next trying to teach a group of energized and loud young people about the Second Article of the counters and counters and staff men pastors, too. Our readings stories of the people into I Thessalonian all of you and constantly response to the steadfastness and staff men pastors, too.

Apostles' Creed (that's the one about Jesus!); the next preaching at an Ecumenical Lenten service where we shared a love feast meal of Moravian Sweet Bread and chocolate milk. This diversity is what makes being called to this vocation such an honour. Each week I get the joy of eating with our friends at Martha's Table, the thoughtfulness of pondering policies like the Code of Conduct for staff members, and the privilege of listening to your grief over aging or changes in life or the death or illness of a beloved one.

As we turn from Lent to Easter, it reminds me that it's already been a year that I have been with you. I think about how overwhelmed I was in those first weeks trying to remember all of your names, and how much I have practiced and forgotten and learned them again. I am privileged to have learned not just your names, but also to share in some of the stories of your lives. I have reminded myself that I told you early on that I was on the long-term plan with you, which gave me permission to not do it all in the first weeks, or months, or even the first year. What a relief!

As I ponder the variety in my role as pastor, I also ponder the variety of ways that you serve and give at Messiah. Shortly after arriving, I also learned that there was so much happening that I couldn't possibly be involved in everything. I see the faithfulness of those who show up to committee meetings each month, or who do odd-jobs around the church building, or give their time at Martha's Table or ensure that coffee is put on for fellowship times. But there's also so much that happens out of sight — there are schedules and rotations for jobs that I never see — but I am still so grateful for what you do.

One of the things I love about being a pastor is the variety counters and letter stuffers and sound technicians and staff members and food preparers — and think of some of my evenings pastors, too.

Our readings in the Easter season will shift to the stories of the church, as the Risen Jesus calls God's people into life together. Paul writes to the Thessalonians: "We always give thanks to God for all of you and mention you in our prayers, constantly remembering before our God and Father your work of faith and labour of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Thessalonians 1:3). We usually think of faith, hope and love as the big three, but here Paul mixes it up a little and says it's faith, love and *hope*.

I see these gifts in our life together — and I give thanks to God for you — your faith in showing up and serving, your labour of love and care for others in our church and community, and that in spite of change and uncertainty, what I have noticed most of all is a sense of hopefulness at Messiah at what Christ is doing among us.

I am so grateful for your support and care given to me and my whole family in welcoming us into your lives.

I am grateful for your willingness to try some new things over this last year — the Narrative Lectionary and the community partnership around the warming hub, come to mind.

I am grateful for your flexibility as we grow into our collaborative relationship with New Norway and Bashaw.

I am grateful for the sense of joy in renewal at how God is leading us into the future.

I am grateful for your forgiveness where I have messed up.

And I am grateful for your continued prayers as we grow in faith together.

I pray that you would continue to be strengthened in faith, love and *hope*: your work of faith, labour of love and steadfastness of hope in our Risen Lord Jesus, who is indeed making all things new.

Pastor's Ponderings

We are a Resurrection People!



We are heading into the last week before Easter. By the time you read this we will be celebrating Easter. But truly... Easter is everyday for us... is it not?

Even as we travel through lent, we already know the end of the story. We know that Christ is risen indeed!

We live in the full forgiveness offered by the cross and the power of the resurrected hope every day. The church seasons are really times of reflection and remembering and they help us touch different parts of our souls... and so we change the color of the banners in the church, we celebrate different seasons and important days in the church year, while all of this is wrapped in the constant gift of a life of forgiveness and resurrection.

So what does it mean to be a resurrection people? How do we live and lean into this power? What a good thing for us to ponder in this season of the church.

"We do not live as people without hope", the scriptures tell us.

I think there are so many things tied up in the resurrection that it would be hard to name them all in this brief writing. But perhaps I might ask you to ponder this personally; what does it mean for YOU to be a "resurrection person"? What is it about your faith and your life in the Lord that is solid and true and brings you living water and new life every day? Take some time to meditate on this question a bit.

I think one of the most powerful resurrection verses is found in Isaiah 43: 19. I absolutely love this verse. And it is my resurrection verse to reflect on personally this year. (much of the year actually but I am being intentional about it this season of Easter)

"Behold, I am doing a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert" (esv)

What powerful words of life and of hope!!

You see... we don't always FEEL like there is hope. I sure don't. This world is not looking very hopeful at the moment. At times we are dealing with things that feel more like death and darkness than light and life. Life is so full of every kind of experience and feeling. I find hope in remembering that in the midst of it all, our God is springing up new life and loves to make ways for us in the desert; paths of love and light that we cannot even imagine. We truly are a "resurrection people!"

The thing we need to remember is that our God is always doing a new thing in us every moment. God is bringing life and healing and God is making ways for us when we are in the deserts of life and rivers of living water to quench our thirst.

I am not sure what you are living with in your life at the moment. (I only know what some of you are dealing with.) I know it is not always easy at all... and yet sometimes it really is so beautiful. Life is such a mix. Isn't it?

No matter what, our God is a "Resurrection God" always there making ways for us and springing up new life in the midst of struggle and in the midst of all our moments.

Indeed... " I am doing a new thing... it springs forth!"

Let's ponder this truth together this season.

Please join me in this reflection.

I also want to invite you to let me know if you would like a visit or just want to ponder these or any other things of your life and soul with me, give me a shout. I would love to hear from you and sit down with you and ponder and pray together.

Dear Beloved of God -



May grace and peace be yours in abundance (I Peter 1:2a).

When I was a child my favorite playground was the cemetery. Our farmyard was right across the road from the graveyard and my siblings and I spent hours playing

hide and go seek, making hideouts in the hedge which used to border the cemetery, and walking from grave stone to grave stone reading who had died and when. We did not intend any disrespect. As children we had not yet learned the hard rules of life and death.

Sooner or later, for all of us, this learning happens. Confronted with the dark realities of death, cemeteries seem more like prisons than playgrounds, holding our hopes captive; locking away our dreams, slamming shut the door on the future. Visits to the graveyard are accompanied by cries of anguish rather than shouts of delight and joy.

Ask Mary Magdalene. After surviving the unthinkable horror of that Friday, on the first day of the week in the early morning darkness, she was dealt the crowning blow, one more profound event in the long string of atrocities. The stone was rolled away; the tomb empty; the body gone.

Only a short time ago Mary and the other disciples had been playing follow-the-leader with Jesus, running through the graveyard, thumbing their noses at death. Remember Lazarus? He had been rotting in the grave for four days, yet walked right out when Jesus called, "Lazarus, come out!"

Back then, Jesus had dared them to imagine a different world, a world where masters wash servants' feet; and the winner is the one who comes in last; a world where the myth of scarcity was proven false by a 5,000-plate banquet served from the contents of a little

boy's lunchbox with more leftovers than the Tupperware could contain; a world where, instead of survival of the fittest, wolves and lambs were sitting side-by-side at the table, and homelessness was unheard of.

Then, they had been like children playing in the cemetery. But now, the graveyard was a stark reminder of captivity, of bondage to the powers of death, defeat, despair – and even more, now the tomb was open and the body gone!

And as she wept in the cemetery, the one she had mistaken for the gardener called her name, "Mary." And lifting her head, peering through watery eyes, she recognizes Jesus – and she moves from weeping to witnessing – she runs as fast as her feet will carry her – and she can barely get the words out – barely catch her breath – as she proclaims, "I have seen the Lord."

Weeping to witnessing. Death to life. Defeat to victory. Despair to hope.

I believe Mary's testimony not because I have seen the risen Christ, but because of her witness. I believe in life and victory and hope – even in a cemetery – on the basis of this witness: of Mary who sees the risen Christ with her own eyes and breathlessly announces, "I have seen the Lord;" of Thomas who believes when the risen Christ offers to let him touch his hands and wounded side; of the unnamed disciple – perhaps John – who enters the tomb and sees and believes.

I believe in resurrection because of the witness of these – and of many others: the witness of my Grade Seven Sunday School teacher who told me of new life forty plus years ago and who modeled the resurrection in her daily life; I believe because of the witness of a Roman Catholic community on the edge of Mexico City, who in worship and ministry celebrate and live the triumph of the resurrection; I believe because I have seen this past year the witness of those who have walked with loved ones

through their dying and death, and who confidently proclaimed the truth of the resurrection in the midst of their own tears and sorrow; and I believe because of your witness to me, when nourished by the Word and sacrament – the bread and wine – Christ's body and blood – you have been moved to incredible acts of love and service to one another and to all the world.

In my living – in the very real anguish of a graveyard – through the hope of resurrection – I know too the shouts of delight and joy heard in a cemetery. And I dare to imagine a

different world – a world set free for love, justice, peace: where masters wash servants' feet; and the winner comes in last; and all are fed; all are at home – and where the cemetery becomes a playground once again.

The God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit (Romans 15:13).

There are three member-at-large vacancies on Council as well as several on the standing committees. How can you help?



TREASURER'S REPORT


Preliminary reports for February show that offerings were the lowest of any month this fiscal year. But we know that it's not possible to make projections based on any single month. So far this year there has been a variation of \$9,605 between the lowest and highest month. March, April and the special Easter offering will determine how the year will end, and I am still hopeful we will end up with a balanced year. Thank you all for your faithful support of Messiah's ministry.

March brought an unplanned new expense, with the failure of the main camera used for our TV ministry. A replacement has been purchased, and because there was a significant saving by buying two, and in anticipation that one of the other cameras may fail soon, a second was ordered as well. The total cost was about \$5,300.

I think that in the past equipment for the TV ministry has been paid for with special designated donations. We are thankful for a special gift for this ministry of \$1,000 received earlier this year, and it will be used to cover part of the cost. Any other special offerings would be welcome. Otherwise it will show up as an unexpected expense in our financial statements.

The end of our fiscal year is in sight, and preliminary discussions about next year's budget are beginning. Please pray that we may know God's will for ongoing ministry in our congregation.
